TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Henniker, in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town's Meeting House in said Henniker on Tuesday, the twelfth of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Town meeting will be recessed for School meeting.

Polls open at 10:00 A. M. and close at 6:00 P. M.

The articles in the Warrant will be taken up at 11:00 o'clock A. M.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

3. To hear and act upon the reports of Town Officers, Library Trustees, Trustees of Trust Funds, and other Committees .

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for repair of highways and bridges.

5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Public Health Nursing Association, raise money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise or appropriate, to defray the expense of observing Memorial Day.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise, in addition to that required by Law, for the support of Tucker Free Library.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the Fire Department, or take action relative thereto.

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise, or appropriate, for the purpose of providing and maintaining fire hydrant service during the ensuing year.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for lighting streets for the ensuing year.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

12. To see what action the Town will vote to take to prevent the spread of white pine blister rust, raise money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for painting and repairing the Town Hall, Engine House, and Academy Hall, or take any action relative thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to set aside part of the income from the Straw Fund for emergency purposes, or take any action relative thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to reinsure the Town buildings and Town trucks.

16. To see if the Town will vote to observe a Welcome Home Day for it's ex-soldiers, combined with Old Home Week, raise and appropriate maney for same, or take any action relative thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the balance of the War Emergency Fund to the General Funds.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid Construction of Class V Roads, or take any action relative thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a committee consisting of the board of selectmen and water commissioners, to make, or cause to be made, a study of the Cogswell Spring Water Works, for the purpose of increasing the supply and decreasing the cost of operation. The cost of said investigation to be met from unused income from the Straw Fund. Said committee to report finding and recommendation at next annual town meeting.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to refund the indebtedness of the Cogswell Spring Water Works, or take any action relative thereto.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to purchase new highway equipment, and raise and appropriate money for same, or take any action relative thereto.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one percent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation, based on the

assessment of 1945, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural resources and advantages of the town, together with other towns in the Merrimack Valley Region Association.

23. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

December 31, 1945

During the past year there was one case of Scarlet Fever, origin unknown.

I have sent samples of Milk and Cream from all dairies that retail in Henniker. Also several samples of water from Town supply. The analysis was satisfactory.

I have inspected one Maternity Home and two Foster Homes, signed applications for same.

I have inspected toilets in the Schools and in all Rest Rooms.

There are several cases of Diphtheria in this State. While immunization is not compulsory, we would advise unusual care with children.

I have investigated all complaints and arrived at satisfactory solution of same.

Very slight variation from the statistics of the previous year will be noted. However, there was improvement in the percent of attendance and amount of tardiness. The total number of pupils residing in the district and attending public schools was 227. Of these one attended in Weare, the remainder in the local schools.

In the spring of 1945 Mr. Gaylerd Davis of Alton, N. H. was employed to act as headmaster of the high school and teach the new Agricultural Course, his service to begin July 1. However, the Selective Service Board decreed otherwise, and Mr. Davis was enrolled in the Armed forces of the United States in August. But the United States Army gives as well as it takes and we were able to make a contract with Mr. William H. Mitchell, II a few days after he was released from service as a fighter pilot with Chennault's Flying Tigers. Under his direction the proposed Agricultural Course was successfully launched in September 1945 after a delay of three years caused by the lack of teachers of Agriculture. We feel that in an agricultural community such as Henniker this course will have a more practical application than the former Trades and Industries Course. It has been reported on good authority that more Henniker boys stay on farms after graduation than in any of the nearby towns.

During the fall of 1945 the Quaker Street School was wired for electric lights and has now the best lighted elementary school room in the district. The rooms at the Central school however, continue to have three-way cross lighting from the windows and only one naked light bulb in the front of each room. These conditions are productive of eye trouble among the pupils.

The entire Central School building should be remodeled and put in condition to meet modern requirements. This would include in addition to the proper lighting, a well equipped room where pupils would have hot lunches,

a teacher's room, and new toilets. Means of ventilation should also be added, although under present conditions considerable air usually blows in around the windows. We would recommend to the district that steps be taken for drawing up plans for a thorough remodelling of the Central School building.

In the summer of 1945 the district received from the Federal Government, full equipment for setting up a canery. This was installed in the basement of the Central building under the right wing. Expenses of instruction and janitor work were paid by the Federal Government. During the summer a great deal of produce was canned here. A share of this was set aside for school lunches. We wish to thank everyone who in any way contributed produce or labor for school lunches. Mr. Merle Patenaude was especially generous in donations of fresh corn and beans.

In conclusion we wish to thank parents, school board members, and teachers for their excellent cooperation and assistance in improving the work and conditions of the school.
