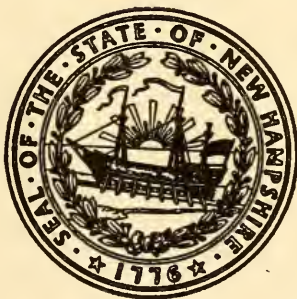

# TOWN WARRANT

(L. S.)

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow necessary sums of money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the activities of the Eastern Slope Region, Inc., for the year 1950.
7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$118.00, based on one hundredth of one

per cent of the assessed valuation, to be paid as its share of the expense of carrying on advertising and other beneficial programs for the section of the State known as the White Mountain Region of which this town is a part, in cooperation with the State of New Hampshire and other towns in said region to be paid by the selectmen to the treasurer of the White Mountains Region.

8. To see if the Town will vote to require the Selectmen to have printed in the annual Town Reports, an itemized report of all Town Expenditures, agreeable to a petition signed by F. E. Cote and others.

9. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of the highway, from Stanton's to the Ski Lodge.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

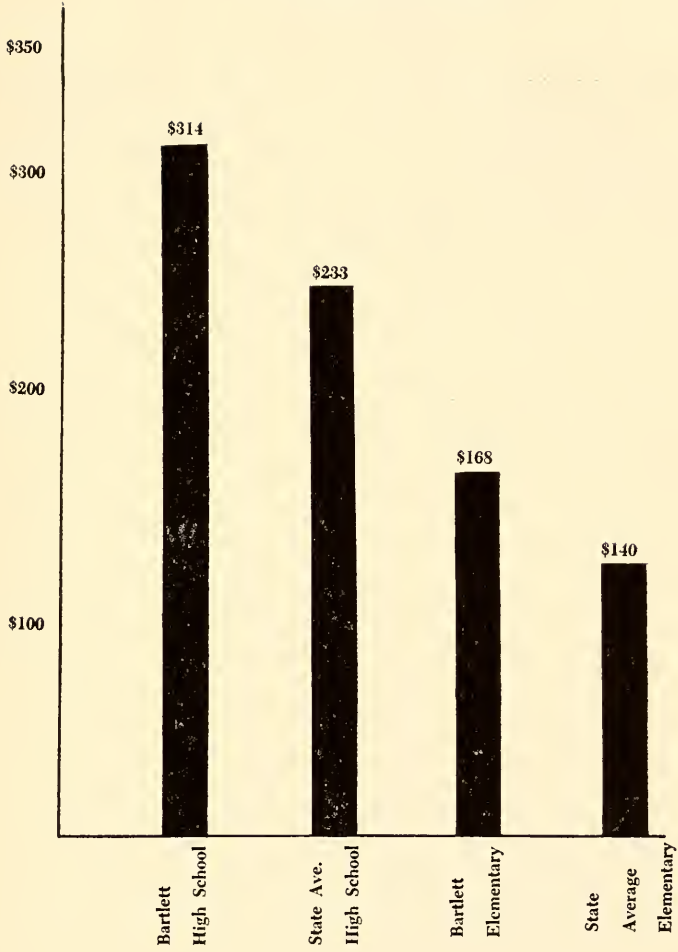

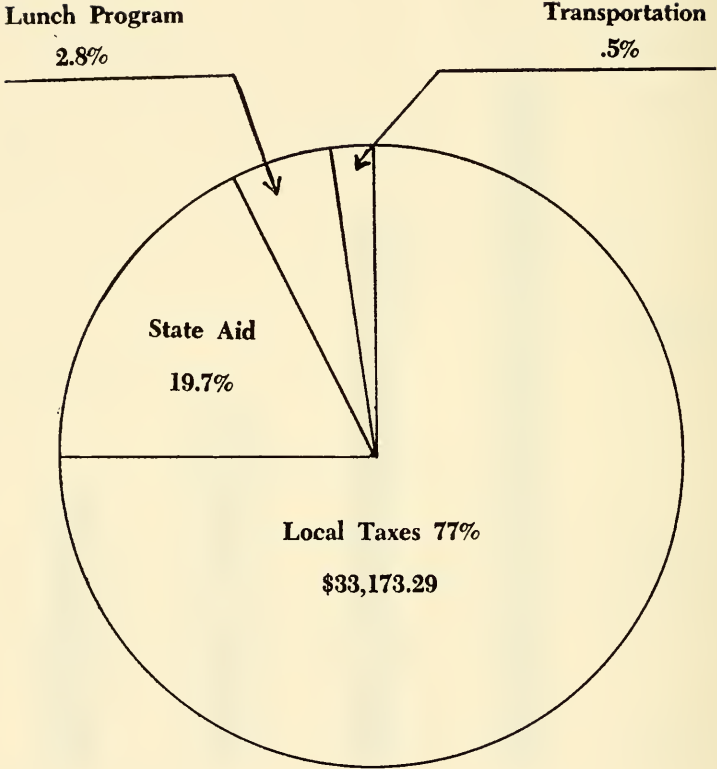

PER PUPIL COST—1948-49

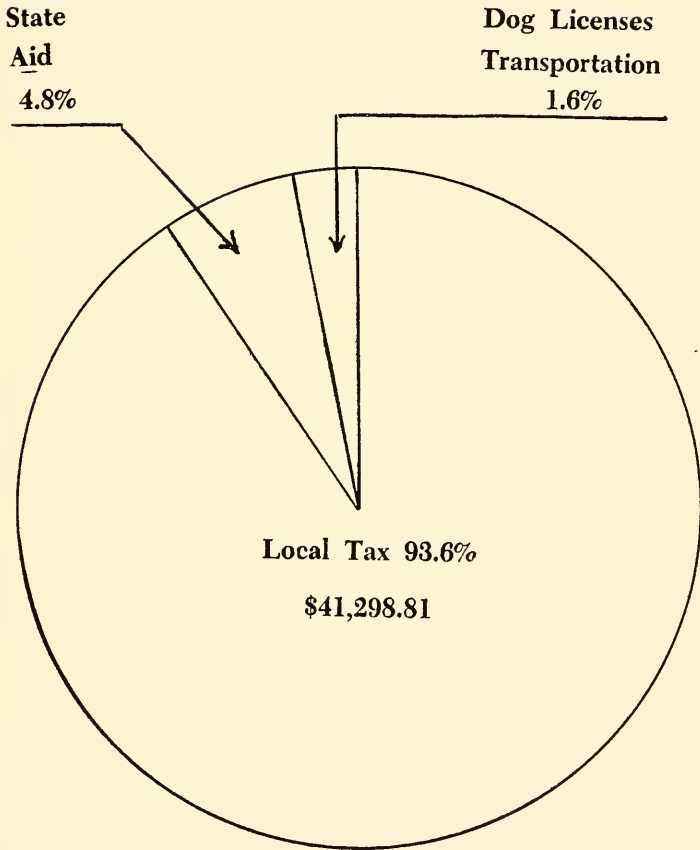


**DISTRICT INCOME—1948-49**

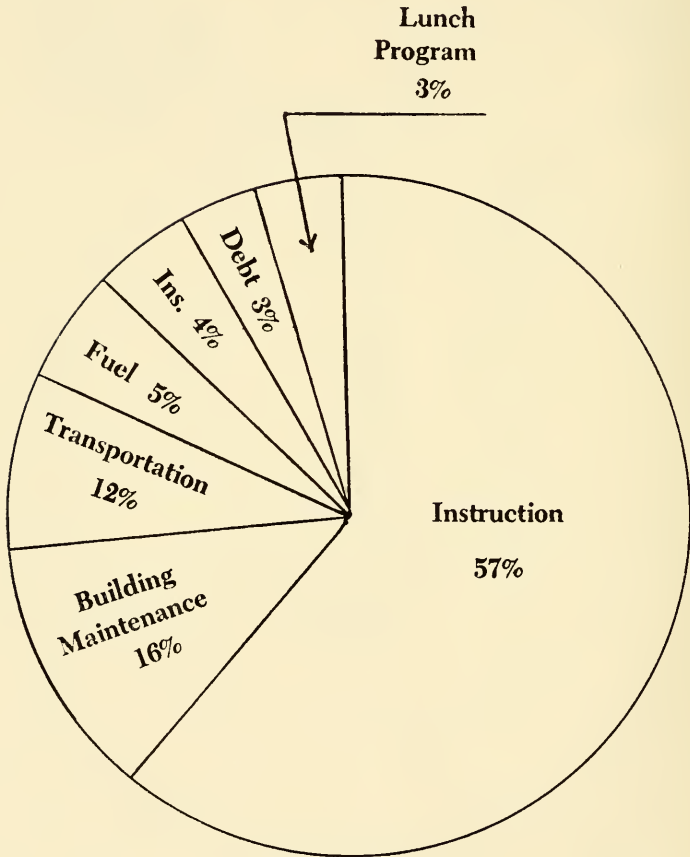




**DISTRICT INCOME—1949-50**

# Report of Superintendent

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*To the School Board and Citizens of Bartlett:*

The loss of \$6,572.46 in State Aid was a serious blow to the Bartlett property taxpayers. The people of the District assumed the burden, and are to be commended for their willingness to support their schools. The failure of the State Legislators to assess a broad tax, collected by the State and returned to the local districts, to relieve the property taxpayers from increased taxes seems to me to be a serious mistake. The increased number of pupils and school costs, as well as greater school responsibility for pupil instruction necessitates, so many feel, a fairer tax.

The P.T.A. sponsors the lunch programs which benefit many pupils. The average number of meals served for December, 1949, for the three schools was 127 per day. Foods such as potatoes, cheese, butter, apples, etc. are sent to the district from the Federal Government's Department of Agriculture. The P.T.A. raises sufficient money to pay the cost not covered by the pupils' payments for the meals and the Federal Government's 9c per meal.

Mrs. Bertha James and Mrs. Lucille Garland have attended an extension course in reading which was made possible by the Plymouth Teachers' College.

The sincere interest, effort and co-operation of the School Board, teachers, and citizens is appreciated, and my thanks are extended to everyone who has helped the schools.
