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## TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Roxbury in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at School House in said Roxbury on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at 7:30 of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 to the Monadnock Region Association.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$247.82 for T. R. A. construction.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the town hall and tool shed fund.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the fire dept.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 for election salaries.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for truck maintenance and equipment.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for town poor relief.

14. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## ANNUAL ROXBURY TOWN MEETING

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March 11, 1958

Meeting called to order by Moderator, Edwin B. Ellis at 7:30 p.m.

Selectmen: Don Menter, Herbert Russell and Forrest Robinson were present.

Meeting opened by the reading of the Town Warrant by the Moderator.

ARTICLE I: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Town Clerk: James Marston nominated. 17 votes cast, of these, James Marston had 17. James Marston declared elected and took oath of office.

Town Treasurer: Laura Menter nominated. 15 votes cast. Of these, Laura Menter had 15. Laura Menter declared elected and took oath of office.

Selectman for Three Years: Don Menter nominated. 14 votes cast. Of these, Don Menter had 13, Norman Duplisse had 1. Don Menter declared elected and took oath of office.

Tax Collector: Priscilla Yardley nominated. 11 votes cast. Of these, Priscilla Yardley had 11. Priscilla Yardley declared elected and took oath of office.

Road Agent: William Yardley nominated. 16 votes cast. Of these, William Yardley had 15, Don Menter had 1. William Yardley declared elected and took oath of office.

Auditor: Motion made and seconded that Oliver Derby act as auditor. Vote in the affirmative.

Constable: Don Menter nominated, Alpheus White nominated and declined, Leon Menter nominated and declined, Floyd Webster nominated. 18 votes cast. Of these, Don Menter had 14, Floyd Webster had 4. Don Menter declared elected and took oath of office.

Trustee of Trust Funds: Madeline Robinson nominated. 17 votes cast. Of these Madeline Robinson had 17. Madeline Robinson declared elected and took oath of office.

Sexton: Edwin Ellis nominated. 13 votes cast. Of these Edwin Ellis had 13. Edwin Ellis declared elected and took oath of office.

Assessors: Motion made and seconded that the Selectmen act as Assessors. Vote in the affirmative.

ARTICLE II: To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Motion made and seconded that \$2,200.00 be raised as town tax. Vote in the affirmative.

Highway and Bridges: Motion made and seconded that \$1,500.00 be raised for summer maintenance of highways. Vote in the affirmative.

Winter Maintenance: Motion made and seconded to raise \$650.00 for winter maintenance. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE III: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region. Motion made and seconded to pass over article III. Motion lost. Motion made and seconded to raise \$10.00 for the Monadnock Region Association. Vote in the affirmative.

ARTICLE IV: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55.00 as it's fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital. Motion made and seconded that we raise \$55.00 for Elliot Community Hospital. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE V: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$244.40 for T. R. A. construction. Motion made and seconded that we raise \$244.40 for T. R. A. construction. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE VI: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the town hall and tool shed fund. Motion made and seconded that we raise \$200.00 for town hall and tool shed fund. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE VII: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the fire department. Motion made and seconded that \$100.00 be raised for the fire department. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE VIII: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80.00 for election salaries. Motion made and seconded that \$80.00 be raised for election salaries. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE IX: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to tar Middle Town Road. Motion made and seconded that we raise \$350.00 to Tar Middle Town Road. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE X: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for truck maintenance and equipment. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$350.00 for truck maintenance and equipment. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE XI: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 to re-cover fire house and selectmen's room. Motion made and seconded to raise \$100.00 to re-roof the selectmen's office. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE XII: To see what action the town will take with regard to changing or altering the town trailer ordinance. Motion made and seconded that the town abolish the trailer ordinance. Tie vote. Brought to ballot, 18 votes cast, 10 yes, 8 no, declared abolished.

ARTICLE XIII: To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Motion made and seconded that the selectmen be authorized to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE XIV: To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Edwin Ellis mentioned that he had heard that there was no record of the church having belonged to the Congregational Society, so it might be town property.

Motion made and seconded that the meeting be dissolved. Vote in affirmative.

Meeting dissolved at 8:35 p.m.

To see if the district will authorize the school board to enter into tuition contracts with the Keene school district for high school tuition at the rate of \$458 per pupil and with the Marlboro district for high school tuition at the rate of \$370 per pupil; and for elementary tuition with Marlboro at the rate of \$240 per pupil.

10. To see what action the district wishes to take toward selling the old school building and what disposition to make of the funds derived from such sale, or take any other action relating thereto.

11. To take up any other matters which may legally come before the district.
