THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Troy in the County of Cheshire in the said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Troy Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next at 10:00 A.M. in the forenoon for the election of Town officials and any other question that by statute must appear on the official ballot, and you are hereby notified to meet at the Troy Elementary School on Wednesday, the 10th day of March next at 7:30 P.M. in the evening for consideration of the remainder of the Town Warrant.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for a town clerk, one selectman for three years, town clerk for three years, town treasurer for three years, tax collector for three years, and all other town officers chosen by ballot.

Art. 2. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the following town expenditures for the ensuing year:

- a. Town Officers' Salaries
- b. Town Officers' Expenses
- c. Election and Registration
- d. Town Hall and Other Buildings
- e. Parks and Playgrounds
- f. Legal Fees
- g. Vital Statistics
- h. Insurance
- i. Social Security
- j. Interest, temporary loans

- k. Memorial Day
- l. Town Dump
- m. Street Lighting
- n. Civil Defense
- o. Pine Blister and Shade Trees
- p. Monadnock Regional Association

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for winter highway maintenance.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for highway summer maintenance and oiling.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$468.83 for Town Road Construction.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the purpose of making improvements to that portion of South Main Street from a point from the so-called Walton West property to the point of discontinuance just south of the residence of Joseph Laporte, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated as amended.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to place a sum of money in the Capital Reserve Fund for highway purposes.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the support of the fire department.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purchase of a new fire truck, said sum to be raised over a period of three years, and authorize the issuance of notes or bonds, or take any other action relating thereto.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the withdrawal of the fire department capital reserve fund.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the police department.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the operation of the water department.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the district nursing association.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money toward the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the continuance of the War Memorial Program.

Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the support of the Gay-Kimball Library.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the care of the cemeteries.

Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Public Welfare and Old Age Assistance.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the payment of the water bonds and interest thereon.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money as the town's share as a member of the Ashuelot Valley Planning Commission for another year, and instruct the selectmen to appoint two members to represent the town, one member from the Planning Board, and one from the Board of Selectmen.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the installation of five street lights on South Street.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote and appropriate a sum of money for a water main extension on South Street to the home of Emile Laporte.

Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money equal to 20c per capita to help support the work of the Monadnock Health and Welfare Council.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote a sum of money for the reappraisal of all town properties, or take any other action relating thereto.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay town charges.

Art. 26. To hear the reports of agents, officers or committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

REPORT OF TROY FIRE DEPARTMENT

At the forthcoming town meeting the citizens of Troy must face an important question, whether or not to purchase a new fire truck. Two articles have been placed in the warrant concerning this matter.

In 1969 an inspection, which was requested by the Budget Committee and Fire Chief was made of the fire trucks by the New Hampshire Board of Underwriters. It was recommended at that time (two years ago) that the present 1946 Seagrave pumper be replaced as soon as possible, on the basis of the fact that this piece of equipment has outlived its usefulness. It would appear that the town of Troy does not have adequate protection from fire at this time. Although we are members of the Mutual Aid System and do have the Meadowood facilities close at hand, everyone should realize that this type of equipment is complementary to Troy's basic equipment and it is still necessary for the town to provide its own primary fire protection.

The members of the Board of Engineers strongly urge the citizens of Troy to approve the purchase of a new fire truck now. Failure to purchase the needed equipment only increases the risks of serious fire loss and also the expense since costs continue to rise at the rate of 10-12% per year.

During the past year the members of the fire department participated in various fire training programs held at Meadowood. We also held preplan fire drills. The purpose for this type of training is to get members of area departments and our own familiar with the use of available equipment, layout and structure of various buildings and to develop effective cooperation within the fire protection teams.

We are happy to report that Troy escaped any serious loss from fires during the past year. We attribute some of this good fortune to the fine efforts of the members of the Fire Department and the people of Troy.

TROY VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION

The Troy Visiting Nurse Association, which includes Fitzwilliam, celebrated its 50th anniversary this year.

The Visiting Nurse program provides skilled nursing care under a physician's orders; treatment; diagnostic and preventive procedures. There is a fee for this service.

Health Supervision visits are made to individuals at no cost and not necessarily under a physician's care but in accordance with the State Public Health policies providing pre-natal, post-natal, newborn and adult health advice.

There is a follow-up of persons discharged from hospitals, rehabilitation centers, etc. The nurse aids in referring individuals to other health and welfare agencies for assistance.

Immunization clinics are free to pre-school children.

Under Medicare regulations, skilled nursing care is being defined in progressively more restrictive terms. The board has sent a letter to Senators and the Representative from this district, urging "modification" of patient qualifications for home nursing care.

A diving board was purchased and soon to be installed. This new diving board should help hold down injuries and add much more pleasure in this area. A resuscitator was purchased as a preventive measure and all three Sand Dam instructors are capable of using this life saving resuscitator. Town drinking water was installed thanks to Bill Parker and the Troy Water Works. Many small jobs were done for upkeep such as painting the buildings.

Thanks also to Foss Trucking for the rubbish removal; the Fire Department for helping to clean the beach, putting up the dock, and for building a new wooden ramp for the dock; to Daniels Village Store for the telephone; to Tommila Building Supplies for their contributions; and thanks to all that did help with our program that I have not mentioned and, of course, special thanks to Troy Mills.

ZONING ORDINANCE FOR TOWN OF TROY, NEW HAMPSHIRE

Purpose:

To promote a comprehensive plan which will allow the town of Troy, N.H. to grow in an orderly manner in an era of increasing demand for housing of all types and design; to protect and conserve the value of property and economic welfare of the citizens of the town of Troy, and to promote the health, safety, convenience, and general welfare of the community, the following ordinance is hereby enacted by the voters of said town of Troy pursuant to the authority conferred by the Revised Statutes of the State of New Hampshire, Chapter 31: 60-89. (1955).

Section One

ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICTS

For the purpose of this ordinance, the Town of Troy is divided into three (3) districts, as shown on the zoning map: (A) Residence Districts, (B) Business Districts, and (C) General Districts.

Section Two

GENERAL PROVISIONS

APPLICABLE TO ALL DISTRICTS

1) Land to the depth of three hundred (300) feet from the center line of all public highways in the town of Troy shall be subject to the provisions of this ordinance.

2) No dwelling shall be erected upon a lot subject to this ordinance in the town of Troy unless the lot has a frontage of at least one hundred (100) feet on a public highway or public right of way, either existing or proposed, by one hundred seventy-five (175) feet in depth, or ten thousand (10,000) square feet per family unit, whichever is greater.

3) The owner or developer of any subdivision or new housing development shall provide a public right of way fifty (50) feet in

width from a public highway to all house lots in such subdivision or housing development.

4) Developers shall be financially responsible to the town of Troy for all clearing, grading, drainage, graveling, surface pavement, loaming and seeding within the rights of way and for the installation of sanitary sewers, storm sewers, and water mains. Such conditions shall be met according to the final plat approved by the Board of Adjustment of the town of Troy.

- A) Rights of way shall be designed to discourage shortcut traffic.
- B) The minimum radii curve in any proposed right of way shall be one hundred (100) feet.

5) Farms and home or truck gardens are acceptable, excluding any use injurious or offensive to the neighborhood but including the sale of produce raised on the premises.

6) The term "Junk Yard" as used herein shall include any business or private lot, tract, property, or place of storage or deposit, whether in connection with another business or individual property owner or not, which has stored or deposited within its boundaries two (2) or more unregistered motor vehicles which are no longer intended or in condition for legal use on the public highways, or used parts of motor vehicles or old iron, metal, glass, paper, cordage, or other waste or discarded or second hand material which has been part, or intended to be a part, of any motor vehicle, the sum of which parts or material shall be equal in bulk to two or more motor vehicles.

R.S.A. 267:1

The use of land, subject to Section Two-1, as a Junk Yard shall be prohibited unless duly licensed by the Board of Adjustment, and the yard is completely fenced or screened so as to be hidden from view.

7) The protection of top soil shall be considered in the installation of all improvements and facilities. All disturbed areas of the subdivision shall be stabilized by seeding, planting, or other means agreeable to the Board of Adjustment of the town of Troy, New Hampshire.

8) The removal of clay, sod, loam, sand or gravel is permitted, either for private use or for sale, provided that the premises are restored to safe and sightly condition and protected against erosion within six (6) months of the depletion of any portion of the bank or pit.

9) Any new building to be used for the purpose of a dwelling, shall have a minimum of four hundred (400) square feet of floor space, be constructed on a permanent foundation of cement, cement blocks, granite blocks, or similar substance acceptable to the Board of Adjustment of the town of Troy.

10) These provisions do not apply to land beyond three hundred (300) feet from the center line of any and all public rights of way in the town of Troy, N.H.

11) Definitions:

A) Plat —

A map of a subdivision showing the subdividers plan for new streets and lots.

B) Subdivision —

The division of a lot, tract, or parcel of land into two (2) or more lots, plats, sites, or other division of land for the purpose, whether immediate or future, of sale or building development. It includes resubdivision, and when appropriate to the context, shall relate to the process of subdividing or to the land or areas subdivided.

C) Street —

Any Street, Avenue, Boulevard, Road, Lane, Alley, Viaduct, Highway, Freeway, and other public way which is an existing State, County, or Municipal roadway, or a street shown upon a plat heretofore approved pursuant to law. Streets include the land between street lines and may include pavement, shoulders, gutters, sidewalks, parking areas, and loading or unloading areas.

Section Three
RESIDENCE DISTRICT USES

In the residence districts, buildings or premises may be erected, altered or used, and the land may be used for the following purposes only:

- 1) Any purpose authorized in Section Two.
- 2) Private Dwellings, including Duplex Apartment houses and accommodations for tourists and overnight guests,
- 3) Churches, public buildings, clubs, and
- 4) Accessory uses such as the practice of a profession on the premises in which the practitioner resides, and also dress-making, millinery and similar home occupations not conducted as a regular business.
- 5) Town and State Highway directional and regulatory signs, Historical signs and those signs used to advertise the profession or goods dealt in by the owner or occupant of property on which placed, no signs or group of signs shall exceed twenty (20) square feet, outside dimensions, and none shall be placed so as to obstruct the view on the highway.

Section Four
BUSINESS DISTRICT USES

In the Business District, buildings or premises may be erected, altered or used and the land may be used for the following purposes only:

- 1) Any purpose or accessory use authorized in the Residence District.
- 2) Motels, Multi-Apartment Houses, and Restaurants or other eating places.
- 3) Wholesale or Retail stores, or Shops for custom work or making of articles to be sold at retail on the premises.
- 4) Business or Professional offices, Banks and the conduct of similar professional or business enterprises.

- 5) Commercial amusement places including theatres, bowling alleys, skating rinks, billiard rooms, dance halls, and places of similar indoor recreation.
- 6) Garages for the storage or repairs of motor vehicles, and gasoline or fuel, and oil filling stations.
- 7) Such industrial or manufacturing uses as are not injurious, noxious, offensive or otherwise objectionable or hazardous to the community for any cause, for which the Board of Adjustment, upon petition, issues approval in writing. No building shall be built or erected for any purpose closer than ten (10) feet from the sides of the lot nor closer than thirty (30) feet from the property line adjoining the street.
- 8) Such accessory uses as are customary in connection with the foregoing uses and are incidental thereto. Accessory uses shall not include the deposit or placing outside of any building any waste or refuse unless suitably screened.

Section Five

GENERAL DISTRICT USES

In a General District, there shall be no restrictions on land or buildings other than those stated in Section Two.

Section Six

NON-CONFORMING USES

Any lawful use of land or of buildings, building, or part thereof at the time of the adoption of this Ordinance may be continued, although such use does not conform to the provisions of this Ordinance. Any building occupied by a non-conforming use may be structurally altered or the use of such building changed to any other use not more detrimental to the character of the district in which it is located. Should any conforming building occupied by a non-conforming use be destroyed or damaged by fire or other casualty, in whole or in part, it may be replaced by a building to be used for the same purpose as the one destroyed, provided that such reconstructed building or new building shall not exceed in cubic contents the original building by more than twenty-five per cent (25%).
