## Town Meeting Warrant

#### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Wentworth, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in said Wentworth, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for town highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for winter maintenance of town highways, (snow removal and sanding)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction of the Class 2 road known as North Dorchester Road, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$676.50, or will vote to accept State Aid Construction of Class 5 road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$442.83.

- 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
- 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the library, and gymnasium.
- 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the fire engine, and to purchase any new equipment
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$45.20 for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town in co-operation with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region, said appropriation to be disbursed by the Selectmen.
- 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for the white pine blister rust control.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the municipal accounting division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid before July 1st.

- 14. To see what action the Town will take in regard to care and improvement of the Foster Cemetery and raise and appropriate money to pay for same.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 to be used by the Owen B. LaMott Post American Legion, for decorating veteran's graves and aid in the purchase of suitable flag standards.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes if necessary.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

- 8. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of the School District of Wentworth:

The eleventh report of the present superintendent of schools is hereby submitted and makes a part of the Report of the School Board of the School District of Wentworth.

No changes have occurred in the teaching staff of the district since the last report of these series. The total enrollment of the village grammar room has dropped from 47 to 42 this year and the primary room from 49 to 36. At this writing there are actually 41 pupils attending he grammar rooms and 33 pupils in the primary room. This brings the teaching load of the two teachers much nearer normal, particularly in the primary room. At present there are 6 pupils transported from South Wentworth. There are at present 17 children attending the Atwell Hill School, of whom 4 are from Piermont.

It is interesting to note the total enrollments of the district during recent years—87, 92, 97, 99, 107, 118, 122, 125, 120, 112, 118, 98 to date this year. Some years have been inflated by migratory children, particularly last year, but even allowing for a few children domiciled here in recent years by agencies outside of the district, the permanent school population of the district is remaining fairly constant. The records show that during the past 10 years 105 children graduated from the 8th grade and of those 83 or nearly 80% entered high schools. Great credit is due this group,

particularly those who graduated because it means a very full day for all to commute to schools outside the district. Last year there were 29 pupils of the district enrolled in high schools.

The Board has met regularly in 10 meetings. The schools are operating efficiently in my opinion and their high school records show that as a group they are well prepared for secondary school education.
