GENTLEMEN :

Submitted herewith is the report of an audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of New Boston which was made by this Division, acting under authority of Chapter 82, Section 27, of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire, which provides in part as follows:

“Audit on Motion of Commission. The commission may cause an audit to be made of the accounts of any city, town, school district, village district or precinct, as often as once in two years, or whenever conditions appear to it to warrant such audit. xxxxxxxxxxxx”

This audit covered the fiscal year ended December 31, 1948, and the period from January 1st to October 25th, 1949. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report which is made up in three sections as follows:

Section I —Fiscal Year Ended December 31, 1948

Section II —Period January 1st to October 25th, 1949

Section III—Statistical Tables Covering Ten Year Period.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Road Agent and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets—Dec. 31, 1947—Dec. 31, 1948:
(Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1947 and December 31, 1948, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein the Net Debt increased by \$3,846.89 during 1948.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the town during the year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1948, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit D), a net revenue surplus of \$938.31, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$929.56, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$1,867.87.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit E)

A statement of Long Term Indebtedness as of December 31, 1948, showing annual maturities of principal and interest, is included in Exhibit E.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit F)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1948, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Ex-

hibit F. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of October 25th, 1949, is indicated in Exhibit M.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depositary banks.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Tax Accounts:

The uncollected and unredeemed taxes of former Tax Collector Paul H. Saltmarsh, as of March 12, 1949, were recommitted to the present Collector Merrill J. Todd. Since that time it has developed that in a few instances, as enumerated herewith, taxes that were recommitted to Collector Todd as uncollected or unredeemed had actually been paid to Collector Saltmarsh prior to the date of recommitment. Mr. Saltmarsh will therefore remit to Collector Todd the amount of \$83.87, covering the following taxes:

Collector Todd will then credit these accounts in his records.

It was noted that there were uncollected taxes on account of levies going back as far as the year 1937. Detailed lists of the uncollected taxes, by years of levy, are included in Exhibit R. At the conference held by members of this Divi-

sion with the Board of Selectmen on November 16, 1949, the lists were carefully examined and it was decided at that time that all such taxes on account of the levies of 1945 and prior years were uncollectible and should be abated. Each of these items is marked "A" on the lists. The abatements should be made at once by the Selectmen so that the town balance sheet of December 31, 1949, will not include this "deadwood."

The unredeemed taxes, as of October 25, 1949, are likewise detailed in Exhibit S. Tax deeds should be given to the Town by the Collector in cases where more than two years has elapsed since the date of the original tax sale. Each piece of property when so conveyed to the Town should be recorded on the prescribed form of tax deed property card. On this card all taxes, interest and costs paid by the town to date of deed are recorded, plus taxes which accrue thereafter and any other expenses such as insurance, repairs, etc.

Town Clerk:

The Town Clerk should retain motor vehicle permit cards for a period of six years. The current practise has been to destroy the cards after the annual audit by the town auditors.

Town Treasurer:

The Town Treasurer issues separate checks in payment of Selectmen's orders. The usual practise is for the Treasurer to countersign the Selectmen's orders thereby converting the orders into negotiable checks. When this is done the orders and checks bear the same numerical sequence and the possibility of any difference between the order and check is eliminated. The name and number of the depository bank should be stamped or printed on the order. It is recommended that this procedure be adopted.

Trust Funds:

It was noted that the Robert Christie fund which was created in 1892, was comprised of 100 shares of Boston and Maine Railroad common stock carried at a book value of \$10,000.00. The present market value of this stock is approximately \$225.00. It is suggested that the Trustees of Trust Funds communicate with the Treasurer of the Boston and Maine Railroad to determine the present status of this stock.

Conclusion:

The accounts of all town officers which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting procedure, with exceptions as herein noted, conformed to the standards prescribed by this Division.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report. This letter of transmittal should be included in its entirety but the inclusion of Exhibits is optional.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of New Boston for their assistance during the course of the audit.

RECORDS OF TOWN MEETING HELD MARCH 8, 1949

Meeting opened at 10:00 in the forenoon by Moderator Fred H. Cann and Articles of Warrant read and check list posted. Polls now open for voting.

Article A. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4500.00 for deficit of previous year.

Article B. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for town officers' salaries.

Article C. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for town officers' expenses.

Article D. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for election and registration.

Article E. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1800.00 for the expenses of the town hall.

Article F. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the police department.

Article G. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3200.00 for a new addition to fire house, the cost to be kept separate.

Article H. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for the health department.

Article I. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 for vital statistics.

Article J. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000.00 for summer maintenance of highways.

Article K. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for winter maintenance of highways.

Article L. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for street lighting.

Article M. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for the general expense of the highway department.

Article N. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the support of the library.

Article O. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for town poor.

Article P. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2200.00 for old assistance.

Article Q. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$135.00 for Memorial Day and care of the Memorial.

Article R. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$695.00 for interest.

Article S. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2500.00 for payment of long term notes.

Article T. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for town dump.

Article No. 3. Voted to appropriate the sum of \$7500.00 for the completion of the Weare Road and authorized the Selectmen to issue long term notes, said notes not to exceed \$7500.00. The vote was unanimous.

Article No. 4. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1219.62. The vote was unanimous.

The State to contribute the sum of \$4878.48 for town road aid.

Article No. 5. Voted to appropriate the sum of \$333.00 from the capital reserve fund in the hands of the Trustees for the purpose of the town's proportion of building the Woodbury Bridge.

Article No. 6. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for cooperation with the State in control of white pine blister rust.

Article No. 7. Voted to pass over Article No. 7 regarding to rescinding vote taken at the 1948 town meeting on Lull Bridge.

Article No. 8. Voted to closs road and bridge, subject to gates and bars, the road leading from the Wilton Road to South Hill, from the Wilton Road to a point near land of Walter Berry Heirs.

Article No. 9. Voted to give the use of the lower town hall and kitchen to serve lunches to the school children, as per agreement between the School Board and Selectmen.

Article No. 10. Voted for the town to purchase snow fence and paying for same out of winter maintenance funds.

Article No. 11. Voted to pass over Article No. 11, for resurfacing the road beginning at the Merrimack Farmers' Exc. and continuing around the circle, ending at the high school building.

Article No. 12. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$89.00 for the Merrimack Valley Region Association.

Article No. 13. Voted to pass over Article No. 13, to see if the town will vote to construct a new fire station.

Article No. 14. Voted to pass over Article No. 14, to see if the town will give the Selectmen authority to issue long term notes in the name of the town for the cost of construction of a new fire station, said notes not to exceed \$14,000.00.

Article No. 15. Voted to pass over Article No. 15, to see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to execute any and all contracts or agreements necessary, proper and advisable in connection to Articles No. 13 or No. 14.

Article No. 16. Voted to pass over Article No. 16, to see if the town will vote to use the present fire station as an historic building.

Article No. 17. Voted to pass over Article No. 17, to see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting.

Article No. 18. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell or administer property of the town acquired by tax deed or gift.

Article No. 19. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expense of the town.

Article No. 20. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to deliver inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.

Article No. 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Voted to recess town meeting until the results of voting are known.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for state aid construction of the Weare road, the state to contribute the sum of \$4,500.00 or act in relation thereto.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,219.22, the state to contribute the sum of \$4,876.88 for town road aid or act in relation thereto.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for co-operation with the state in the control of white pine blister rust or act in relation thereto.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for capital reserve for rebuilding bridges or act in relation thereto.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to help care for the cemetery, said sum to be paid to the Treasurer of the Trustees of the cemetery or act in relation thereto.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to build a covering over the steps to the rear door of the town hall or act in relation thereto.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to purchase chairs for the town hall or act in relation thereto.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800.00, to be paid to Miss Mildred Hall of Goffstown, as a compromise settlement, of a claim made by her against the Town for medical expenses, loss of wages and pain and suffering, sustained by her on October 24, 1948, when she was thrown from a horse on Bog Road, in New Boston. This accident is alleged to have occurred at or near a culvert on said road, and to have been caused by a defect either in the construction, or want of repair of said culvert.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$91.00 to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town or act in relation thereto.

13. By request of Merrill Todd, to see if the town will vote to raise the salary of the Tax Collector \$50.00 or act in relation thereto.

14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or administer property of the town acquired by tax deed or gift.

15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town.

16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to deliver inventory blanks at the time inventory is taken.

FOREST FIRES—OUR MOST SHAMEFUL WASTE

Everyone apparently fears fire but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than 8 percent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forests, the protection forests provide for game and the supply of ground water. They upset local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the cooperation of the public—YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PREVENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU and YOU cooperate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

1. Being careful with fire in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.
2. Securing the required written permit from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
3. Insisting that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
4. Calling the warden promptly when fire is detected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most shameful waste.

*To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of
New Boston qualified to vote in District Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 14th day of March, 1950, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for School Lunch Program.
10. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate as a capital reserve fund for the construction of an elementary school, said funds to be placed in the custody of the trustees of trust funds and reserved for

the construction of an elementary school in accordance with the Laws of 1943, Chapter 160 as amended by the Laws of 1945, Chapter 35 and Laws of 1947, Chapter 8.

11. To see if the district will vote to reallocate the unused balance of the funds provided by the district meeting of 1949 for new heating plant and school lunch program to the general fund for operational expenses of the schools for 1949-50.

12. To see if the District will vote to appoint a Committee of seven members, to include the members of the School Board, as a survey committee in the interest of providing larger quarters which will be required for school purposes within three to five years, or act in relation thereto.

13. To see if the district will vote to print a detailed statement of payments in the annual town reports, or act in relation thereto.

14. To see if the district will vote to hold the annual School District Meeting on a day other than the second Tuesday in March, or act in relation thereto.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT

To the Citizens of New Boston:

I hereby submit my annual report as Superintendent of Schools of New Boston.

The current school year opened with two changes in our teaching staff. Miss Doris Stiller, instructor of Home Economics for the past three years, and Miss Sophie Gagalis, Social Studies teacher for two years resigned in order to accept positions in other schools. They were replaced by Miss Sallie Ramsay and Miss Margaret Larkin. Miss Ramsay was graduated from Keene Teachers College in 1949, and Miss Larkin from the same institution in 1947, teaching two years in the school[s] of Lebanon, N. H.

As you will note in the statistical tables, the enrollment figures for the current school year changed but little from the figures of a year ago. However, the high school dropped from 47 to 37, while our intermediate grades showed slight increases.

At this time it might be well to consider the census figures on our pre-school children. As you will note in the census table attached, the number of youngsters entering our schools during the next four years is fairly constant, but in the fall of 1954 we will face a large influx, (the census showing some 33 youngsters to enter that fall, probably followed by another fairly large group in 1955). As was mentioned in a previous report, we can continue to house the youngsters as long as we can continue the use of the Community House. At such time as we are no longer able to use that building, some other quarters will have to be secured. The Community House is not ideal for school purposes; the lighting and sanitary facilities are not adequate, and the use of the building should not be continued indefinitely in its present condition.

During the past summer several major repairs were made on the main building. The district meeting of March 1949 appropriated funds to secure a new heating system, and an oil-burning boiler was installed. Up to date the system appears to be adequate and the cost of operation and maintenance has not increased the costs of other years.

The outside of the high school, together with the two

classrooms on the first floor were repainted, the need of which had existed for many years.

During the past year we have been conducting two federal programs. As in past years Headmaster Sanderson has had a farm-shop program, which we feel has been a service to the town at a minimum of expense to the district, since the district is reimbursed through federal funds for the salary of the instructor.

On August 1, 1949 the "Institutional-on-Farm Training Program" was instituted in collaboration with the Veteran's Administration. At the present time some 25 veterans are availing themselves of the program.

Although the expenses are paid through the books of the district, the district is reimbursed for *all* expenses of the program. Mr. George Kittredge of Mont Vernon is the instructor in charge.

As is known to all of you, a school lunch program began operation the last week in November. The initial number of participants was approximately 90, which number has steadily grown until at this writing some 150 pupils are sharing in the program.

To date the program is self-supporting as far as operational costs are concerned. The amount paid by the pupils for meals plus the federal reimbursement of 9c per meal and the receipt of surplus commodities has approximately equalled the cost of food and labor.

The women preparing the meals have done an outstanding job. The food has been excellent,—well-prepared and served. I feel that the program has been an excellent innovation and of benefit to the youngsters of our school.

The financial report and the proposed budget figures for 1950-51 will be found elsewhere in the school report. The action of the 1949 session of the legislature was a severe blow to such towns as New Boston. In our case, state aid for education was reduced from \$7,433 in 1948-49 to \$3,229 in 1949-50, a loss of \$4,204, which loss had to be added to the 1949 tax levy. It is not anticipated that state aid will be increased during the special session of the legislature in 1950, and hence no relief is in sight for the district until 1951-52 at best.

In preparing the school budget for 1950-51, your school board has conscientiously attempted to list only the essential expenses for the operation of your schools. I am convinced that no further reductions can be made if we are to retain even a minimum program of education.

In review, the following factors were in the main responsible for the large tax levy for school purposes in 1949:

Some of the above items will necessarily have to be continued in 1950-51. Loss of State Aid and payment of principal and interest on loan are included in the new budget. The items for painting the building and installation of new heating plant are obviously not included. The amount for School Lunch included last year was mainly for equipment. The retention of the capital reserve item in the 1950-51 budget remains for district action.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

So many children and young people at the age when they should be at their best have bodily defects. Although most of them are presumably well, only a few are entirely free from some defect. Often these defects seem trivial and apparently are of no importance, but we know that even slight defects are likely to lead to trouble later on in life if they are not corrected. Such causes as these may be responsible for failure to make the expected progress in school work. Therefore, we endeavor at the time of the fall examinations to notify the parents of any defects which should have further attention, and recommend that they consult their family physician or dentist for more complete examination and advice.

Many first graders before entering our schools in the fall have been immunized against diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus. May, 1949, six little first graders were taken to the baby clinic for their innoculations. Nearly every pupil in this Union has had the Patch Test. Children showing a positive reaction are referred to the tubercular clinic in Manchester for special chest examination and X-ray. Dr. Kerr advises that those who had the Patch test in 1946 be done again this spring. We have requested the State Board of Health to locate the X-ray Mobile Unit in Goffstown this spring, where it would also be available to New Boston and Dunbarton people. This mass X-ray survey is free to all young people fifteen years and over and all adults. Forty pupils were "Patched" in January, 1949. Four had a positive reaction and later all had the chest X-ray at the tubercular clinic.

Every year a hearing test is given with an instrument that determines the hearing efficiency of our school children. A vision test is also given. Both instruments are electrically operated.

In the fall, 180 pupils were examined by Dr. Fraser, the school physician. Dr. Snay examined the basketball people

in the absence of Dr. Fraser. The number of pupils affected and the number of defects corrected is as follows:
