## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

---

*To the Citizens of the School District of Loudon:*

As the time has come for the annual report of the work done in the schools, your committee would respectfully submit the following:

The schools have continued on about the same lines as in previous years, but with constant effort toward improvement. No school in town the past year has been a failure. All have done good work and paved the way for higher achievement.

The teachers employed have, with two exceptions, had previous experience in teaching in our town, and are well known to be efficient and faithful in their work. Your committee favor the retaining of such teachers as long as we can, even if the cost be somewhat greater.

The attendance upon the part of the scholars has been good, with the exception of the last part of the winter term. At this time sickness was so prevalent as to cause a large decrease of attendance, and in one or two cases the closing of the school. It is of great importance that the parents should see that their children, when possible, attend the school regularly and continuously. The question of attendance should never be left to the caprice of the child.

We have had more weeks of school this year than usual, due in part to the uniting of the Clough Hill and Cate schools, and in part to other causes. This is certainly encouraging. With longer schools we may reasonably expect a better scholarship. Conditions should be such

that the diligent and earnest student can fit in our rural schools for the village or city high school.

We have our problems to solve, and our difficulties to overcome. The number of pupils in town has been decreasing for several years, thus making our schools small and lacking in the interest that is begotten of large numbers. Let us hope that this matter will be changed ere long. The young people may help to solve this problem by settling in their native town, establishing homes, and rearing families that shall add lasting benefit to the community. To thus build up society is a greater work than to make a fortune.

Our winter roads are often hard roads to travel, but they may help to develop a sturdy and resolute character. If the young are taught to appreciate the value of an education, difficulties will only serve to intensify effort, and make success more certain.
