Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stark, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, March 11, 1952, to act upon the subjects herein after mentioned. The polls will be open at said place and date from 9:00 o'clock in the forenoon until 5:00 o'clock in the afternoon for the reception of your ballots upon the election of town officers under the Non-Partisan Ballot System: furthermore, you are hereby warned that on said date and place, at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon, the matter of appropriations and such other business properly coming before said meeting will be taken up for your consideration and action.

1. To choose by ballot the following town officers: one town clerk for one year, one selectman for three years; and the following for one year: a town treasurer, a tax collector, one auditor, two road agents, two constables, two sextons and one trustee for the cemetery trust funds.

2. To see if the town will instruct its selectmen to appoint all other town officers required by law.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current expenses.

5. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise for Election and Registration Expenses.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Insurance.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for:

- (a) General Expenses of the Highway Department
- (b) Snow Removal
- (c) Town Maintenance

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to purchase Chloride for Town Roads.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and appropriate \$287.92 and set aside for this purpose. The State will contribute \$1,919.46.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Town Relief.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to defray Interest Charges for the ensuing year.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Public Library purposes.

14. To see if the Town will vote for a scale of discounts for payment of taxes on the basis of Three per cent if paid by August 31st, and Two per cent if paid by September 30.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year and pay such debts from tax money when received.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the upkeep of Cemeteries.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$41.58 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1,000 of assessed valuation (1/100th of 1 per cent) for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns in the region.

18. To see if the Town will vote to tar the road built last year with T. R. A., from River Bridge to Emerson Junction, and raise \$1,600 for same.

19. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

**REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT
 OF SCHOOLS
 1951-1952**

To the School Board and Citizens of Stark:

I have the pleasure of submitting my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools in Stark. Included in this report are financial and statistical data, and other information giving a clear and true picture of the school situation in the District.

It will be noted that there are two changes in the teaching force for the current year. Mrs. Ruth Croteau, who was in the Crystal school last year, is at the Village school this year. Mrs. Margaret Nichols is teaching at Crystal. Mrs. Winnifred Hart has continued in the lower grades in the Village school. All these teachers are well qualified and most satisfactory.

Renovations and repairs have kept the buildings up both in appearance and utility. The installation of the new oil burning furnace at the Village school has meant a great deal in comfort and convenience to the children.

Mrs. Raymond Stuart has made it possible to continue the hot lunch program by acting as chef and opening her home to the children. The parents of the children participating cannot be too grateful for this unstinted generosity in time and effort. The lunches served meet the full requirements of federal and state department regulations, and the children are fortunate indeed to have this opportunity for a warm noontime meal.

Along with the changes in teachers your Superintendent is new to the position, having taken the place of Mr. Appleton on August 16th. I found the buildings well cared for and the new furnace well under way for installation. The Board members are interested in the children and alert to the school needs of the district. They have been most helpful to me in getting started in the new position.

With sincere appreciation of the helpful interest manifested by the teachers, parents, board members and other citizens of Stark, I respectfully submit this report. Thank you.

HEALTH REPORT -- Stark Schools

The results of the health examination which were made by Philip Merriam, M. D., assisted by Florence Wheeler, R. N., were as follows:

Defective vision 4 (cor. since last exam. 2).

Defective hearing 3; Hardened wax in ears 3 (tr. 2).

Enlarged Tonsils 8 (cor. 3); Defective permanent teeth 13; Eszema 1 (under tr.).

Underweight 2; Overweight 1 (under tr.); Defective speech 2.

Cardiac 2; Orthopedic 2; Poor posture 4; Hernia 1.

Glandular disturbance 1 (under treatment).

Genital defects 2 (cor. 2).

Defects have been reported to parents with requests to consult their family physician, dentist, clinic or optometrist.

All children received a record of weight, height and gain for year, also normal weight.

Response on the part of the parents has been gratifying the past year with the exception of dentistry. There is still an effort being made to get some trailer service. This service, for the past two years is not adequate as there is no dentist connected with the Unit, hygienists clean and check teeth only.

Red Cross funds cannot be used for this service at present during war emergencies, as the expense of Blood Mobile, aid for service men, etc., keep the funds low. About the best solution for raising Dental funds is to place enough in Budget to start the work, then to be built up by sums children can afford to pay and any public activities which the towns people might devise to help out.

The general health of the children is good standard and in my estimation the greatest need is Dentistry.
