TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitant of the Town of Benton qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Building in said Benton on the second Tuesday of March next (the 8th) at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to vote and act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk; one Selectman for three years, James J. Page being the outgoing member; one Tax Collector; one Town Treasurer; one Highway Agent; one Auditor; one Trustee of the Trust Funds, Forrest E. Clark being the outgoing member; one Library Trustee, Lulu M. Clark being the outgoing member; and all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To hear the reports of officers and agents heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise \$220.00 for repairs to the basement of the Community Building.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise \$13.75 for the White Mountains Region Association, being 10ϕ per \$1,000 of assessed valuation of the town for the previous year, for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other towns of the region.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$70.28 as the town's share for construction of highways (Town Road Aid.)

- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to make any alterations in the amount of money required to be raised and appropriated for the ensuing year as recommended in the budget, and to raise and appropriate all sums so determined.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize a discount of 2 percent on taxes paid before a date authorized by the selectmen.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to dispense with delivery of inventory blanks until April 1st.
- Article 10. To see if the town will vote to observe Memorial Day the same as in past years.
- Article 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the playing of beano in said town.
- Article 12. The town meeting warrant shall remain open for articles to be inserted by the selectmen until posting date.
- Article 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Benton:

I herewith submit my twelfth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment of the School in 1953-54 was 13, the average membership 11.9, and the percent of attendance 96.3. There were 12 pupils enrolled in other districts; one pupil attended high school and three pupils attended the elementary school at Haverhill. Seven elementary pupils attended school at Warren, and one high school student attended Woodsville.

At the Benton Street School this year the total enrollment is 10. There is one pupil attending the elementary school at Pike. Six elementary pupils are attending school at Warren and three high school students attending Woodsville.

Mrs. Sarah Shute, teacher at Benton for the past two years, resigned in June to accept a single grade position in Lancaster. She was replaced by Miss Faye Dexter who resigned at Thanksgiving recess.

Fortunately we were able to secure Mrs. Christie Jamieson as a teacher. The school is making excellent progress under her direction.

The main room, halls and toilets were painted. They look very well. We recommend painting the outside of the building this summer.

Visitors are always welcome at Benton School.

My appreciation to the community and School Board for its continued support.
