

SELECTMEN'S SPECIAL REPORT

Last year when this special Selectmen's report was revived we had much favorable response and we feel that it should be a regular part of our Town Report.

1951 has been a successful year for the Town of Seabrook financially, every department has operated fully and balances of appropriations are evident in most every case, these balances, added to regular payments on our bonded debt has had the effect of reducing the Town debt by over \$6,000, our net debt today, including long term notes is the lowest in many years, namely \$1,953.96, this is an enviable position, another year we hope that this debt might be wiped out completely.

During the year we have had close contact with our department heads and cooperation has been 100 percent.

We are pleased to report much progress in our Fire Department. The new quarters in the Seabrook Firemen's Association Inc. building on Collins St., is a step forward, is up to date and will lead to more efficient operation. The members of the Department are very interested in improvement, many of them led by Chief Kendrick are putting in much of their spare time without charge at the new station painting, checking equipment etc. Department meetings are held Tuesday evening each week and the public is invited to call and inspect the new station and the fine equipment which is stationed there.

We feel that our Police Department is becoming more efficient each year, recently this board received on behalf of the Department a "Certificate of Merit" from the Governor's Safety Conference stating that the Town had an enviable safety record through reduction in traffic accidents in 1951.

At the 1951 Town meeting the appropriation for Town Road Maintenance was increased substantially expecting that the streets on Seabrook Beach would become Public and that there would be quite a bit of expense involved in maintenance there. To date these streets have not been turned over to the Town by the owners, negotiations for same are still in progress. As this money was available for Town Maintenance and many of the Town roads were badly in need of repairs and resurfacing, our Highway department carried out a plan of improvements which included tarring many streets which have been in need of same for many years.

Our Civil Defense department is very well organized and equipment is procured as needed, regular meetings are being held. We have received many favorable comments regarding the work of Mr. Leslie the Director, and his department.

This board meets regularly each Monday evening at 7:30 to transact Town business, accounts are received and bills paid at this time, the public is welcome to attend these meetings and discuss any problem pertaining to Town affairs.

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Seabrook on Tuesday, March 11, 1952 at Ten O'Clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect by Australian Ballot, a Town Clerk, One Selectman, Assessor and Trustee of the Trust Funds, for a term of Three years; Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Three Constables, a Chief of Police and any other officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for the expense of the General Government, for the protection of persons and property, for Health and Sanitation, for Highways and Bridges, for the support of the Town Poor, and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on taxes.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$135.65, the State to contribute \$904.31 for Town Road Aid.

Article 6. To see what action the Town will take in regards to the following balances of special appropriations; Veterans Memorial Park \$500, Cain's Brook Dam, \$400, Sanding Machine, \$200.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for advancement of the Town through publicity and promotional services of the Seacoast Development Association cooperating with other regional committees, a sum not exceeding One-One Hundredth of One Percent of assessed valuation, namely \$200.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$288 for the purchase of a new electric adding machine.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of Title 2 of the Federal Social Security act (Old Age and Survivors' Insurance) as authorized by chapter 234 of the laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 to defray the Town's share of the cost thereof.

Article 10. If article 9 is adopted; To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the Town will designate the Town Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

Article 11. Upon petition of Clarence R. Blanchard, Jr., and 13 others; To see if the Town will vote that the Selectmen shall give the Rubbish and Garage collection throughout the Town to the lowest bidder and he or she be bonded by a bonding company, if the bonding company will not accept his or her bonds, it will be given to the next lowest bidder, and to have this article remain in effect until recinded.

Article 12. Upon petition of Harvey F. Eaton and 26 others; To see if the Town will vote to pay the Fire Chief a yearly salary of \$300.

Article 13. Upon petition of Harvey F. Eaton and 25 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for a new tank truck.

Article 14. Upon petition of Harvey F. Eaton and 26 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for fire protection at Seabrook Beach. The same to be administered by the Board of Engineers.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$44 for the installation of a street light on Walton Road near, or on the underside of the Boston and Maine Railroad overpass.

Article 16. Upon petition of Carroll F. Randall and 13 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44 to install a street light on Pole No. 148J on Collins St., near the residence of Carroll F. Randall.

Article 17. Upon petition of Elihu T. Adams and 10 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44 to install a street light on New Road near the residence of David F. Boyd.

Article 18. Upon petition of Frank H. Boardman and 23 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44 for the installation of a street light on Pole No. 1022 on New Road near the residence of Charles H. Felch.

Article 19. Upon petition of Charles H. Felch and 46 others; To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$44 for the installation of a street light on Pole No. 444J on Famr Lane, near the residence of Gerald Perusse.

Article 20. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

Article 21. To hear the report of the Water Committee and to act thereon.

Article 22. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1951, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: Dec. 31, 1950 - Dec. 31, 1951: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1950 and December 31, 1951, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$6,010.28 in 1951.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which casued the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1951, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary, (Exhibit A-4) a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$3,707.12, plus a net revenue surplus of \$1,017.12, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$4,724.24.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1951, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1951, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1951, showing annual maturities of principal and annual interest requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Uncollected Poll Taxes of Prior Years:

It is noted that further progress was made during 1951 in the matter of eliminating the uncollected poll taxes on the tax warrants of prior years through abatement procedure. As a result the warrants for the levies of 1944, 1945 and 1946, were balanced and closed.

Attention should be given now to the uncollected balances on the warrants for the levies of 1947, 1948 and 1949, which, as of December 31, 1951, were as follows:

Levy	of	1947	\$222.00
Levy	of	1948	284.00
Levy	of	1949	360.00

These lists should be examined by the Board of Selectmen and Tax Collector and those taxes which appear to be uncollectible should be removed from the lists by abatements.

Unredeemed Taxes:

It is also noted that the town acquired several pieces of property during 1951 through Collector's deeds.

We recommend that the Collector issue tax deeds to the town this year for properties represented by the unredeemed taxes of 1947 and 1948, which amounted to \$224.06 and \$551.65 respectively; the two year redemption period from the date of the tax sales on account of the tax levies of these years having expired.

Reconciliation of Treasurer's Balance:

It is recommended that the Treasurer make a monthly reconciliation between the cash book balance and the bank balance. If this is done differences which may exist will be detected at the time of reconciliation and not carried along to the close of the year. Trustees of Trust Funds:

The trustees of trust funds should be bonded by a surety company as required by Section 29, Chapter 51, of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire.

Conclusion:

The accounts and records of the town officials which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting and financial procedure, with exceptions as herein indicated, conformed to prescribed methods and procedure.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Seabrook for their assistance during the course of the audit.
