



WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Webster, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to secure State Highway construction.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of highways and bridges.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for plowing and sanding roads in winter.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling town roads.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief of the town poor.

- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to pay serial note.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for town library.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for payment of interest.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to cooperate with the state in control of White Pine Blister Rust, using town labor.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of 2 per cent on 1938 taxes, paid on or before August 1, 1938.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to faise and appropriate to buy insurance for town help.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to take action to make the Corser Hill Cemetery ready for burial purposes and raise and appropriate a sum necessary to start the work.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to accept the Australian Ballot for future town meetings.

- 20. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to sell and convey a certain piece of property acquired by tax deed known as the John E. Stone property, containing ten acres, located on the Crossroad, at either public or private sale.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Webster District:

Owing to an action of the legislature during its last session the number of superintendents of schools in the state was reduced by three. This necessitated a reajustment in several supervisory unions. The Webster district was taken from the Penacook union and put into the Hopkinton-Warner union. The duties of the superintendent of schools of the district which had been so ably and well carried on by Supt. George W. Sumner for the past four years were turned over to me in October, 1937. It thus falls to my lot to write a report of the work of the schools of the district for last year with such knowledge as may be gleaned from the registers and well kept reports from Supt. Sumner's office. The intimate details of the work of the schools which are never recorded are unknown to me. However, I do not feel that I am a stranger in the district as it was my good fortune for eight years to serve as superintendent there, 1925-1933. It is with much pleasure that I again resume work in the Webster schools and renew the many pleasant acquaintances among the citizens of the district.

During the year 1936-1937 the teachers employed in the district were as follows:

Putney Hill—Mr. William S. Herbert, C. N. S. '34. Corser Hill—Mrs. Ethel Colby, K. N. S.

Mrs. Doris S. Buswell was music supervisor.

From the above table the following may be noted:

- 1. Each school was in session three days less than the required 180.
- 2. The per cent of attendance at Putney Hill is very good, but Corser Hill is somewhat low.
- 3. The number of cases of tardiness in both schools is high. Every effort should be made to reduce tardiness and increase punctuality. Parents and teachers can both assist in this.

The unrepeated registration in the district was 53. In addition there were two elementary pupils from the district in attendance at Contoocook. At Concord there were 6 high school pupils; at Hopkinton, 4; at Penacook, 1; at Franklin, 1. One tuition pupil was registered in Webster from Salisbury. Altogether there were 67 pupils residing in the district and attending public schools. This is one less than last year.

From an inspection of the budget for this year, 1937-1938, there will be a deficit of about \$500 at the end of the year. At the annual meeting in March the district should raise this amount in addition to the amount needed for 1938-1939

as recommended in the budget of the school board. The installation of a septic toilet in each school is a great improvement which was almost imperative. One toilet in each school was inadequate and inadvisable for the number of boys and girls now enrolled.

From our previous experience we shall look forward with much pleasure to working with the parents and board of the district for the advancement of the educational interests of the pupils.
