### REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

In submitting this, our annual school report of the progress made in our schools during the past year, it gives us pleasure to be able to say that good work has been accomplished.

Perhaps one of the most important steps for the improvement of our schools has been the exchange of our long used text-books for a new supply that seems to be well suited to our wants. We do believe that our text-books, with the exception of our arithmetics, will compare favorably with those of surrounding towns.

With two exceptions, experienced teachers have been employed. Where satisfaction was given in the spring term the same teachers were re-engaged for the fall term, if possible, as we think when a teacher has learned the disposition and capacities of pupils that better results are obtained.

Experienced and well qualified teachers are not pleased with the small schools and small salary offered them, for they can do better elsewhere; consequently we are obliged to hire the inexperienced.

We maintained six schools last spring and seven last fall. We have given each pupil twenty-eight weeks of schooling, excepting Bow Mills school, which had only twenty-seven, on account of the parents not being willing to board the teacher.

Owing to the small number of pupils in the Bog district last spring it was thought advisable to have them carried to the Wood Hill school, making that larger and more interesting, and save the expense of another school.

Our school registers show too many tardy and absent marks. If all the parents felt a more lively interest in the education of their children, and would insist upon having them attend school regularly, and would visit the school more often, it would inspire the children and teacher with more courage and add essentially to the interest of the schools.

Our school houses are now in good repair, with the exception of the one at the Bog, which is in a very bad condition, and should be repaired before another term.

We desire to thank the people of the town for their uniform kindness to us in the discharge of our duties, and especially those who interested themselves enough to visit the schools on examination days, and on other occasions.

### Bow Mills.

The school for the entire year was taught by Miss Florence N. Adams of Manchester. Miss Adams is a teacher of experience and labored faithfully for the good of the school. She succeeded in gaining the good will of both parents and pupils, and the examinations were very good. The pupils expressed a desire that she might be their teacher for the next term.

### NORTH BOW.

The spring term was taught by Miss Jennie M. Scales of Hopkinton, who is considered a fine teacher.

The school was broken up by the whooping cough, but those who were able to attend school made good improvement.

Fall term was taught by Miss Clara Ballard of Concord. This was Miss Ballard's first term, yet the school made good improvement under her instruction.

### WOOD HILL.

Summer term taught by Mr. Edwin A. Colby. Mr. Colby is a teacher of much experience, and labored hard for the advancement of his school. There being very few

pupils at the Bog the school board formed a union of the two schools for this term only.

For the remainder of the year the school was under the charge of Miss Emma A. Root of Goffstown. This was Miss Root's first experience in teaching, and her success was very commendable. The closing examination would have done credit to a much more experienced teacher.

### RIVER ROAD.

This school was taught for the entire year by Nellie J. Bloomfield of this town, with her usual success. The winter term was somewhat interrupted by sickness, but nevertheless it has been a very profitable year.

### WHITE.

This school has been under the instruction of Mrs. Ida L. Dow of this town, a wide awake, energetic teacher, well adapted to the wants of a school, both as to instruction and discipline. The examination showed that her school had been trained to the habits of study.

### South Bow.

Willie F. Davis had charge of this school, and fully sustained his former reputation as a successful teacher. This has been his third year of service in this district, which has been satisfactory to both parents and scholars.

### Bog.

Only one term of school has been maintained in this district during the past year, owing to the small number of pupils, who were carried to another school for the spring term.

The fall term has been under the care of Edwin A. Colby, who has taught so many years in town that it seems unnecessary to mention his merit as a teacher.
