Town Meeting Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lyman in the County of Grafton, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Lyman Town Hall, in said town, on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

Article 3. To see if the town will raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to plow the town winter roads; and if so to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways, and raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary.

Article 6. To see what action the town will take towards fixing the compensation of the tax collector.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for white pine blister control.

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to grant a discount of 2 per cent on taxes paid in full before July 5th.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

Article 12. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen, and pass votes relative thereto.

Article 13. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.
