

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## TOWN WARRANT

### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orford, on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Also to choose one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds, and one Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.

2. To hear the Budget of the Town and to raise and appropriate any money recommended therein, or to pass any vote relative thereto.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to insure Town buildings.

5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of electric lights.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Orford Social Library and Orford Free Library.

7. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

8. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the distribution of inventory blanks until the Selectmen appraise the property.

9. To see if the Town will vote for the removal of snow from the Town roads, and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

10. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of the Class II. road known as Dame Hill Road, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$1,138.50; or will accept State Aid for construction of Class V. roads, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$466.39.

11. To see if the Town will vote to turn any unexpended balances of special appropriations into the general funds of the Town.

12. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell any real estate acquired by Tax Deed.

13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Fire Department equipment, and to raise and appropriate money for the same, or to take any vote relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to subject the road to gates and bars from Indian Pond Four Corners to the 6th range line.

15. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road leading from the Dame Hill road to the Archertown road, so called, to the boundary between the Lewis and Washburn farms.

16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the joint resolution of the General Court of New Hampshire to wit.: Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?

17. To hear reports of agents, auditors or committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Orford, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said district on the 20th day of March, 1937, at one o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years, and one for two years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
8. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.
9. To see if the District will vote to make various alterations and repairs in the present Orford Street school building and/or enlarge the present plant, and to see what sums of money the District will raise and appropriate to carry out any vote taken under this article.

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10. To see if the District will vote to install a heating and lighting plant in the present Orford Street school building, and to see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate to carry out any vote taken under this article.

11. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to borrow money to pay for any expenditures voted under the two preceding articles and to give therefor notes of the District countersigned by the District Treasurer.

12. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to accept Federal Aid for the purpose of making various alterations and repairs and all enlargements of the present plant of the Orford Street school building, and/or for the installation of a heating and lighting plant.

13. To see if the District will vote to accept financial aid from the State Normal School, and/or the State Board of Education for any alterations or repairs or improvements which may be made in the present Orford Street school building.

14. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to sell the school houses at East Orford and Mt. Cube.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

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To the Orford School Board and  
Citizens of the Orford School District:

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I hereby submit my seventh annual report as Superintendent of Schools. The statistical portion of this report follows the supervisory comment.

The outstanding problem of the district is the state of the Orford Street plant and its crowded condition. The building was constructed in about 1850, and is in immediate and drastic need of extensive repairs. Competent people in the district unanimously agree that there must be a new furnace before another winter. The present one is neither safe nor adequate. An engineer of wide experience finds that the roof trusses must be repaired. The lower chords and struts have decayed, and the slipping of the struts has caused the raising of the roof boards at the finish line at the eaves. He finds further that the foundation wall on the north side should be reinforced. The cesspool in the cellar should be abandoned and a steel septic tank installed. The use of the third floor for class-rooms is not advised. The storey is only 9'-7", lower than the standard school room. The floor load is carried by rods from the roof trusses. To obtain proper exit and stairways for the third floor a small addition would have to be built at the rear. While some windows could be installed the rooms would not be properly lighted. These rooms should be used only for Home Economics, Commercial rooms, etc.

The present high school was started in 1926 under contract with the State Normal School. The enrollment for the last ten years has run 20—28—40—47—54—63—63—64—77—79. The increase has been nearly four times, demonstrating the good acceptance and general success of the school in the Orford-Fairlee area. The enrollment long ago outstripped the capacity of the plant. There are classes of 21 in small rooms where there should be only 15 pupils at the most. In numerous instances pupils are required to sit in very poor light and too near the stove.

The number of Orford pupils has been recently averaging about 30, but the prospects are that there will be 45 next year. No one can tell how many will enter school from all towns, but a conservative estimate would be 20—25.

The present course of study is well adapted to those seeking a general cultural education and preparing for further study after graduation. During the present supervision since 1930 only 20 of the 80 graduates are known to have entered any post secondary school whatsoever. In other words the present course is best suited for one out of every four pupils. Mr. A. C. Hurd of White River Junction, an expert on vocational guidance, has been visiting and having personal interviews with the pupils of the high school for some few years. Mr. Hurd has worked with boys and girls for 38 years and has devoted the major part of his time for 25 years to educational and vocational guidance. Out of this long experience and knowledge of similar schools, Mr. Hurd is of the decided opinion that courses in agriculture, manual training and domestic arts are desirable in the Orford high school.

In conclusion, it seems that the district must either repair and enlarge its present plant or curtail its enrollment. In any event, the course of study should be revised to meet more adequately the needs of the pupils in this vicinity.

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## HEADMASTER'S REPORT.

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To Superintendent Allan M. McCurdy and  
Members of the School Board:

Orford High School opened on Sept. 8th with an enrollment of 77. Since then seven have left school, some to go to work and some to leave town, and one has entered, making our present number 71. There were two more who wanted to come from Wentworth, but at that time our enrollment was 78 and we had no room for them.

There are at present 12 seniors, 20 juniors, 21 sophomores, and 18 freshmen. Of the present enrollment 29 are from Orford, 17 from Fairlee, 16 from Lyme, 4 from Wentworth, 2 from Piermont, 2 from Ely, and 1 from Thetford.

The courses of study remain the same as last year—college preparatory, commercial, and the general course. There are four taking the college preparatory course. Eleven in the two upper classes are enrolled in the commercial course, while in the two lower classes 13 are taking bookkeeping and 15 junior business training. These two subjects are in the general course as well as in the commercial, so it is not definitely known how many will continue with the commercial work. Unless one intends to take up that line of work after finishing high school, he should not continue with that commercial work the last two years. Some do, however, because there is no other course which they wish to take.

The school is well supplied with books, and the laboratory has sufficient supplies to meet the requirements of the science courses. We have a good number of magazines supplied by the state and by individuals. As much time as possible is given to the study of current problems as we believe that is a very important phase of education.

The senior class gave their play in November from which they cleared over \$80. This money will be used for graduation expenses and for a class trip.

At the time this was written plans were being made for the annual winter carnival to be held on Feb. 13th. Any profits derived from this will be used for athletics.

Both the boys' and the girls' basket ball teams have had a reasonably successful season, especially when it is considered that they are limited in their opportunities for practice.

The pupils are working under very crowded conditions. Desks have to be put in every available place in the assembly room so that for some of them the lighting is very poor. The same condition prevails in some of the class rooms.
