REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

To the citizens of the School District of Loudon:

The time has arrived for the submitting of our annual report. Eight schools have been maintained during the past year, with twenty-nine weeks of teaching in each school. Several of the teachers employed have been for years in our service, and have accomplished their tasks with the usual faithfulness. Two or three new teachers have also given general satisfaction in their work. In the most of the schools the average attendance has been good. Only in one has it been unsatisfactory, being only about two-thirds of the membership. In two of the schools the average attendance was over 95 per cent. of the membership. Few things are more trying to the patience of the teachers and members of the school board, than irregular attendance upon the part of the pupils. This fault can only be corrected by the parents using their influence and authority to keep their children in school.

There is always a chance for improvement in our school system. The time will probably come when uniformity of text-books, general expert supervision and more schooling will give to the rural district opportunities more nearly equal to those of the city.

The cost of maintaining our schools is larger now than formerly. Teachers command better wages, and the cost of books and transportation is considerable. So long as the present law is in force, it will be needful for the district to continue to raise money over and above what the law

requires in order to maintain the schools for thirty weeks.

Your committee were unable to effect a combination with other towns for the purpose of employing expert supervision, and so this matter is necessarily delayed, but we hope not for long.
