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GRANITE STATERS OPPOSE WALL, FAVOR PATH TO CITIZENSHIP AND BORDER PATROL CHECKPOINTS

DURHAM, NH – Granite Staters are decidedly in favor of the Border Patrol conducting checkpoints in New Hampshire but are opposed to the construction of a large-scale physical barrier on the Mexican border and favor a path for "Dreamers" and other illegal immigrants currently in the country to gain legal citizenship. Residents are clearly divided by party on how serious of an issue illegal immigration is and which policies they would like to address it.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred and fifty-six (956) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between October 26 and November 9, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.2 percent.

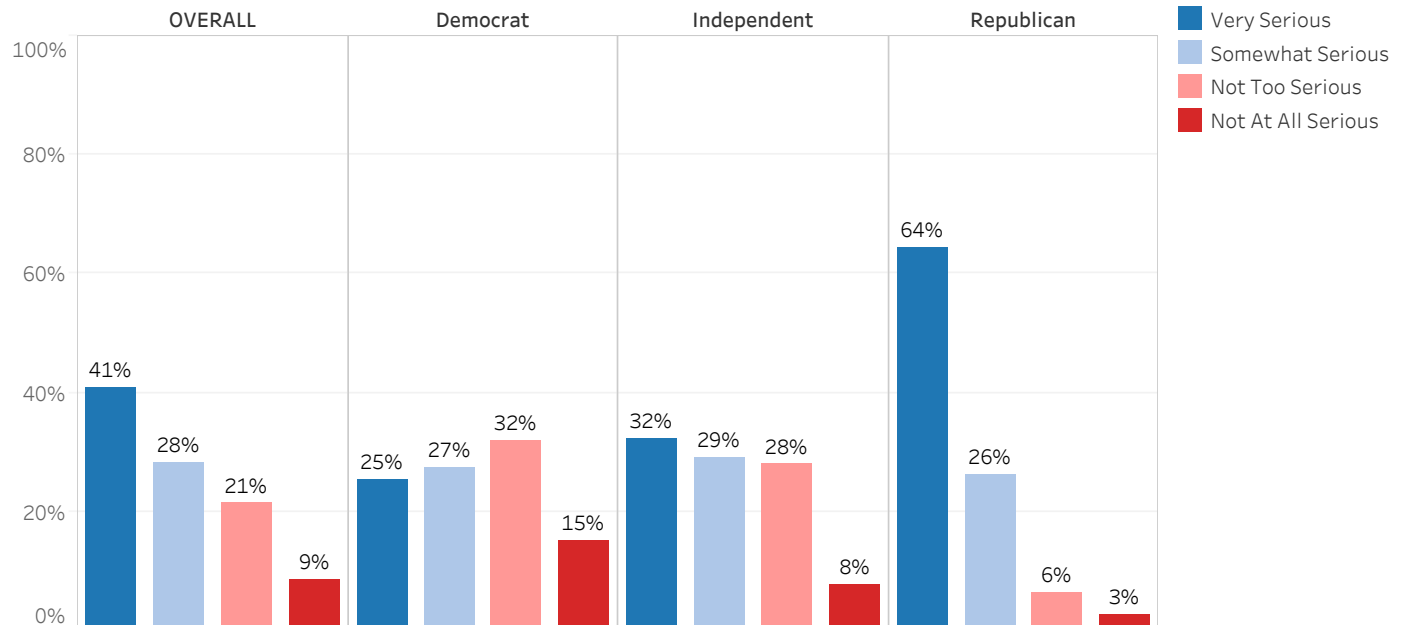
Seriousness of Issue

Immigration was a significant issue in the 2016 NH Republican primary campaign as well as in the November election. More than two-thirds of Granite Staters (69%) think the issue of illegal immigration is a very serious (41%) or somewhat serious (28%) issue, while 21% say it is not too serious, 9% say it is not at all serious, and 1% don't know or are unsure.

Republicans (64%) are far more likely than Independents (32%) or Democrats (25%) to say illegal immigration is a very serious issue.

Respondents who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, those who watch Fox News, and those who primarily get their national news from television are most likely to say the issue of illegal immigration is very serious while those who primarily get their national news from radio or newspapers, those who did not vote or voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, those who have completed postgraduate work, and self-described liberals are least likely to say so.

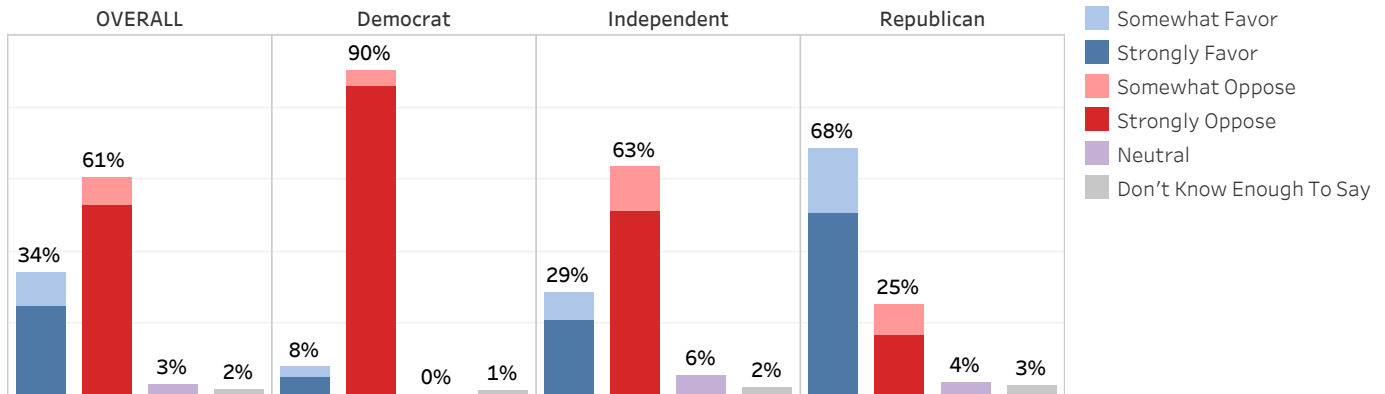
Border Enforcement

President Trump frequently said that if elected, he would build a wall on the Mexican border. Only one-third of New Hampshire residents (34%) say they strongly favor (25%) or somewhat favor (9%) the construction of a large scale physical barrier between Mexico and the United States as outlined by President Trump during his presidential campaign. Six in ten respondents (61%) strongly oppose (53%) or somewhat oppose (8%) it, 3% are neutral, and 2% don't know or are unsure.

More than two-thirds of Republicans (68%) are in favor or building such a structure, but only 29% of Independents and 8% of Democrats agree. The intensity of opposition among Democrats is particularly striking (86% strongly opposed).

Respondents who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, those who watch Fox News, and those who primarily get their national news through television are most likely to favor the construction of large-scale physical barrier between Mexico and the United States while those who have completed postgraduate work, those who primarily get their national news from newspapers, self-described liberals, and those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016 are least likely to support it.

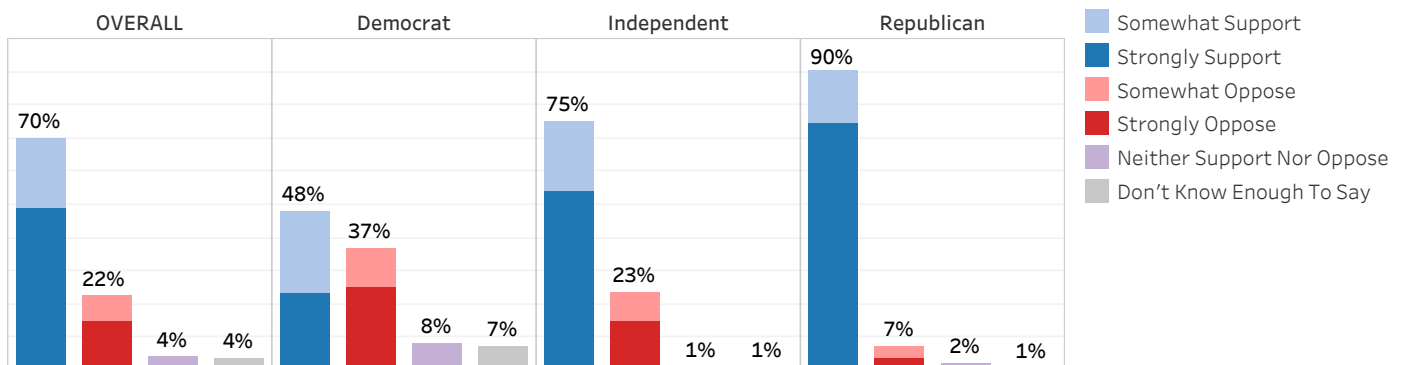
Border Enforcement NH Checkpoints

There is broad support among Granite Staters for the Border Patrol conducting checkpoints inside New Hampshire to investigate potential drug smuggling and to check on individuals' immigration status, similar to the highway checkpoint in Woodstock, New Hampshire in August, 2017. Seven in ten residents (70%) strongly support (49%) or somewhat support (21%) this action, 22% strongly oppose (15%) or somewhat oppose (8%) it, 4% neither support nor oppose, and 4% don't know enough to say.

Nearly all Republicans (90%) and three-quarters of Independents (75%) support the Border Patrol conducting these types of checkpoints in New Hampshire, but just under half of Democrats (48%) agree.

Respondents who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, those who watch Fox News, those who primarily get their national news from television, and those with a high school degree or less are most likely to favor the Border Patrol conducting these types of checkpoints in New Hampshire while those who have completed postgraduate work, those who primarily get their national news through newspapers, those who voted for Hillary Clinton voters in 2016, and self-described liberals are least likely to support this action.

Border Patrol Checkpoints in New Hampshire

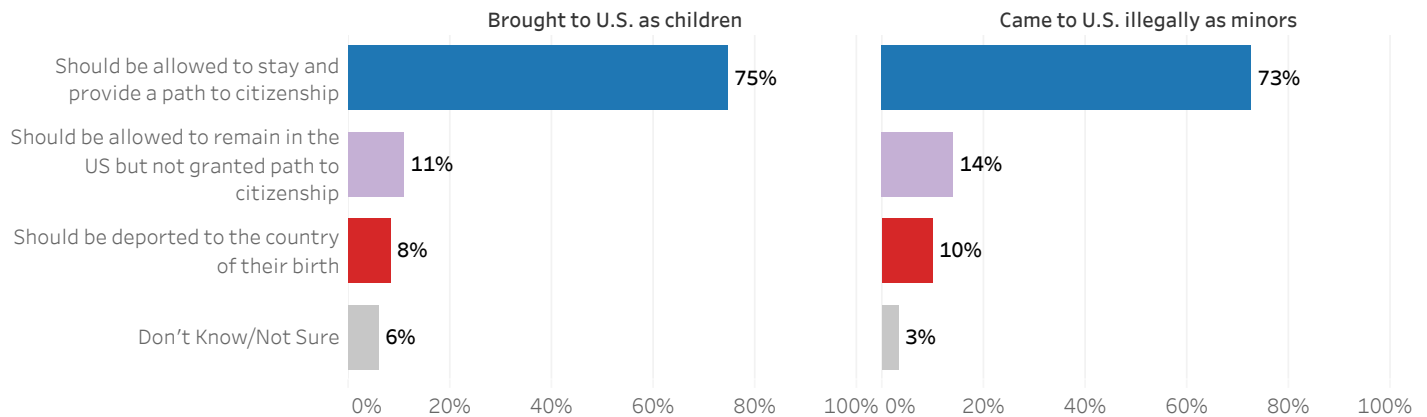


Policy for Current Immigrants

Respondents were asked what should be done regarding "Dreamers." In order to test if there was any impact of how this question was worded, for half of the sample (N=473) "Dreamers" were described as "individuals living in the United States who came to the United States illegally as minors," while for the other half of the sample (N=465), "Dreamers" were described as "individuals living in the United States who were brought to the United States as children."

Regardless of how "Dreamers" are described, New Hampshire residents clearly prefer they be allowed to stay and be provided a path to citizenship. Among those who were told "Dreamers" were brought to the U.S. as children, three-quarters (75%) say they should be allowed to stay and be provided a path to citizenship, 11% say they should be allowed to remain in the U.S. but not be granted a path to citizenship, 8% say they should be deported to the country of their birth, and 6% don't know or are unsure. Among those who were told "Dreamers" came to the U.S. illegally as minors, 73% say they should be allowed to stay and be provided a path to citizenship, 14% say they should be allowed to remain in the U.S. but not be granted a path to citizenship, 10% say they should be deported to the country of their birth, and 3% don't know or are unsure.

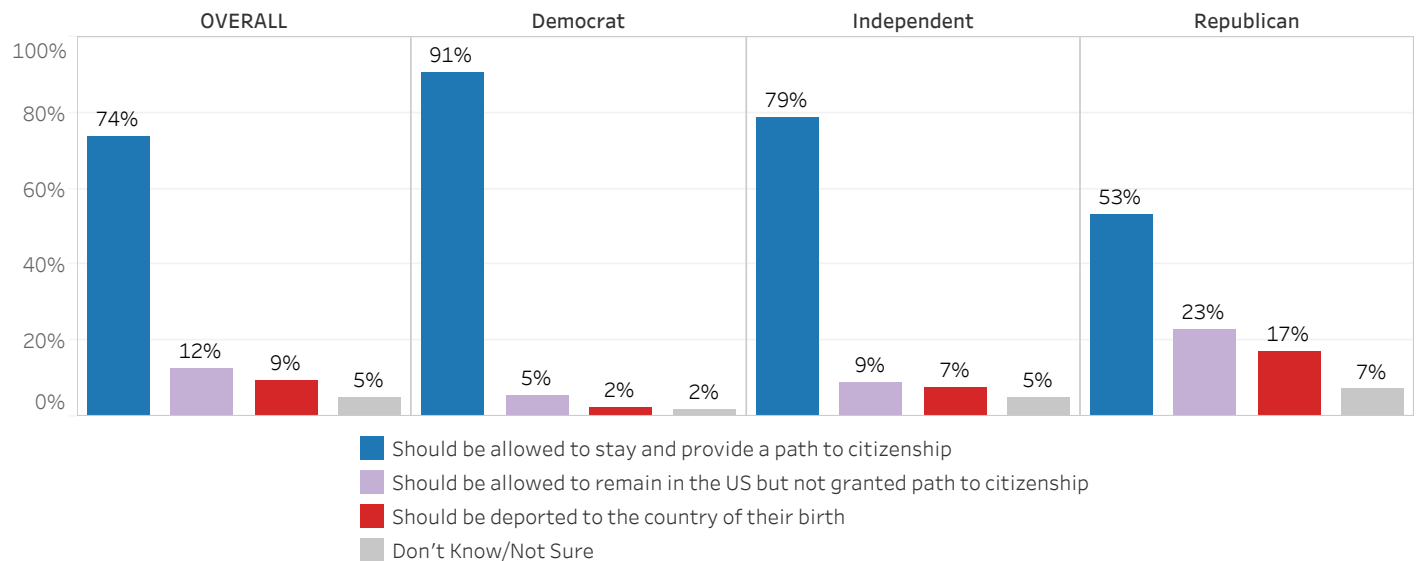
What Government Should do About "Dreamers"



Nearly all Democrats (91%) and more than three-quarters of Independents (79%) say "Dreamers" should be allowed to stay in the country and be provided a path to citizenship, while a slim majority (53%) of Republicans agree.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, those who have completed postgraduate work, those who primarily get their national news from newspapers, those who watch MSNBC, and Connecticut Valley residents are most likely to say "Dreamers" should be allowed to stay in the country and be provided a path to citizenship, while those who did not vote or voted for Donald Trump in 2016, those who watch Fox News, and self-described conservatives are least likely to say so.

What Government Should do About "Dreamers" - Combined Descriptions



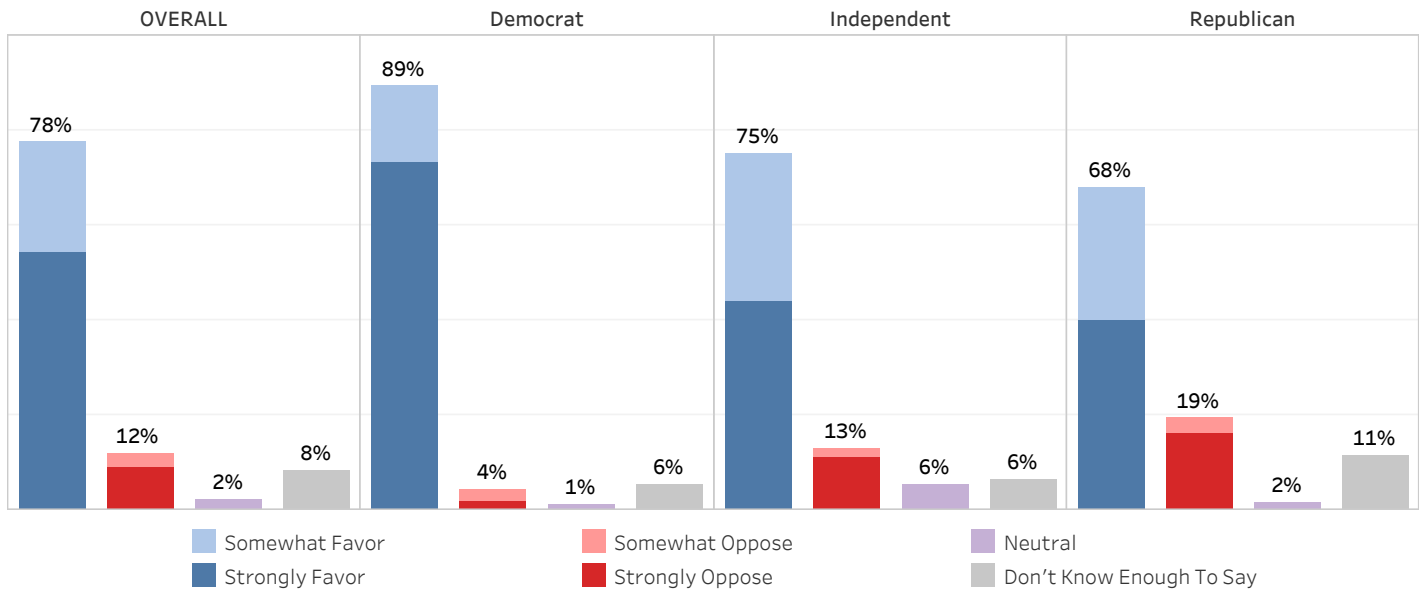
Policy for Current Immigrants

Granite Staters are also clearly in favor of providing a way for illegal immigrants currently in the country to gain legal citizenship if they pass background checks, pay fines, and have jobs; 78% of respondents strongly agree (54%) or somewhat agree (23%), 12% strongly oppose (9%) or somewhat oppose (3%), 2% are neutral, and 8% don't know enough to say.

Nearly nine in ten (89%) of Democrats, three-quarters (75%) of Independents, and just over two-thirds (68%) of Republicans favor a path to citizenship for illegal immigrants if they meet these conditions.

Self-described liberals, those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, those who primarily get their national news through newspapers, and those who have completed postgraduate work are most likely to favor a path to citizenship for illegal immigrants who pass background checks, pay fines, and have jobs, while those who did not vote or voted for Donald Trump in 2016, those who watch Fox News, and self-described conservatives are least likely to favor this policy.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred and fifty-six (956) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between October 26 and November 9, 2017. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.3%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
