# Warrant for Town Meeting

### L. S. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
- 3 To see if the town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.
- 4 To elect a member of the Board of Trustees of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.
- 5 To elect a member of the Library Trustees for the ensuing three years.
- 6 To see if the town will allow a discount of three per cent upon all property taxes paid on or before July 30, 1933.
- 7 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended in proper observance of Old Home Day.
- 8 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 9 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of 1-4 of 1 per cent as required by law.
- 10 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments along the highway.

11 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$705.00 for State Aid Construction thereby obtaining State Aid of \$1,410.00.

12 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to be expended in control of White Pine Blister Rust in co-operation with the State Forestry department.

13 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$20.00 for the purpose of purchasing four cemetery lots at Grafton Center for burial of the poor deceased.

14 To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.

15 To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy as a trust fund of \$50.00, the income thereof to be used for the care of the Mary E. Gifford cemetery lot at Gratton Center.

16 To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy as a trust fund of \$200.00, the income thereof to be used for the care of the Charles F. Kilton cemetery lot at Grafton Center.

17 To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy as a trust fund of \$25,000.00, the income thereof to be used to secure a resident practising physician.

18 To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

### Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Members of the School Board, Grafton, N. H.

It is with pleasure that I submit this report to you and together with you submit our budget to the taxpayers. It is a good budget, carefully made and should deserve their favorable consideration. Also our schools are in better condition than last year and several changes of value have been made in their administration. these cannot be commented upon nor described but a few things may be mentioned here. We have decreased our nursing union by cutting off two districts, Hill and Sanbornton, thereby making it possible for our school nurse to give more time to Grafton and the other towns and the cost to Grafton in this budget in return for this advantage is but \$1.50 more than the amount called for in last year's budget. This was made possible by the generous contribution by the State Board of an increased amount of state aid to be applied to the salary of our school nurse. Let me make this brief comment on the work of our school nurse as space does not allow many words, it is of a high order and producing real results. Marion G. Moynihan is the person of the right kind of courage and forcefulness to get things done which need to be done and of the right kind of industriousness to work herself to death if we don't succeed in preventing her. Her report is attached to this.

Helen Spaulding, Keene, '32, is doing splendid work at East Primary, Mrs. Elizabeth Thompson has vacated her place at the Depot School to Miss Beatrice H. Jeffrey, Keene, '32, who is taking hold of the work without any lost time and apparently with good understanding of the pupils' needs.

At present, Marie Nelson, Keene, '32, is substituting at Height of Land for Mrs. Ethel P. Haskins, who has been confined at home since Thanksgiving. The Center school is also doing good work under Florence L. Robbins, Keene, '32.

Another change in school management which will prove of value as time goes on is an increasingly greater amount of individual and personal work done in school with the several pupils. We are doing more and more teaching of pupils in exactly the things they need most and pay less and less attention to teaching in groups and classes. We are at the present time giving our pupils tests to find out what each individual is weak in and then our teachers are devoting their time to teaching them just what they don't know. What a pupil already knows doesn't need to be taught him. We shall save much time by this method in the future and perhaps some money. Certainly we shall teach our pupils better.

At date of this report there are 87 pupils registered in the elementary schools of the district. There are 17 pupils, resident in Grafton, enrolled in the Canaan High School. There are 3 pupils, resident in Grafton, enrolled in the Maxfield School in Springfield. The table below shows the distribution by schools and grades.

In this connection there is need for a bit of explanation to the taxpayers regarding the so-called Per Capita tax of \$2.00 for each pupil residing in the district and enrolled in the public schools. This tax is in the nature of an assessment and the district has no control in the payment thereof. The amount of this tax is not determined by the average membership in the schools for the preceding year but by the total enrollment. ample, pupils enter our schools in September, remain a day or a month, move to some other district in the State, remain there a time, move again and maybe the process is repeated. Our district is assessed \$2.00 for each child whose name is entered in our registers, whether he remains a day or a school year. So is the district to which he moves from ours, so the same child within the space of one school year may be responsible for several times a tax of \$2.00 to the several school districts.

Last year there were 125 different pupils enrolled in our schools during the school year, but the average membership, a number representing the number of pupils resident throughout the year, was only 72. Adding to the 125 fourteen other pupils residing in Grafton but attending school outside the district, and subtracting four pupils attending our schools but residing elsewhere gives us 135 pupils on which this year we have to pay a per capita tax of \$270.00 (see budget).

The state allows us, in the sum which is paid us as State Aid, \$2.00 per pupil for the support of a school nurse but this is paid on the basis of average membership, or  $$2.00 \times 72$$  (see above) or \$144.00 in total.

Another assessment appearing in the school budget is that of high school tuition. This is an item over which the district has no control. Whether the item be voted by the district or not the selectmen must assess on the property of the district a sum sufficient to pay the tuition in an approved high school of all pupils prepared to enter upon high school work. The item covering this as given in the budget is an estimate. If more pupils than 21 reside in Grafton next year, prepared to enter high school, more money will need to be furnished; if there are less there will be a balance left over, of course. We think 21 is as close an estimate as we can make at this time.

Transportation of pupils is another item on which the school board have only a partial control. Pupils residing over two miles from an existing school must be transported regardless of the cost; the only control exercised by the board is the cost of such transportation. Those who are conveying pupils at the present time are certainly doing their full duty and more than they are actually compensated for in money. There is one such who on many days doubles portions of his trip to pick up and carry to school laggard children who miss the conveyance on the first trip over the route. This is certainly more than can be expected and is a gift to families who should do their part better in getting their children to school. Let me express here my conviction that all parents still have an old-fashioned moral responsibility for furnishing their children a modern education, as good as they can afford-no better-and for getting their children to school on time and every day that is humanly possible regardless of the part that the district and the state play to help them. Parents should be expected to do their share.

An interesting fact came to light as the budget was being estimated for the coming year. For some years a sum of \$100.00 has been allowed on the school budget for textbooks and a like sum for scholars' supplies. Consulting a table which the office of the State Board of Educa-

tion sent out to districts a while ago, and containing a statement of the amounts of the above items which the several districts in the state expended for each pupil of average membership in the schools, I find that Grafton has expended less than the average amount for the state as a whole. Out of the 243 school districts in the state, 227 spent more than Grafton in the year ending June 30, 1931—which is the latest tabulation. This was on the item of textbooks. In the matter of supplies 175 districts expended more money per pupil. This comparison shows us that either the pupils in the schools of Grafton are not getting as much advantage from new and modern textbooks as they should be having—or that they take better care of what they have and therefore need less replacements. We are trying, especially this year in the schools to reduce the consumption of school supplies by various means which will help us to save for next year. Anyhow, the taxpayers of Grafton may rest well-assured that they are not being over-charged on the items of text books and supplies.

A word about how our school budget is made. The above paragraph will show that we do not do it in a haphazard manner. Careful comparisons with figures for the state or for other school districts are made; expenditures for our own school district over years past are gone into; existing facts of high school attendance are figured; conveyance of children is entered at the rate existing at the time the budget is made out, if no changes are in sight at that time.

Our income is figured at an amount well beneath the probability so that we may not incur a deficit by being disappointed in income and our expected balance in June is very carefully figured. Of course, at best that is an estimate but it is a close and conscientious one. In other words, our budget is a scientific one based on many facts and figures and not merely a good guess.

In concluding, may I express my own thanks to you, as a board, for your kindly criticisms and help and to all

the teachers for their loyalty and good faith; and to the citizens for their generous support of public schools.

November 22 and December 13, 1932, an antitoxin clinic was held with 23 children attending.

Other activities consisted of reweighing and classroom inspection each month. Health talks, clothing collected and distributed, children examined at frequent intervals during scarlet fever scare, and cod liver oil given to the needy.

I wish to express my appreciation to the American Red Cross, the School Board, Mr. Pratt and those who so willingly gave me clothing.

I also wish to express my appreciation of the cooperation of the teachers and parents in the work acomplished this year.
