TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chesterfield in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chesterfield on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to six o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To vote by Australian ballot for all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to assessors.

Article 3. To determine the method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the taxes for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,805.00 for town officers' salaries, or act thereon.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$750.00, for Town officers' expenses, or act thereon.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600.00 for election and registration expenses, or act thereon.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for expenses of Town Hall and other Town buildings.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for forest fire expenses.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600.00, at least \$200.00 of which will be used for patrol of non-resident property, for the police department.

Article 12. To vote to see if the Town will raise the sum of \$700.00 for the support of the fire departments.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$250.00 for the support of the Board of Health.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,200.00 for the repair and upkeep of highway equipment.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$7,500.00 for Town road maintenance, reserving at least \$600.00 of the same for construction of standard road railings.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,600.00 for street lighting.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 for snow removal.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$828.55, thereby receiving an additional \$3,314.20 from the State for Town Road Aid (T. R. A.), or act thereon.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the support of the Town library system.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the support of the Town poor.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,200.00 for Old Age Assistance.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$15.00 for Memorial Day Exercises.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 in addition to balance in Savings Bank for the observance of Old Home Day and appoint committee for taking charge of same.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for parks and playgrounds.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the support of the Town Beach.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$350.00 for the support of the cemeteries.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$144.00 as the Town's share in participating in the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for legal expenses.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$110.00 for the interest on temporary loans.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting or act thereon.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$750.00 for enlarging and repairing the kitchen and dining room in the annex to the Town Hall.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for the construction of a water hole to give center Chesterfield added fire protection, the planning and development of this project to be left in the hands of the fire wards.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to have one road agent appointed by the Selectmen.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to have the moderator appoint a committee of five to locate sites of historic interest in the township, the committee to serve without expense to the Town, and report its findings to

the regular Town Meeting of 1947 with recommendations for such marking as may be determined.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$150.00 from Charles D. York, the income from same to be used for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Charles D. York burial lot in Spofford Cemetery and to be known as the Charles D. York Trust Fund.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$150.00 from Reuben W. Brown, the income from the same to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association, for the perpetual care of the William H. and Reuben W. Brown lot in the Chesterfield West Cemetery, and to be known as the Reuben W. and Leila S. Brown Trust Fund.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Newton E. Darling and George S. White, the income from same to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Assn., and used for the perpetual care of the Newton H. Darling and Edson W. White lot and to be known as the Newton H. Darling and Edson W. White Trust Fund.

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Clarence K. Lewis, the income from the same to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Assn., for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Clarence K. Lewis lot in said cemetery and to be known as the Clarence K. Lewis Trust Fund.

Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Edith Libel, the income to be paid to the Spofford Cemetery Assn., for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Lyman Howe and Lydia Gould lot in said cemetery and to be known as the Lyman Howe and Lydia Gould Trust Fund.

Article 40. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

TOWN MEETING, MARCH 1945

Proceedings of the Annual Meeting of the voters of the Town of Chesterfield called at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, March 13, 1945.

The meeting was called to order at 9:20 A. M. by the Moderator, Lee D. Bowman, and the Warrant through Article I read by the Clerk. Voted by voice vote on motion made and supported to vote by Australian Ballot. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on motion made and supported to recess until 10 o'clock. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Charles Alden took the oath of office as Ballot Clerk.

At ten o'clock the meeting was again called to order and the Articles of the Warrant disposed of as follows:—

Article 2. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Penning and supported by Floyd Fuller that the Selectmen act as Assessors. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Walter Post and supported by Frank Hubner that the taxes be collected as in previous years. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Walter Post and supported by Charles T. Alden to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, for the ensuing year. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. The Report of the Budget Committee was given by the Chairman, Chester M. Burnham. He stated that for the last ten years the tax rate had varied from

\$2.30 to \$3.14, averaging about \$2.70. With the amount of surplus on hand and with last year's valuation this average rate can be maintained with the figures recommended by the Committee in its report on Page 52 of the Annual Report. With a tax rate of \$2.80 the Selectmen could be allowed a little more than spent last year and that would allow a safe margin for overlay. No questions were asked him. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul M. Penning and supported by Winston Cray to accept the report as given. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 6. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Floyd Fuller and supported by Sue Morris to raise the sum of \$1,605.00 for town officers' salaries. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 7. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Walter Post and supported by Robert Mitchell to raise the sum of \$750.00 for town officers' expenses. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Grace Welcome and supported by Walter Post to raise the sum of \$500.00 for election and registration expenses. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Jessie M. B. Joslin to raise the sum of \$250.00 for town hall expenses. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 10. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Wilder Haskell and supported by Robert Mitchell to raise the sum of \$500.00 for Forest fire expenses. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 11. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Jessie Joslin to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the police department. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 12. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Mitchell and supported by Charles Olden to raise the sum of \$700.00 for the support of the fire department. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 13. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding which was supported to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the control of white pine blister rust in co-operation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual state aid. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 14. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Grace Kearney and supported by Rachel Bowman to raise the sum of \$250.00 for the support of the board of health. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 15. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding and supported by George Joslin to raise the sum of \$1,500.00 for the repair and upkeep of highway equipment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 16. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Penning and supported by Winston Cray to raise the sum of \$6,000.00 for town road maintenance. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 17. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Walter Post and supported by John Redding to amend the article and raise the sum of \$3,500.00 for snow removal. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 18. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding and supported by Floyd Fuller to raise the sum of \$1,800.00 for street lighting. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 19. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding and supported by Clifford Chickering to ac-

cept town road aid (T. R. A.) for the ensuing year and raise the sum of \$746.06 for same. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 20. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Susie Morris and supported by Winston Cray to raise the sum of \$500.00 for the support of the town library system. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 21. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Grace Kearney and supported by Susie Morris to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the support of the town poor. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 22. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Martha Cray to raise the sum of \$1,200.00 for old age assistance. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 23. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding and supported by George Joslin to raise the sum of \$15.00 for Memorial Day exercises. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 24. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Walter Post and supported by Arthur Post to instruct the selectmen to erect a temporary Honor Roll, to be placed on the common, not to exceed \$100.00 and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for same. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 25. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding and supported by Paul Welcome to raise the sum of \$50.00 for parks and playgrounds. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 26. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Grace Welcome which was supported to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the support of the town beach. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 27. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Chester Burnham which was supported to raise the sum of \$300.00 for the support of the cemeteries. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 28. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Penning and supported by Paul Welcome to raise the sum of \$140.00 as the town's share in participating in the Monadnock Region. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 29. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding and supported by Charles Alden to raise the sum of \$100.00 for legal expenses. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 30. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding which was supported to raise the sum of \$115.00 for interest on temporary notes. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 31. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Penning and supported by Chester Burnham to amend the article to read "Highway equipment" instead of "Snow removal". Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Penning and supported by Roger Spaulding to amend the article and raise \$8,000.00 instead of \$9,000.00. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Penning which was supported to go back to the article as read and to raise the sum of \$9,000.00 to purchase snow removal equipment to be housed in the central part of the town and instruct the Moderator to appoint a committee of three to work with the Selectmen in the purchase of such equipment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. The Committee as appointed by the Moderator was 1st. Paul M. Penning, 2nd. Chester M. Burnham, and 3rd. Walter J. Post.

Article 32. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Chester M. Burnham which was supported to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 to provide housing for equipment mentioned in preceding article. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 33. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Watts and supported by Mary Bernstein to install a street light near the house of Santo Licari in the center village and raise money therefore. The Moderator declared that the no's had it.

Article 34. Voted by voice vote on motion made by John Redding and supported by Charles Alden to pass over the article which concerned having an audit made by the state division of municipal accounting. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 35. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Walter Post and supported by Clarence Foley to pass over the article concerning discontinuing certain specified roads in Spofford. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 36. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Chester Burnham and supported by Walter Post to amend the article and close the whole road. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on motion made and supported to close the whole road or roads as follows:

A. Route 105 as numbered by the State Highway Department extending from a stake driven in the center of said road four hundred feet northerly of the Winchester Town Line, and easterly of Fullam Pond, and thence to the junction of 105 with Route 80.

B. The whole of route 110 as numbered by the State Highway Department extending from its intersection with Route 105 to Route 106.

C. The whole of Route 106 extending from the Winchester Town Line northerly to its intersection with Route 80.

D. Route 108 extending from its intersection with Route 106 to Route 107.

E. Route 109 extending from its intersection with Route 106 to Route 107.

Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 37. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Lyle B. Chickering and supported by George Joslin to accept the sum of \$100.00 from F. Arthur Stoddard and Myrtie E. Burnham, the income from the same to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Fred H. Stoddard lot in the Chesterfield West Cemetery and to be known as the Fred H. Stoddard Trust Fund. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 38. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George E. Joslin and supported by Chester M. Burnham to accept the sum of \$333.33 from Nettie D. Snow, to be known as the Nettie D. Snow Trust Fund, the income to be paid to the Chesterfield West Cemetery Association for the perpetual care and maintenance of the John F. Snow lots No. 141-142 and the Herbert H. Snow lots No. 303 and 304. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 39. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Chester M. Burnham and supported by George E. Joslin to buy the bank shares of the Brattleboro Trust Co., now held by the Trustees of Trust Funds and raise the sum of \$40.00 to pay for same. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 40. Mrs. Helen S. Polhemus gave a clear enlightening explanation of the Dumbarton Oaks Conference. Voted on motion made by Walter Post and supported by Paul Penning to support United States membership in a general system of international co-operation such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks Conference, having power to maintain the peace of the world. Vote de-

clared by the Moderator to be carried unanimously in the affirmative.

Article 41. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Walter Post and supported by Paul Penning to adopt the following resolution:

“RESOLVED that it is the sentiment of this meeting that we favor the building and operation on Mount Monadnock of a frequency Modulation Radio Station. Vote declared by the Moderator to be unanimously carried in the affirmative.

No. further business appearing it was voted to adjourn the meeting except for casting ballots by Australian Ballot under Article 1.

Article 1. A count of ballots cast resulted as follows:

For Town Clerk. Imogene L. Chickering had 183 votes and Paul M. Penning had 1 vote. Imogene L. Chickering was declared elected.

For Selectman. Clifford E. Chickering had 133 votes, Paul E. Welcome had 62 votes. Clifford E. Chickering was declared elected.

For Town Treasurer. Ada Allen had 1 vote, Grace M. Kearney had 16 votes, Virginia B. Parker had 35 votes and Alice L. Spaulding had 140 votes. Alice L. Spaulding was declared elected.

For Tax Collector. Harry E. Winn had 185 votes and was declared elected.

For Spofford Road Agent. Walter J. Post had 166 votes and George E. Joslin had 4 votes. Walter J. Post was declared elected.

For Center Road Agent. Roger C. Spaulding had 159 votes, Frank Hubner had 6 votes, Olin Butler had 1 vote, Henry Chickering had 1 vote, Donald Porter had 1 vote. Roger C. Spaulding was declared elected.

For West Chesterfield Road Agent. Gerald R. Turner had 146 votes, Lyle Chickering had 5 votes, Clifford Chickering had 4 votes, Paul Welcome had 2 votes, Henry Plante had 1 vote, Fred Stoddard had 1 vote, C. M. Burnham had 1 vote, Clinton Davis had 1 vote. Gerald R. Turner was declared elected.

For Fireward. Walter Post had 6 votes, Clarence K. Lewis had 7 votes, George Joslin had 1 vote, Frank Morrison had 1 vote, Winston Cray had 8 votes, Paul Welcome had 3 votes, Arthur Post had 2 votes, Paul Penning had 2 votes, William R. Gallagher had 1 vote, R. C. Chickering had 1 vote, Roger Spaulding had 1 vote, Henry Chickering had 1 vote, George Joslin had 1 vote, Lyle B. Chickering had 1 vote, Fred Stoddard had 1 vote, Frank B. Fowke had 1 vote. Because of the fact that Winston Cray was already a member of the Board of Firewards, Clarence K. Lewis was declared elected.

For Auditors. Harold E. Randall had 171 votes, Clara B. Wellington had 133 votes, Harriet Dutton had 3 votes, Thomas Kearney had 2 votes, Daniel Schlichting had 2 votes, Virginia Parker had 2 votes, Ruth Berry had 2 votes, Ralph Dutton had 2 votes, Rachel Bowman had 1 vote, Charles T. Alden had 1 vote, Katherine Post had 1 vote, Lee Bowman had 1 vote, Arthur Post had 1 vote and Fred Partridge had 1 vote. Harold E. Randall and Clara B. Wellington were declared elected.

For Budget Committee, Center. Paul M. Penning had 13 votes, Chester M. Burnham had 7 votes, Henry C. Chickering had 4 votes, Ralph F. Dutton had 4 votes, Lee D. Bowman had 3 votes, Mrs. Farrington had 2 votes, Clara Wellington had 2 votes, Roger Spaulding had 2 votes, Clifford Chickering had 2 votes, Mrs. Penning, Thomas Kearney, George Eager, Carl Castle, Wallace Record, John Mansley, George Joslin, Henry Plante, Anna C. Hubner, D. Homer Cray, William Nurse, Walter Post, Fred Humphrey, Donald Porter, Virginia Parker, Grace Kearney, Clifford Tuttle, Paul Welcome, Imogene Chickering, Robert Goodrich, Wilder Haskell, Phyllis Henchey, Maurice Amidon,

C. K. Lewis, Richard Chickering, Alice Spaulding, Winston Cray, and William Gallagher each had one vote. Paul M. Penning being Postmaster, could not accept the office. Chester M. Burnham was already considered a member of the Committee. Therefore Ralph Dutton and Lee D. Bowman were declared elected and Lee D. Bowman took the oath of office. Later when the names on the three papers were assembled into one it was found that Henry Chickering had more votes than Lee D. Bowman.

For Trustee of Trust Funds. Mary R. Webb had 173 votes, Rachel D. Bowman had 1 vote. Mary R. Webb was declared elected.

For Sexton. George E. Joslin had 15 votes, Clinton Davis had 5 votes, Lyle B. Chickering had 3 votes, Frank Whorfe had 2 votes, Henry Chickering had 2 votes, Wilder Haskell had 1 vote, Winston Cray had 1 vote, Leon Smith had 1 vote, William Nurse had 1 vote, George Goodridge had 1 vote, Byron Davis had 1 vote, Paul Penning had 1 vote, Walter J. Post had 1 vote. George E. Joslin was declared elected.

For Spofford Constable. Nelson H. Ball had 157 votes, William Pierce had 2 votes, Clifford Tuttle had 1 vote. Nelson H. Ball was declared elected.

About 100 books have been purchased for the library during 1945. Of these some 35 were marked gift of Etta Hubbard Fund as they were purchased with the interest from that fund.

For the year 1945 the total circulation for the central library was 3,337 volumes.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH

In the past year the Town had several cases of Scarlet Fever which were mostly mild cases.

We were able in all cases to isolate the patient and quarantine the houses and let the head of the family keep on with his work and in only one case was the disease spread. This was a boy going to school and did not know that he had the scarlet fever. When children are not well their parents should keep them from school until their sickness is diagnosed by a doctor. Report all suspicious cases to your health officer and he will assist you in any way possible. Call Brattleboro 255-W-2 and reverse the charges.

We had some complaints about odors caused by dead animals being dragged into the woods and not buried.

The Town Beach so-called was in charge of the late Nelson H. Ball and was kept in a satisfactory condition. The other parts of the Lake Shore were supervised by Frank Whorfe who also attends to the garbage and the public dump.

Seventeen milk licenses were issued for the sale of milk and cream, eight of which were issued to buy and sell milk and cream at two dollars each as follows: Paul Penning, Henry Chickering, William Manch, Harry Nosek, Clifford Tuttle, John Redding, Woodrow F. Shaw and Brattleboro Milk plant.

Several samples of water were sent to Concord for analysis, none proved dangerous enough to condemn.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Chesterfield:

I herein submit my third annual report as superintendent of schools.

The fundamental purpose of the American Constitution, as defined in the preamble, "to promote the general welfare", places heavy responsibilities on all institutions for public education. Now that we have plunged into the Atomic Era a higher level of universal education is imperative.

"The men and women in uniform are coming home having finished the gigantic job of making human freedom possible. Victory in the war against ignorance necessitates another great invasion in which the penalties of failure are as grave as that of a military disaster. The knowledge, the skills and the understandings gained by our young people in the next few years will determine whether this country can or will solve the difficult social, economic, and political problems that make peace possible. The implications of all of this are very clear. The teachers have a key position in the most essential business of all. These commandoes of the peace must be well trained and equipped if their mission of 'the general welfare' is to be accomplished."

At the White House Conference on Rural Education in 1944 some interesting facts were revealed. Although the rural children of school age constitute more than half of such children in the nation they have only 38 percent of the available funds for the support of schools. The number of high school graduates is about fifty percent higher in urban schools. The per pupil investment in equipment and property is lower in rural areas but the per pupil daily cost is greater than in urban areas. This idea of contributing more and receiving less indicates the need for re-

organization based on a careful consideration of educational trends. The boys and girls living in rural areas must be prepared to compete with their city neighbors.

The teacher shortage is at present our most serious problem. The small community without an experienced resident teacher faces a critical situation. Something more must be done to make well qualified teachers available in rural areas. This implies many factors. The support of the taxpayer is not the only essential for good schools.

**SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING OF THE TOWN OF
CHESTERFIELD, N. H.**

Town Hall, March 13, 1945

The meeting was called to order at 2 p. m. by Moderator pro tem, Lee D. Bowman, as the Moderator, Harold E. Randall, could not be present. The warrant was read by Mrs. Polhemus, substituting for Clerk, Rev. Oscar M. Polhemus, who is serving with the U. S. Armed Forces.

Disposition of the articles of the warrant was as follows:

Art. 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.

The motion was made, supported, and carried that Daniel P. Schlichting be chosen moderator by the casting of one ballot by the clerk. Mrs. Imogene Chickering gave him the oath of office.

Art. 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.

Mrs. Polhemus was nominated and declined. A motion was made, supported, and carried that Grace Welcome be nominated as clerk. Mrs. Welcome was elected and took oath of office from the moderator.

Art. 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing 3 years.

Mrs. Anna C. Hubner and Mr. Lee Bowman were nominated. A paper ballot was taken with 92 votes cast making 47 votes necessary for choice. Anna C. Hubner received 44 votes; Mrs. Hubner, 1 vote; Lee Bowman, 45 votes; Bowman, 1 vote, and 1 ballot was blank. A second paper ballot was taken with 100 votes cast making 51 votes necessary for choice. Lee Bowman received 51 votes; Anna C. Hubner, 47 votes; A. Hubner, 1 vote; L. Bowman, 1 vote. Lee Bowman was declared elected and took oath of office from moderator.

Art. 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

Evelyn L. Winn was nominated and on motion made, supported, and carried, the clerk cast one vote for Mrs. Winn who was declared elected and received oath of office from moderator.

Art. 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the District.

On motion made by Mrs. Agnes B. Chickering, duly supported and carried, this article was passed over leaving salaries as they are.

Art. 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditor, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto. The committee (Mrs. Hubner, Mrs. George Joslin, Mrs. P. Welcome) reported on the consolidated school as a post war project. Lee Bowman moved that the meeting accept the report made and that the committee remain intact until such time as the town can take definite action on the project. Motion was duly supported and carried.

Art. 7. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in the warrant.

A motion was made, supported, and carried that the town auditors act as the auditors for the school district.

Art. 8. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.

The motion was made and supported and carried that the Town of Chesterfield raise the sum of \$15,555.53 requested in the School Board estimate for the support of schools for the year beginning July 1, 1945.

Art. 9. To see if the district will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Mu-

nicipal Accounting Division, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Passed over this article.

Art. 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Mrs. Jessie Farrington suggested that the School Board meet in Selectmen's room of Town Hall where townspeople would feel free to attend meetings and voice opinions. Mrs. Agnes Chickering reported she had already made plans to hold meetings in Selectmen's room.

There being no further business, it was moved, supported, and carried that the meeting adjourn at 3 p. m.
