

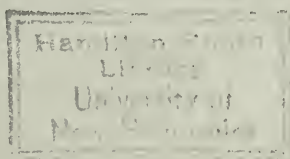

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Newmarket in the (L. S.) county of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, that is to say: To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for General Government, including town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, election and registration and town hall; for the protection of persons and property, including the police department, moth extermination and extermination of the white pine blister rust; for Health and Sanitation, including the health department, vital statistics, and sewer maintenance; for Highways and Bridges, including state aid maintenance, sidewalks, street lighting and general expenses of the department; for Education, including the public library; for Charities, including the town poor; for Patriotic Purposes, including the decoration of soldiers' graves, for Recreation, including band concerts; for Public Service Enterprises, including water utility; for Cemeteries; for Interest; for New Construction

and Improvements, including state aid and town construction; for Indebtedness Payments to other Governmental Divisions, including state and county taxes, and pay all other necessary charges arising within said town.

4. To see if the town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to borrow money for necessary expenditures in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

5. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 3 per cent on all taxes, except poll taxes, paid on or before August 1st, 1944.

6. To see if the town will vote to pay members of the fire department \$47.00 in addition to that required by law, and in excess of the amount so voted, to pay the following additional amounts to the Department officers: to the Chief Engineer \$100.00; to the Assistant Engineer and Clerk of the Engineers, each \$50.00; to the Captain \$20.00; to the Lieutenant and Company Clerk, each \$10.00; and to the Steward \$125.00. (Petition)

7. To see if the town will accept state aid for construction of the Class II road known as _____ and raise and appropriate and set aside for said purpose the sum of \$ _____; or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$148.05.

8. To raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter and otherwise publicizing the resources and natural advantages of the town in cooperation with other towns coordinated in the Seacoast Regional Development Association, the sum of \$130.00. (Petition)

9. To see if the town will vote to extend and maintain the public sewer on New Road, so-called, for a distance of 600ft. (or thereabouts, necessary to service the four houses concerned) and raise and appropriate the necessary money. (Petition)

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for a snow removal blade, and the sum of \$100.00 for sewer equipment.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to repair the tomb and paint the fence at Riverside Cemetery.

12. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to purchasing a patrol car for the Police Department, and appropriate the necessary sum of money therefor, including money for operating expense, if purchase is so made.

13. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

SUPERRINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

February 1, 1944.

To the School Board and Citizens of Newmarket:

It is with pleasure that I submit my second annual report as Superintendent of your schools.

As we all realize, the past school year has been during one of the most critical periods we have experienced. Schools have been affected because of trying mental-strains on the part of parents, children and teachers as well as by the prevalent lack of normal home life caused by industrial boom and increased employment of adult members of the family. Children have been handicapped in many instances by having been left more "on their own." Those under the age of 10 who lack supervision and parental guidance at home today may be the real problem tomorrow. Some say, "It's ADULT Delinquency." However, it appears that all are attempting to make the best of the situation and are looking ahead to renewed normal times with optimism and enthusiasm.

To refute the often repeated statements by high administrative officials that the people do not seem to be conscious of or sufficiently realistic in their attitude toward the awfulness of this global war, Dr. Moehlman in "The Nations Schools" magazine for February 1944, makes the following statements: "No nation on the face of the earth has ever undergone so complete and rapid a transition from highly organized pacifism to war in so short a

time. No people has ever voluntarily given so much of its income through self-taxation and voluntary savings to the support of war effort."

Today our soldiers are fighting in practically every part of the world to restore peace and freedom. Tomorrow the students who are now in our schools must help to solve the tremendous problems involved if that peace is to be made permanent. Our country will need informed, enlightened and devoted citizens then, as much as it needs trained, loyal and courageous soldiers now.

Boys and girls, who in other times would have completed their elementary and high school training, are now leaving school in large numbers. In some communities, the exodus from school has reached proportions alarming to those concerned with the success of the war effort and for the long-time effort of youth.

The motives which cause pupils to leave school are understandable—attractions of high wages, desire to do something definite to help win the war, the influence of the example of others who have left, and the inducements of those who do not realize the value of increased schooling. It is generally agreed by army and civilian authorities that the greatest service which boys and girls of sixteen and seventeen can render to the war effort is to get ready for national service in the armed forces, in war production, in civilian war agencies or in specialized training by continuation of regular schooling at least until high school graduation. From the financial standpoint, a Research Bulletin of the National Education Association presents the following: "Time and money invested in education brings

handsome economic return. The probable life earnings of a typical elementary, high school and college graduate in comparison to the required schooling is shown below.

TEACHERS

Of the fourteen teachers in Newmarket, nine of them were new to their respective positions this year. In the Primary School, Mrs. Lillian Witherell who had been teaching at Danville, replaced Miss Eleanor Evans who resigned. Miss Evans had served for several years as teacher of grade 1 and is now doing special work in "Elementary Reading" under the guidance of Dr. Durrell, a reading specialist at Boston University. In grade 2 Miss Ellen Deem of Northwood and Keene Teachers' College replaced Miss Alice Deprez who resigned. Miss Irene Morin of Somersworth and Keene Teachers' College replaced Miss Marjorie Howe in Grade 4. Miss Howe is now teaching at Rochester.

At the Stone School, Miss Mary Louise Lanoix of Rochester and Keene Teacher's College replaced Miss Mattie Locke in grade 6. After many years of faithful service in Newmarket, Miss Locke resigned to retire. Miss Eva Sanborn, an experienced teacher from Effingham, N. H., replaced Miss Eleanor Gavoni in Grade 5.

At the High School, Miss Harriett Thompson of Walpole, N. H. and Keene Teachers' College replaced Miss Margaret Hyder who resigned as teacher

of Home Economics. The Commercial Department vacancy, caused by the resignation of Miss Elizabeth Doe, was filled by Miss Martha Lefebvre of Somersworth and Plymouth Teachers' College.

Miss Charlotte Gilcreast of Lexington, Mass. and Miss Martha Riddell of Swampscott, Mass., both graduates of Tufts College-replaced Miss Ruth Trudel and Mr. Sherburne Buckler. Miss Trudel is now teaching at Nashua and Mr. Buckler at Tilton-Northfield H. S.

Mr. Thomas Cummings of Arlington, Mass. a graduate of Holy Cross College recently replaced Miss Charlotte Gilcreast who resigned in January 1944, because of ill health.

TEXT BOOKS

More world-mindedness is being developed in our older children by more careful selection of subject matter by text-book writers—a fact which will ultimately develop the power to think out the relation of facts to the actual interests of the entire world. It is probably not an exaggeration to say that this world-mindedness is growing with every passing week. In our own schools, perhaps one of the greatest improvements in study materials has been the continuation, as finances would permit, of replacing old worn out books. Anyone familiar with the new study materials in contrast with the old texts can readily see the stimulating advantages to the younger children.

SCHOOL BUILDINGS

Several minor repairs were made during the past summer and the buildings are in good general re-

pair. Some of the more important repairs that have been made since the last annual report are: new water pipes in the Stone School, a new condensate pump in the High School which has apparently overcome the trouble encountered with the heating system there last year and weather-stripping the windows in the second and fourth grade rooms in the Primary School.

Plans are now being made to arrange the sinks and tables in the Science Laboratory and thereby eliminate much of the trouble which causes leaky sink traps. Gas may be installed for use in the Science Laboratory and in the Home Economics room. This would eliminate the use of alcohol lamps which have become out-dated for most purposes in modern science. Improved lighting fixtures in the Stone School are on the list of improvements for the coming year—as well as are the rewhitening of ceilings and repainting of the walls in the Elementary Classrooms. We note from observation and from publications that most communities have kept their school buildings on a par with, or even ahead of the average home in the community. School buildings are a means to an end; they should be media for the progress of human development.

TESTS

Standardized achievements tests have been administered to all children above grade one and results show that pupils are generally working up to their capacity. We note that Arithmetic is one of the weaker subjects and remedial measures are being taken in the form of greater time allotments and more drill.

WAR SAVINGS

Through participation in the "Schools-at-War" program the children have assumed attitudes of cooperation in addition to material help of buying war savings stamps and bonds, the latter of which we hope will develop into habits of thriftiness. The teachers, parents, and pupils should be commended for their efforts in this program. It is interesting to note that during the present school year \$2,604.20 has been invested in war savings by the pupils of the elementary grades. In the first four grades, the following amounts have been invested: \$53.95; \$189.30; \$56.55 and \$713.50 or a total of \$1,013.50. In the Stone School grades 5 and 6 have invested \$876.65 and \$714.05 respectively. The continuation of the commendable record of what our schools are doing in this particular respect is in Mr. McCaffrey's High School report.

Shortly after the distribution of War Ration Book No. 4, Chester Bowles, Acting Administrator for the office of Price Administration wrote "The distribution of War Ration Book 4 has been carried out with dispatch and precision. We are indebted again, as we have been in the past to the school officials and teachers of the nation—I feel sure that they will be relieved to know that the task will not have to be repeated soon." Other volunteers who helped in this task should also be commended.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF THE
HIGH SCHOOL

The drop off in enrollment this year is in keeping with the national trend. Several students joined some branch of the service, while others took up gainful employment. Registration in the various classes stayed well in balance with the freshman group of fifty-five leading in membership.

The school was very helpful in making a contribution, during the harvest season, to the war effort. Over one hundred and twenty students, or about seventy per cent, were engaged during a two-week period in gathering crops or assisting in farm work. Comendations were received from the farmers as well as the county and state agricultural agencies for the splendid work of the school.

Enthusiasm reached a high peak in October when the school received the award of the Minute Man Flag evidencing that ninety per cent of our students had taken part in the Third War Bond Drive by purchasing stamps or bonds. The purchases during this drive totaled over twenty-five hundred dollars.

It was hoped as the Fourth War Bond Drive was launched that we would be able to do as well, and final reports showed that we not only did as well, but that we had more than doubled our effort with the purchase of seven thousand dollars worth of stamps and bonds.

A plan was worked out by students in the Office Practice Class to write to boys in the service from the school. This has been done regularly with a special drive preceding Christmas. The boys have informed the school that these were pleasant experiences and

happy occasions for them when they were so far from home and their friends.

The yearbook will be published in spite of new problems and shortages because it is believed that it is a school tradition which should not be allowed to lapse and because of its historical and educational value.

A new course — Consumer Education — is being offered this year to seniors. It is expected that this will be of real value in presenting methods of purchasing both in war and peacetime. This is a progressive step in keeping our social studies program up to date.

The Commercial students had an interesting and practical experience when they traveled to Dover to inspect the procedures and workings of the New England Telephone Company there. The offices were opened to them and a supervisor was available to interpret the entire system.

The program of physical fitness was held in the fall and is to be continued after basketball season. This will be enriched with the purchase of equipment which can be used in the auditorium for various games and exercises.

The basketball schedule was a full one for both boys and girls, and this was helpful during the winter months.

The moving picture projector has been very useful and will be an important instrument in instruction in the months ahead.

The repair of the adding machine has given the school a helpful tool for school business and for student instruction.

All in all the school program has gone ahead in quite regular fashion and it is hoped that we can continue to keep our standards high, both in citizenship and in scholarship during the equally trying years ahead.
