#### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

ROCKINGHAM, SS.

#### To the Inhabitants of the Town of Auburn in said County qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the hall in the Massabesic Lake Inn in said town on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To bring in your ballots for:

Town clerk for the ensuing year, One selectmen for three years, One selectman for two years, Tax collector for the ensuing year, Town treasurer for the ensuing year, Highway agent for the ensuing year, One library trustee for three years, One cemetery trustee for three years, One trust fund trustee for three years, Three auditors for the ensuing year.

At 12:30 o'clock P. M. the meeting will be open for the following articles

Second. To choose all other necessary town officers.

*Third.* To see if the town will vote to incur debt for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes for the year 1938.

Fourth. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.

*Fifth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$850.00 for town officers' salaries.

Sixth. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for town officers' expenses.

Seventh. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for election and registration.

*Eighth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the expense of the municipal court.

*Ninth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for rent of hall.

*Tenth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for police department.

*Eleventh.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00; \$250.00 for the Auburn Volunteer Firemen's Association for equipment and maintenance, and \$50.00 for forest fire department.

Twelfth. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 for the health department including vital statistics.

*Thirteenth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,225.00; \$1,625.00 for the maintenance of the highway in summer and \$600.00 for snow removal.

*Fourteenth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900.00 for street lights.

*Fiftcenth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Village cemetery.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the library, \$100.00 for the library and \$50.00 for insurance.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 for old age assistance.

*Eighteenth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for Memorial day.

*Nineteenth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for town poor.

*Twentieth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 150.00 for aid of soldiers and their families.

*Twenty-first.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for improving and tarring Reed street.

*Twenty-second.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$503.46 for class V highway (town's share).

Twenty-third. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 300.00 for interest on temporary loans.

*Twenty-fourth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for interest on long term note.

Twenty-fifth. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,512.00 for the state tax of 1938.

*Twenty-sixth.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 2,820.17 for the county tax of 1938.

*Twenty-seventh.* To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to take such legal action as may be necessary to compel the Manchester Water Works to pay the tax on their property as assessed by the selectmen. By petition of thirteen signers.

*Twenty-eighth.* To see if the town will vote to close the Griffin Pike from the school to the end of the road, and also to see if the town will vote to close the Hunting Road from the end of Coffin Lane to Deer Neck Road. By petition of fourteen signers.

*Twenty-ninth.* To see if the town will vote to close a portion of the Sikes Road leading from Bunker Hill, commencing at the William Preston place to Chester line.

*Thirtieth.* To see if the town will vote to install three street lights. One at corner of Chester Road and Bunker Hill Road, one at foot of hill on Chester Road near Mr. Dietz, one at Mr. Burnham's and to raise money for same.

*Thirty-first.* To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300.00 for white pine blister rust control to be spent in co-operation with the state forestry and recreation department.

*Thirty-second.* To see if the town will use the income of the H. B. Burnham Fund for schools or library.

*Thirty-third.* To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.

*Thirty-fourth*. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## **REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS**

#### To the School Board of Auburn:

During the present year three teachers, new to Auburn, have been employed; they have well adapted themselves to the needs of the pupils and have been very helpful in continuing the work of changing the course of study and text books to a more modern basis.

The two other teachers who have been in Auburn for some time are fully deserving of an increase of salary this coming year even though they have reached a maximum that was established several years ago.

It is not true economy in the long run to let superior teachers leave when a moderate increase in compensation will retain them.

It is to be hoped that the five teachers now in service may be retained.

It has not been quite possible to keep the expenditures within the budget estimated. This is not the fault of any school official but is due entirely to an unforeseeable increase in high school attendance.

It is a desirable condition when the public schools of any town are so conducted that pupils and parents become convinced that a high school education is indispensable in present day conditions.
