WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING
TOWN OF BARRINGTON
March 11, 1952

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barrington, County of
Strafford and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote
in town affairs:—*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Barrington on Tuesday the 11th of March A.D. 1952 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote One Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes and two auditors for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To choose all other necessary town officers.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as are necessary for the support of the town poor, and other town charges.

Article 4. To raise State and County taxes.

Article 5. To see what sums of money the town will raise for maintenance of town roads and bridges.

Article 6. To see if the town will raise the sum of \$906.33, the state's share \$6,042.19 for T.R.A.

Article 7. To see if the town will raise \$1,000.00 for the completion of the Waterhouse Road.

Article 8. To see if the town will raise \$400.00 for the Pine Blister Rust.

Article 9. To see if the town will raise \$100.00 for Memorial Day.

Article 10. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow \$5,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.

Article 11. To see if the town will raise \$121.00 for the Lake Region.

This year the downstairs emergency classroom has been enlarged. For the years ahead, the prospect is for some of the classrooms to be close to 40 pupils, with one next year having 43. Another classroom and a sixth teacher would relieve this overcrowded condition. As the city high schools become full on account of natural growth and possible defense activities, the tuition sending districts in the area may be constrained to build a cooperative high school in order to find accommodations. Some districts in the area

are also without any elementary schools, while the facilities in others are inadequate. A cooperative district using the combined resources of several towns would doubtless continue to use local school plants that are modern and efficient, while providing additional arrangements to meet the needs. Such a cooperative district might include Durham, Lee, Madbury, and possibly Nottingham and Barrington. Any new facilities would be located conveniently to the area as a whole. The first step in such a plan would be for the district to petition the State Board of Education to lay out a cooperative district, subject to its later acceptance by the voters in each district.

The state aid this year is \$7,089.82, as against \$2,518.82 last year, making possible a decrease in the assessment for this year. High school tuition is the principal increasing cost item.

Last spring our teachers participated in the local Red Cross standard First-Aid class, in response to an urgent request from the state Civil Defense authorities. In April a Hobby Show was conducted with the help of the Parent-Teacher Association. Art productions of the pupils furnished decorations for the event. A health round-up of pre-school children was designed to assure their good physical condition for school entrance. The lunch program seems to be firmly organized and efficiently carried on by the joint efforts of the school board, P.T.A. and teachers, in spite of rising prices. The thanks of the district are due to those who carry on the business affairs of the project, as well as to those who willingly volunteer for service in food preparation.

The regular classroom work calls for constant ingenuity on the part of the teachers to keep their sizeable groups interested in profitable work suited to individual needs and abilities, while the special programs at Christmas, graduation, and other observances furnish extra incentive for unusual efforts.

The Fire Department responded to twenty-one calls for the year 1950 to 1951. Ten of these were chimney fires, five brush, two house and one barn fire, one car, one house trailer and one response to investigate a suspected arson setup.

One house trailer, one barn and one automobile were complete losses.

The interior of the Fire House was painted and an area around the outside cleared of brush and grade. A gas hot plate was also installed.

In the near future a campaign will be started to replace the present tank truck chassis.
