Warrant for Annual Meeting

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookline, County of Hillsborough and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town and State affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Daniels Academy Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday, March 13th, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects and any other business that may legally come before said meeting:

- 1. To choose all Town Officers for ensuing year.
- 2. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and all other Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating to same.
- 3. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of State Aid Highway or take any action relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of the Highways under the law passed at

January session of 1905, and to say where such shall be laid out or take any action in regard to same.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to complete the State road from Milford to Townsend, providing the State will pay their half, or take any action relating thereto.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to insure Daniels Academy Building or take any action in regard to same.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to build a cement dam, for fire protection, on brook near Frank Austin's or take any action in regard to same.
- 12. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to allow any discount on property taxes paid before December 1, 1928, or take any action in regard to same.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200 to help exterminate the White Pine Blister or take any action in regard to same.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for purpose of purchasing any forest land, choose a forestry committee, or take any action in regard to same.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to have a night patrolman, raise and appropriate money for same, or take any action relative thereto.
- 17. To see if the Town will take any action in regard to plowing snow from roads to make same passable for automobiles, and if so, to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for use of clinic, or take any action in regard to same.

- 19. To see if the Town will vote to allow Carrie L. Jackson anything for use of driveway while bridge was up on account of flood or take any action in regard to same.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and rebuild the sidewalk on Mason street opposite J. C. Barnaby's stable, raise or appropriate money for same, or take any action relative thereto.
- 21. To see if the Town will accept \$100 from the estate of Thomas W. Storer, and \$100 from O. D. Fessenden for perpetual care of the Fessenden and Storer lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.
- 22. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen to distribute resident inventory blanks when assessing April 1st, instead of mailing same.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for purpose of inducing a doctor to locate in the Town or take any action in regard to same.
- 24. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money to observe Old Home Day or take any action in regard to same.
- 25. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money to have the 1927 valuation printed or take any action relative thereto.

Children's Health Conference

The second annual conference for babies and children of pre-school age conducted by the New Hampshire State Board of Health, Division of Child Hygiene, was held on August tenth in the Legion Building. This conference was sponsored by the Auxiliary of the Frank E. Kilduff Post 74, American Legion, and the South Brookline Social Club.

Sixty-three children were weighed, measured and examined by Dr. George Hazard of Hollis, N. H., and Dr. Franklin Rogers, child specialist of Manchester, N. H.

The conference was under the direction of Miss Mary G. Hurley assisted by Miss Eunice Hardy of the State Board Nursing Staff.

The following is a synopsis of the examinations:

The defects found are as follows: Enlarged Tonsils 7; Infected Tonsils 4; Enlarged Glands 1; Nasal Obstruction 1; Defective Teeth 7; Tongue-tie 1; Anaemia 1; Phimosis 15; Orthopedic defects 9; Hernia 3; Strabismus 4; Underweight 4; Poor Posture 6.

Twenty-one children were vaccinated by Dr. Weaver of the State Board of Health. Of this number nineteen vaccinations were successful. Through the co-operation of Mrs. Mary Davis, Director of the Division of Child Hygiene, a dental clinic was held in the Reading Room of Daniels Academy by Dr. G. Arthur Danforth of Manchester, N. H., clinician for the State Board of Education. All of the children's teeth were examined and an estimate of the cost of the necessary work sent to each parent. The following amount of work was accomplished among our pre-school and school children:

Health conferences for children of pre-school age have clearly demonstrated that yearly physical examinations are one of the most effective ways of bringing about the desired results. At our conference in 1926 we had five (5) normal children. At the conference in 1927 we had twenty-two (22) normal children. The health educational value of the examination and instruction given at this time toparents is a practical demonstration of preventive work.

An itemized account of the expenditure of the \$100 appropriated by the town for Clinic Work has been given to the Selectmen.
