THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the 12th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same. If not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Town Hall Expense.
 - (e) Damage and Legal Expense.
 - (f) Health Department.
 - (g) Vital Statistics.
 - (h) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (i) Interest on Bonds.
 - (j) County Tax.
 - (k) Payment on Bonds.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of the Poor.
- 4. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred thirty-five dollars (\$735.00), for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Towwn will vote to raise for the following departments:
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any the Town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for winter roads.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay out of the Tax money when it is received.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the State Budget System.
- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate to the White Mountain Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the region, a sum not exceeding 10c per \$1,000. of the assessed valuation of the town for 1945.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a modern Road Grader and make appropriation for the same.
- 14. To choose by Australian ballot the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Selectman for the two years ensuing.

(d) Town Treasurer.

(e) Three Road Agents. (f) Three Fence Viewers.

One or more Constables. (g)

- Collector of Diamond Pond Rent. (h)
- (i) Overseer of Poor.
- (j) One or more Sextons.
- Trustee of Trust Fund. (k)
- One Library Trustee for three years ensuing. (1)
- 15. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 16. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.
- 17. Given under our hands and seal the 23rd day of February in the year of our Lord, nineteen hundred forty-six.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Stewartstown School District:

FOREWORD

Today there is a mounting tide of sentiment in behalf of better education. Education for all the people is America's noblest contribution to civilization. As surely as children grow, the schools must go on. Education cannot wait. The neglect of growing youth cannot be repaired. On every hand people are planning for the future. Labor, industry, business and government are looking ahead. What are our plans for our schools

We have said that democracy cannot exist without education. The opposite is also true. Education cannot grow and flourish without democracy. The schools are citadels of democracy in war or in peace. Only with a democratic system of education is it possible for a nation to find and develop the talents of all of its youth.

Every child in our country deserves a fair start in life including an educational opportunity that will develop his talents to the fullest. America believes in giving everyone a chance. We want our schools to build character. We want our boys and girls to be honest, friendly, considerate, cooperative and responsible. We want them not only to believe in democracy but to play their part in making it work. We want them to know the happiness to be derived from hard work, as well as the joys of a profitably invested leisure. In short, we expect the schools to develop rounded, balanced lives, to contribute to youths' personalities, and to the enrichment of society.

Let us set the child in our midst as our greatest wealth and our most challenging responsibility. Only people make a nation truly great.

TEACHERS

There have been several changes in the teaching force since the last report. The teachers new this year are Mae Drew, Grades 5-6; Junie Aldrich, Grades 3-4; Cleora Richardson, Grades 1-2; and Carrie Riley at Bear Rock.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

The School Board's budget for 1946-47 totals \$23,319.00 as compared with \$21,584.00 for last year. The budget is reduced by an estimated income of \$6,675.00 so that the requested appropriation is \$16,644.00. The March appropriation 1945 was \$14,409.00. The budget this year reflects anticipated higher costs for salaries and supplies.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

New slate blackboards were installed in the seventh and eighth grade room at West Stewartstown. New cloth curtains replaced the old curtains at Bear Rock, Cedar Brook and the Hollow. The South Hill School was painted outside. The other usual summer repairs and improvements were made. Twelve new pupil desks were purchased.

The rooms at West Stewartstown do not heat evenly and it is suggested that ventilators be cut through between the two up-stairs and down-stairs rooms. Sooner or later the old toilets at West Stewartstown will need to be replaced. It may not be too early to be thinking about consolidating the schools on the East side.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

There are at this time 163 enrolled in the district. Of these 70 are at West Stewartstown, 64 in the four rural schools and 29 tuition pupils. We had a total enrollment of 174 last year, 162 the year before.

Percentages of attendance were on the whole rather low. The best records were made by West Stewartstown grades three and four and grades seven and eight with 95.61 and 95.41 respectively. Cedar Brook, Bear Rock and Hollow had very poor records, all below 90 per cent. There were 641 tardinesses in the district for the year, 501 of them being at Cedar Brook. South Hill, West Stewartstown three and four and the Hollow had the best records with 2, 3, and 8 in that order.

TUITION

We have at present 29 attending school outside the district, 21 at Canaan and 8 at Colebrook. A year ago we had 40 tuition pupils.

There are six from Pittsburg attending school at West Stewartstown and three from Colebrook Town at Bear Rock.

TEACHER RETIREMENT

The 1945 State Legislature saw fit to revise the Teachers' Retirement System. The law, as amended,

provides for larger contributions, for better retirement benefits and should provide greater stability among the teachers of the State. It is still on a voluntary basis.

Based on a four per cent rate, the estimated assessment for the school year 1945-46 is \$252.00. The assessment is to be made after July 1, 1946, and is governed by the salaries of the teachers participating. Additional enrollment or registration of members, as well as salary changes may alter the assessment figure.

CONCLUSION

It has been said that the people of the United States could be divided into three groups—the small group who make things happen—the large group who watch things happen—and the enormous multitude who do not know what happens. I hope that the educational opportunities of our schools are such that our boys and girls will become a part of that small group who make things happen.

I take this as another opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
