## **ANOTHER ENEMY TO CONQUER**

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,788 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

Keep in mind these simple rules :

1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.
2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.
3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.
4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.
5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.

**WARRANT**

---

**THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the 13th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
  - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
  - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
  - (c) Election and Registration.
  - (d) Town Hall Expense.
  - (e) Damage and Legal Expense.
  - (f) Health Department.
  - (g) Vital Statistics.
  - (h) Interest on Temporary Loans.
  - (i) Interest on Bonds.
  - (j) County Tax.
  - (k) Payment on Bonds.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of the Poor.
4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred thirty-five dollars (\$735.00), for street lighting.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments:
  - (a) Police Department.
  - (b) Fire Department.
  - (c) Sewer Department.
8. To see what sum of money, if any the Town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for winter roads.
10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay out of the Tax money when it is received.
11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to administer and dispose of any and all real estate now owned and acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deed.
12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue any or all of the following roads:
  - (a) Starting at the four corners so-called on Route No. 26 and continuing through to where the bridge formerly crossed the West Branch of Bishop Brook.
  - (b) Starting where the road leads to the buildings of the Lemieux farm and continuing through to the so-called Eddie Beauchmim farm buildings.
13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate to the White Mountain Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the region, a sum not exceeding 10c per \$1000. of the assessed valuation of the town for 1944.

14. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize the Selectmen to purchase a Four Wheel Drive 3 ton truck with dump body and snow plow, and make appropriation in the amount of \$1000.00 or more yearly until the purchase price of said truck is paid in full.
15. To choose by Australian ballot the following Town Officers:
  - (a) Town Clerk.
  - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
  - (c) Town Treasurer.
  - (d) Three Road Agents.
  - (e) Three Fence Viewers.
  - (f) One or more Constable.
  - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
  - (h) Overseer of Poor.
  - (i) One or more Sextons.
  - (j) Trustee of Trust Fund.
  - (k) One Library Trustee for three years ensuing.
16. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
17. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.
18. Given under our hands and seals the 17th day of February in the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred and forty-five.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

---

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of The Stewartstown School District:

### FOREWORD

Children are shaped by the entire community. Within the neighborhood or community are hundreds of forces which impinge upon them. Some of these forces are controlled and approved but many are not. There are, in every community of any size, blind spots so far as constructive control and influence are concerned which if neglected can only result in continuing delinquency.

The greater the need for concentrating on the battle front, the greater the necessity of strengthening here at home all that justifies its sacrifice. The more war disrupts our lives, the more responsibility we have to those upon whom its burden falls most heavily. These include not only the men and women plunged into military service or uprooted from their home to serve in the war industries but also the children.

The prevention of juvenile delinquency is one of our home front problems. The home, the school and the community each have a responsibility. Neglect along this line is resulting in too many of our youth being crippled in mind and heart—tragic casualties of war time living.

Yet these are the citizens of tomorrow. And tomorrows soon come. In our hands, as parents and citizens of today, rests the obligation to see that on the home front, the foundations of morality, religion and culture are strengthened, not weakened.

### Teachers

There have been a few changes in the teaching force since the last report. At West Stewartstown Velma Gray replaced

Norman Young as Principal for Grades 7 & 8. Frances Murphy was selected to fill the vacancy at Bear Rock and Lena Rich was chosen for the South Hill School. The other teachers remain the same as the previous year.

### **Notes On The Budget**

The school board's budget for 1945-46 totals \$21,584.00 as compared with \$19,799.00 for last year. The budget is reduced by an estimated income of \$7,175.00 so that the requested appropriation is \$14,409.00. In March 1944 the district raised \$13,524.00.

These figures represent an increase of \$885 over the last appropriation. This is approximately 6% which in view of increased costs for salaries and supplies seems reasonable.

### **Buildings and Equipment**

The school buildings are for the most part in good condition. The largest single improvement was the installation of new slate blackboards in the four rural schools on the east side. The South Hill School was redecorated inside, the Bear Rock School papered and numerous other minor repairs made. Twelve new pupil desks and a dozen additional chairs have been purchased.

It is suggested that possibly another summer the South Hill School might be painted outside and that more even heat might be obtained at West Stewartstown by cutting ventilators between the two up-stairs and down-stairs rooms.

### **Enrollment and Attendance**

There are at this time 84 enrolled at West Stewartstown 50 in the four rural schools and 40 tuition pupils for a total of 174. A year ago there were 162 at the corresponding period.

The percentages of attendance were on the whole improved, but, yet considerably below the 97 considered worthy of special commendation. The highest percentages were 94.50, 94.92, 94.26 for the three upper rooms at West Stewartstown.

The South Hill and Cedar Brook Schools had the poorest tardiness record with one 178 and 125 respectively. The Hollow School had the best record with but three tardinesses for the school year.

### Tuition

We have at present time forty tuition pupils attending school outside the district. Of these 28 are at Canaan High and 12 at Colebrook Academy. A year ago we had 35 tuition pupils.

There are six from Pittsburg attending school at West Stewartstown and one from Colebrook Town at Bear Rock.

### Statistics

The total equalized valuation of any district is made up of the Assessed Valuation, Savings Bank Interest, Railroad Tax and Soldiers' Exemptions. The equalized valuation of the Stewartstown School District is \$818,325.00. Current costs of public education per \$1,000.00 to the local district are \$7.71 and the latest per pupil elementary cost is \$94.96.

### Conclusion

The schools are the community's opportunity for reaching all the children of all the people. It is our duty to provide their education, not education merely in terms of books, credits and diplomas, but education in terms of preparation for living and earning.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
