

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County of Carroll in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, and vote their compensations.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 2% discount on all property taxes paid inside of thirty days from the receipt of tax bill.

Art. 4. To see what action the Town will take upon the budget as submitted by the budget committee.

Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to close the Robins Hill Road from the Langdon Brook Bridge to the land of Lindsey H. Parker subject to gates and bars.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to sell the old town derrick and if so to appoint a committee to do so.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to require all persons to secure a fire permit in said Town before kindling an outdoor fire, except when the ground is substantially covered with snow. This article is submitted in accordance with N. H. forest laws.

Art. 8. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
