You are hereby notified to meet at the Kenneth A. Brett School in said Tamworth on Tuesday, the Fourth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To bring in your votes on the alteration and amendments to the Constitution of New Hampshire proposed by the 1974 Constitutional Convention and the 1973 General Court.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

The meeting will be in two parts.

I. In order that the following articles may be legally voted on by Australian ballot, you are hereby notified that the polls will be open for this purpose at 10:00 of the clock on said Tuesday, March 4.

II. The meeting will reconvene at 7 P.M. on March 4, next to see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes and to transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 2000.00 dollars to be used to help defray the cost of operating the Tamworth Rescue Squad.

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 3000.00 dollars to be paid over to Rolland Lord for joint Ambulance service with the following towns-Madison, Freedom, Effingham and Ossipee.

Approved by Finance Committee

ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 25.00 dollars to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of 25.00 dollars for this purpose.

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 811.00 dollars to cover Tamworth's share of expenses for membership in the Lakes Region Planning Commission.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 1500.00 dollars to finish Town Garage toilet and washroom facilities, and replace main garage doors.

ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 200.00 dollars for Tamworth Civil Defense.

ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 126 dollars and 48 cents (\$126.48) (12 cents per person) to be set aside for the Lakes Region Bicentennial Arts Committee for its use in coordinating the 1976 Bicentennial plans of the Lakes Region.

ARTICLE 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 950.00 dollars to be used by the Tamworth American Revolution Bicentennial Commission in conducting the Town's Bicentennial program during 1975.

ARTICLE 31. To see if the Town will vote to create a special committee to be known as a regional refuse disposal planning committee, consisting of three members appointed by the Moderator. The committee of Tamworth will join with neighboring towns' refuse disposal planning committees to form a regional refuse disposal planning board. The board will study the advisability of establishing a regional refuse disposal district, ways for organization, operation and control of such a district, and the methods of selecting, constructing, maintaining and operating a refuse disposal facility to serve the needs of the district. Said Board or Committee shall report their findings and give their recommendations to the Selectmen of each and every Town involved on or before January 15, 1976.

"This Article is in accordance with State enabling legislation Re-Regional Refuse Disposal Districts-Chapter 53-B:1 through 11 and future Amendments as proposed by the State Legislature."

ARTICLE 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 200.00 dollars to defray expenses of the Towns three member refuse disposal committee.

To see if the Town will authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local assistance act of 1972 for use as setoffs against budget appropriations for the following priority purposes and in amounts indicated or take any other action hereon.

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make pre-application, and application for and to accept, and expend on behalf of the Town, any or all grants including grants from the Community development act of 1974 which may be forthcoming from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

THE TAMWORTH TOWN PLANNING BOARD

The work load of the Tamworth Town Planning Board continues to grow as is evidenced by the following annual report.

By-laws were adopted in February and the official name of the Board became The Tamworth Town Planning Board. John B. Hidden, Sr. and Elva F. Bickford were appointed, by the Selectmen, to serve as Board members for five year terms. The resignation of Francis G. Cleveland was accepted with regrets. Mariette Ross was appointed to fill the unexpired term.

The following serve as representatives to other organizations: John F. Damon and Lillian McGrew to The Solid Waste Disposal Group, Nathan H. Hughes to The Lakes Region Planning Commission, John B. Hidden, Sr. to The Tamworth Conservation Commission.

Twelve regular meetings were held from January 31, 1974 to January 31, 1975. Seven special meetings were called: three to study subdivision regulation revisions, one to vote on the Scenic Roads Bill widening of a small portion of the Washington Hill Road to complete what had been started earlier and three to discuss proposed subdivisions with developers. Various field trips were made by individual members for inspectoon of newly constructed roads within subdivisions and of proposed subdivisions in order to properly evaluate the proposals. Two field trips were called for all members concerning one questionable subdivision.

Seven hearings for abutters to proposed subdivisions were held, resulting in the approval of fifty-two lots of one acre or more; one camping area comprised of twenty-five sites and one mobile home park with fourteen lots presently planned. Nine limited subdivisions were also

approved. One subdivision approval was contested and a summons to a hearing found three members attending a Court session in Ossipee in October. Four Dredge and Fill applications were reviewed by the Board.

A float for the Firemen's Fourth of July Parade? Yes, the Planning Board was a part of it, thanks to Lakes Region Planning Commission Graphics and John Damon's pickup truck.

The Lakes Region Planning Commission, of which Tamworth is a member Town, has given substantial assistance to the Board in various fields during 1974. To mention some of them: the posters showing colorful maps and questions concerning the future development of Tamworth: arrangements for an on site consultation with and follow up recommendations from an engineer connected with Environmental Engineers, Inc. - Consultants of Concord, N. H., which gave the Board a broader insite concerning a questioned subdivision: work on Tamworth Land, Use Maps completed; town base road map, soils, slopes and wet lands maps - the last three being in color and attendance of Arthur Lerman at two meetings to explain the Housing and Development Act, to assist in the final drawing up of subdivision regulations revisions and to go over the Commissions' Land Use Mapping Plans, thus giving the Board procedure to follow for further development of a Land Use Plan for Tamworth.

The Tamworth Town Planning Board has been well represented on the following occasions: a Hearing in Concord on House Bill 22 - Critical Areas; N. H. Public Service Hearing in Madison concerning 115 KV transmission line from White Lake substation to Madison Town Line; Citizen's Workshop on Guiding Growth, Interlakes High School, Meredith; Tour of Recyling of Solid

Waste in Nottingham; Governor's Symposium on Erosion and Sediment Control, Margate Resort in Laconia.

1974 REPORT OF THE

TAMWORTH CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The major activity of the year has been the project under the Ford Foundation grant of surveying and mapping Conservation Commission lands, and clearing and marking boundary lines. This has now been done for the Commission land on both sides of Jackman Pond, for Waterfowl Haven in Chocorua, for Black Spruce Bog Ponds, & for the Kennett Triangle, a small triangle of land jutting into Hemenway State Forest on the east side of Chinook Highway, recently given the Commission by the Kennett family. The total cost of this important work was \$1,350 of which the Ford Foundation grant, which made the project possible, paid \$875.

The Conservation Commission shared with the Garden Club the expense of sending a student to Youth Conservation Camp. Jessie Hughes, the student honored, attended camp and later gave an excellent report to the Conservation Commission showing a good grasp of subjects studied.

The Trail Committee, under Percy Olton prepared a preliminary guide to the Big Pines Nature Trail, a supply of which is kept, except in winter, in a box open to the public at the start of the trail. In the box also are the Garden Club guides to the Easy Walker's Trail, completed a year ago.

Work of the Addendum Committee, under Betty Steele, is less tangible, but is progressing. The Committee is charged with adding to the Tamworth Conservation Plan specific recommendations, a long-term task which involves study and field trips to many areas of town.

Florence Damon, appointed to the Commission since our last report, now heads the Education Committee which aims primarily to work through the school, and has held one field trip with the 4th grade.

State law now requires that the Conservation Commission be notified of all Dredge and Fill applications from Tamworth to the state. Only one major application was reviewed by the Commission with the land owner, and

considered satisfactory, so no further steps were taken. An unsatisfactory review would lead to a public hearing and report to the Special Board for Dredge and Fill before it could act on the application.

Under the Scenic Roads law, the Planning Board held a hearing on proposed widening on Washington Hill Road. Conservation Commission members studied the section to be widened and made recommendations to the Planning Board at the hearing.

Among other activities, Commission members attended ten meetings and hearings throughout the state. Several public field trips have been held and one work party in which the Commission was ably assisted by volunteers wielding chain saws and other implements to clear a trail from Bunker Hill Road around the south shore of Jackman Pond.

Liaison member of the Planning Board and Conservation Commission is now John Hidden, Sr., a member of the Conservation Commission since 1970, who was appointed to the Planning Board last spring.

ANNUAL REPORT TAMWORTH OUTING CLUB

The Tamworth Outing Club sponsors a variety of activities through the year, to provide recreation for both children and adults of the Town.

Last summer the Tamworth Little League baseball team, a member of the Madison, Ossipee, Sandwich, Tamworth League played ten games and did well under the coaching of Ed Mallett. The team got five new uniforms. The Farm team, coached by Ken Johnson was given caps and shirts. The Outing Club also contributed to the new Babe Ruth League team coached by Dana Steele; and supported the Tamworth Knights men's team, of the Portland Twilight League.

A new project for the Club is the Little League ball field behind the School. With a lot of work and a little luck this field should be ready for play by middle or late summer.

The summer square dances continued popular and were held weekly at Stafford's Barn, with two orchestras, and callers Dudley Laufman and Ned Behr alternating the ten dances.

In August the Ladies Singles Tennis Tournament, part of the annual Chocorua Tennis Tournament, was sponsored by the T.O.C. and ably run by Ellen Moot.

The two trap shoots on Great Hill in September were well attended by both sportsmen and spectators. It is a beautiful spot just to sit and watch. As has happened before, the shooters' enthusiasm carried them late into the afternoon until the clay pigeons were being lost in the dusk.

The rifle shoot was held a week earlier than usual in an effort to beat the cold weather we often get at the end of October. The youthful 22 cal. shooters outnumbered the high power ones, but with good competition in both classes. The moving targets and the presence of old

fashioned muzzle loaders always make an interesting event.

The summer dances went so well we decided to have Dudley Laufman once a month all winter at the old Town House. These in turn have done so well that an excellent local group, The Tamworth Contra Band, has run one or two more each month.

This year the skating rink behind the Post Office in Tamworth was enlarged, and the Firemen were great as usual, having pumped over 15,000 gallons onto it. After last year's washout the rink is getting good use again.

COOK MEMORIAL LIBRARY

1974 was a banner year for your library. More adults and children (3258) utilized the Library and its services-borrowing more books, magazines and records (5415) than any other year.

Our thanks go to the many individual and groups who helped and improved Cook Memorial Library in many different ways. The "Friends of the Library" beautified the interior with wall to wall carpeting--warm and attractive--richly complemented by the striking new drapes. Remick's Store donated their old paperback rack which our trustees painted. It displays the paperbacks far better than a shelf, as our brisk business in checking out this type book indicates. The Meredith Banks, where our library funds are located, donated tote bags for our patrons use in carrying and protecting borrowed books. The Garden Club with its talented "green thumb" filled our window boxes with bright and colorful flowers and in the winter with dark green evergreen cuttings and contrasting red berries. At Christmas they placed an attractively decorated tree in our window.

Throughout the year the Librarian was aided by the young and very capable Brett School volunteer, Natalie Johnson, and, from the summer on, by Lynda Wheeler, A Tamworth teenager, working under the auspices of Vista. Our gratitude also goes to the donor of the American flagreceived just in time for the 4th of July parade. Our trustees have added a much needed light in the front hall to enable patrons to view maps displayed on the walls and the books for sale on the cart. We are also in the process of obtaining hot water, now required to meet minimum standards under State and Federal Law.

We can never adequately thank our wonderful cataloguing committee for their enormous and unending task in weeding and cataloguing the adult books. Our appreciation also goes to the many townspeople for the

gifts of books, paperbacks, magazines, memorials and donations.

In 1974 various paintings of Don Turner were displayed and toward the end of the year Willey Fromm exhibited some of her fine art work. A Tamworth resident contributed many beautiful prints which has enabled us to show the works of different artists and techniques every few weeks.

Other displays throughout the year included William Fennell's exhibit of books, pictures and folders from the British towns of Sandwich, Tamworth and Conway, The Historical Society's "Books of Our Own" and a "Collection of Historical Documents", the Conservation exhibit of a map and pictures of Tamworth, the Carroll County Extension Service array of pamphlets and folders on "howto-do" projects for home and garden, the Brett School display of tutorial and remedial work in Speech and Mathematics and Alex Cook's lovely Christmas arrangement of needlework decorations.

Your Library continued its participation in "Outreach to Carroll County Shut-Ins", entered a float (aided once more by the wonderful "Friends of the Library") in the first of many 4th of July parades sponsored by the Tamworth Fireman's Club, joined the Chocorua Library in sponsoring a "garden books" display and a movie night, helped initiate a paperback library of their own for the teen center and hosted a State Library "Display of Children Books" for the North Country District. Our sincere appreciation goes to the ladies who handled the summer story hour for the three to six year olds and to the gentleman who ran the projector on the final day.

Cook Memorial Library joined the libraries from Sandwich, Chocorua, Moultonboro, Madison and Center Harbor in establishing the "Bearcamp Neighborhood Libraries" for the purpose of discussing and solving of mutual problems of small libraries. The trustees and librarian attended various workshops and State or District

meetings throughout the year. Your Librarian completed two more extension courses--"Introduction to Public Libraries" and "Evaluating Children's Books". Eight courses are now required for librarians in order to be certified to meet minimum state qualifications.

As a public service, one of our library trustees posts a monthly calendar of town events at the Post Office and at the Library to aid residents and visitors in checking town events and to avoid conflicts in scheduling. We do hope all town organizations will utilize this service.

Your Library offers Large Print books and magazines for the visually handicapped, welcomes the Tamworth Pre-School children to visit and use the children's collection, makes available its facilities for meetings for small community groups, cooperates in exhibits and displays. During the year we lent Brett School 463 books to augment their own collection, requested 160 books on varied subjects for individuals from the State Library through Inter-Library Loan, borrowed 2420 books from the State Bookmobile to add to our own collection, purchased or were given 298 books--thereby presenting our patrons with as wide a selection of material as possible.

Cook Memorial Library is open Wednesday from 1:30 to 5:00 and 7:00 to 9:00 P.M. and Saturday from 1:15 to 4:45 P.M. The telephone number is 323-8510. I hope 1975 will see more and more Tamworth residents using their library. Come in and look over our collection of books, paperbacks, newspapers, magazines and records. If you need information on a home or school project or want a particular book, we shall make every effort to help you. Your suggestions and recommendations are welcome for we are constantly trying to improve the library and its services and resources for your benefit.

THE TAMWORTH FOUNDATION

To the Tamworth Public:

As in past years, we report on the Annual and Trustees' Meetings of August 23 and on appropriations made then.

Income for the past year was \$34,816.36 of which \$4,915.00 was in contributions. These included gifts of \$1,265 in memory of the greatly missed Theodore C. Browne, once most helpful here. It is our practice that gifts over \$1000 be added to capital, but we hope to find special use for such memorial funds.

Under Miss Wilson's will \$2,734.52 was paid to her surviving sister, and \$181.90 went to printing and postage. By Mrs. Whittemore's bequest of which the Foundation is Trustee, \$9,251.61 was paid to the Tamworth Community Nurse Association, \$5,384.85 to the Chocorua Public Library. A fund contributed by Runnells descendents for maintenance of the Hall brought \$312.83. The total of these payments was \$17,865.71.

The remaining usable income was \$16,950.65 but in fact somewhat less because the gifts in memory of Theodore C. Browne were added to capital. Final bills for the new Town Office came to \$15,349.37; the total cost of the building over three years was just under \$50,000. The amount sounds high, but it included the substantial vault, made of brick and ventilated, for town documents, also the Nurse's office and equipment for it. Renovation of the old building simply for Town Offices was probably no more expensive than a new building would have been, but is more attractive and more fitting. Gifts to current causesthe Pre-School, the Rescue Squad, the Tamworth Library, the skiing program, baseball equipment, and a new post and nets at the tennis courts-were largely listed in the earlier letter; they came to \$5,800. With the final bills for the Town Offices, that meant an over-spending of at least \$4,198.72. As noted in past letters, savings had been made

toward the building but should continue for two years more. Hence this year's gifts for the most part simply repeat those to current causes, with addition of \$200 each to the School Library and Summer Enrichment, \$250 to the Red Cross swimming program, and increase from \$4,000 to \$4,600 to the Pre-School. One more year of frugality should balance the recent over-spending.

Yet three more possible expenses await: toward treeplanting in the main centers by the Conservation Commission, for two further walkie-talkie sets for local police (largely paid for by State funds), and to finish the softball field at the school. Several teams and much interest exist; because the soft-ball diamond is smaller, the hard-ball field cannot be used without damage. The Foundation two years ago gave \$1,500 toward a second field; the Outing Club and other groups and individuals further contributed. The land has been cleared and there is some new top-soil, but it is estimated that \$4,000 will be needed, partly toward an unpaid bill, to make the field playable, as it should be by next season. The wide interest would seem to justify an item to cover part of the cost in the warrant for the School Meeting. If so, the Foundation might make up the rest.

As we keep saying, the Foundation tries to do two things, to help current causes and to undertake occasional large projects. Both are important for the character of life here, and they demand sustained interest and gifts. It may be unnecessary to add that gifts, which are tax-deductible, should go to Charles T. Gallagher, Treasurer, in Tamworth 03886.

ANNUAL REPORT TAMWORTH AMERICAN REVOLUTION BICENTENNIAL COMMISSION, INC.

The Town Meeting, on March 5, 1974, designated the Arts Council as the agency responsible for Tamworth's observance of the national bicentennial. The Council subsequently established a special committee to conduct the town's bicentennial program. In November this committee received a charter as a tax-exempt corporation under the name Tamworth American Revolution Bicentennial Commission, Inc.

The early months have been devoted chiefly to reviewing proposals which might be included in the town's American Revolution Bicentennial program. In general, the Commission has followed the guidelines offered by the national A. R. B. Commission and the state Commission. The Bicentennial program will continue through 1975 and 1976 and will include projects on three general themes: **Heritage** which commemorates the past of Tamworth and the nation; **Festival** which celebrates the present; **Horizons** (which looks to future improvement in the quality of life.

Wherever possible the Commission will encourage existing organizations to initiate and conduct projects. For example, the Tamworth Historical Society intends to identify and rehabilitate old graveyards; this project will be part of the Heritage program. Another example: the Firemen's Club expects to hold Fourth of July parades in 1975 and 1976; this becomes part of the Festival program. A third example: the Conservation Commission and Garden Club are considering a tree planting project; this becomes part of the Horizons program. In some instances, however, no organization is presently available to undertake a project which might be desirable; in these cases the Commission might establish special task forces to carry out projects.

Some of these projects will require no funds since they involve the unpaid effort of volunteers. In other cases very substantial sums might be required. In general, the Commission would expect, as one of its functions, to raise money for projects from several sources both private and public. For administrative expenses a small appropriation from the town will be needed.

The Town of Tamworth has been recognized by the national A. R. B. C. as a Bicentennial Community. This recognition has been achieved largely because of the early initiative of the Arts Council in applying to the national commission. As a result, the town has been authorized to use the Bicentennial logo and it will receive a flag and certificate at a presentation ceremony scheduled for the summer of 1975.

The Commission is presently considering a broad range of projects which might be included in the Bicentennial program. These projects have been suggested by many organizations and individuals. But we are still seeking ideas for Bicentennial projects which would illuminate Tamworth's past, enrich its present or improve its future. Let us have yours!

SPECIAL HEALTH OFFICER REPORT TOWN OF TAMWORTH 1974

Almost weekly do the laws pertaining to sewerage disposal change. Recently I received a new booklet of bylaws, only to have this weeks mail bring me pamphlets of revisions to be inserted into the booklet. The constantly changing sewerage laws are a result of the desperate need for sewerage control, coupled with the varied needs of each application for permit and the results of tests conducted since the sewerage laws were written.

One improvement in the law as of last summer makes it possible for me to approve repairs on an existing system, which formerly required state approval. Obviously the system can now be repaired sooner and present less of a health hazard.

Although new building construction here, as everywhere, is down considerably this year, those systems which have been newly constructed adhere to the state requirements. Difficulty with systems not conforming to state requirements, or installed without permits, was not a problem this year as landowners are more aware of the state laws governing sewerage control, more aware of the need of controlled sanitation, and therefore more willing to consult the Health Officer prior to construction.

I have attended many meetings this year of the Water Pollution Board, taking advantage of the opportunity to discuss changing laws, new disposal systems, and new sub-division laws. There is a growing interest in sub-division of land in Tamworth, but doing so requires careful study, planning, and testing. All this is necessary to discourage the development of unsuitable land.

Concerned townspeople have inquired often in the past year about questionable sewerage disposal or drainage. In each case I met with the accused landowner, explained the laws and, when needed, advised him what must be done to correct the problem. Only occasionally do I encounter anyone unwilling to dispose of sewerage as properly recorded by the Water Pollution Board. In such cases I advise him of the law and the corrective measures available and ask him to obtain a state approval before using any system.

Such cases being in the minority prove that most of our citizens realize that sewerage control must be maintained if we are to protect the future of our town.

SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL IN TAMWORTH

The Selectmen of Tamworth appointed a Dump Study Committee several years ago. The purpose of this committee was to study the disposal of solid waste in the town and report to the selectmen and alternatives available and their estimated costs.

Air pollution control laws require that Tamworth and all other towns and cities in New Hampshire no longer burn their rubbish and garbage in open burning dumps by July 1, 1975. The open burning laws exclude the burning of brush, stumps and combustible demolition wastes. Also excluded is the use of backyard incinerators for individual families or up to four families living in one building.

The following is a list of areas studied by the Tamworth Committee:

- 1. Attitude of Tamworth year-round and seasonal residents with respect to solid waste disposal.
 - 2. Closing the old dump site.
 - 3. Using the present dump site for sanitary disposal.
 - 4. Working with neighboring towns.

1. Attitude Survey

The purposes of the attitude survey were two fold -one) to ask year-round and seasonal residents questions that would help the study committee and the selectmen to determine volumes of waste generated, methods Tamworth tax payers use to get rid of their waste, how often they dispose of their waste, what they think of recycling, whether or not to cooperate with neighboring towns and the days of the week a disposal site should remain open; and two) to inform year-round and seasonal residents that such planning is going on in the town.

The study committee appreciates the help of Scott Aspinall, Tamworth Teens and the other young adults who assisted with the survey and a public meeting held in August, 1974.

The following pages include both the numeral and evaluated results.

Close to 85 percent of those who responded indicated that recycling is necessary. With the exception of "clean paper" (72), they were willing to keep glass (117), metal (112) and newspaper(112) separate from the general trash.

Very few of the respondents wanted the site open only in the afternoon or evening--all day is without a doubt the majority opinion.

2. Closing our Present Site

The site of our present open burning dump should be closed and renovated for both public health and aesthetic reasons. Rats and other scavengers need to be poisoned during the closing period or they will move to nearby residences in search of food. Exterminators should be hired to conduct the poisoning program.

The face of our present dump could be graded to a three to one slope, covered with two feet of compacted earth and seeded. Consideration should be given to using the old site for other purposes such as a stump, brush and demolition disposal area; storage area for bulky metals such as refrigerators, washing machines, junk cars, etc.; ski slope of school children, etc. Once the decision is made as to how and where our solid waste will be handled in the future, it is suggested that the selectmen ask the School Board, Outing Club, Conservation Commission, and other town groups to work with the Planning Board on alternative uses for this site.

The following is a suggested plan and cost estimate for the renovation of the present dump site. It is expected that a portion of the cost of renovation could be received from the North Country Resource Conservation and Development Project. It is suggested that an article be placed in the town warrant asking voters to consider appropriating a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00 for the closing of the old dump site and accept money from the RC&D Project to assist with the control of surface water and erosion at the old dump site.

THE TAMWORTH SUMMER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

THE TAMWORTH SUMMER ENRICHMENT PROGRAM completed it's seventh successful summer of activities with a registration of 125 young people; 80 percent resident-20 percent summer.

TSEP is a program of activities for children ages 7-15 years, operating with the idea that kids have fun in participating in the activities while at the same time, learning from them.

The program runs three days a week for seven weeks at the Kenneth A. Brett School playground.

This past year was the second year of providing bus transportation throughout the entire program, and attendance at the program was considerably increased because of this effort.

The numerous activities include sports (baseball, tennis, basketball, soccer, volleyball), all manner of arts and crafts-always a big favorite at TSEP, and a variety of trips including bike hikes, mountain climbing, nature walks, and trips to points of interest such as the Squam Lakes Science Center, Barnstormers, Gilford Playhouse, etc. The annual TSEP picnic to Swift River on the Kancamagus attracts over eighty participants.

The program finished strongly with the last week's tournaments (tetherball, horseshoes, chess, and checkers), the annual track & field day, and this past year a carnival and bake sale in which the kids invented the games to be played and built the booths to house them.

The experienced staff last year included Dana Steele (his 7th summer as Director), Connie Hughes, who runs the arts and crafts and the Friday morning pre-school hour (6th year), Bob Magruder (4th year), Kay Ver Planck (2nd year), and Debbie MacLane (1st year).

The staff was augmented by an enthusiastic group of Junior Leaders, Patty Bennett, Charlotte Kelly, Melanie Elliott, and Richard Whiting, who, last summer more than any other, were invaluable to the smooth running of the program.

Volunteers, on whom the program relies heavily, included Helen Steele, Percy Olton, Jan Dearborn, Barbara Gribbel, and George Cleveland, who had an entire playground of children mesmerized with his hilarious and educational clown demonstration, and Becky Fisher, who came each week to run a very successful modern dance program.

Each summer TSEP strives to vary its program to best suit the children's interests, which over the course of time does change.

We try to keep "our ear to the ground" while avoiding the same format year after year. For instance, our mountain climbing / camping program has expanded as interest in this activity grew.

We encourage the kids to suggest activities they wish to do and then follow up if possible. The game 4-square, seldom played at the program in previous summers was the "in" game last summer as well as an interest in the revival of croquet.

In short, we at TSEP neither believe in a rigid structure nor an entirely unstructed program. We strive to find the "happy medium".

We want to thank each and every one who has supported the program, for making it the success it has become.
