TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, Auditor, three Hospital Trustees, to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for—

2. Town Officers' Expenses
3. Election and Registration Expenses
4. Municipal Court Expenses
5. Expenses Town Hall and Other Town Buildings

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction of Class V roads, commonly known as town roads, raise and appropriate for the purpose, the sum of \$432.80, and receive from the State \$2,885.33.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$267.43 to the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of regional advertising.

7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000 for the purchase of new highway equipment, this sum to be spent at the discretion of the Selectmen, Highway Agent, and a committee of three taxpayers.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

appropriate the sum of \$968.07 to complete payment on an accumulative deficit.

10. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and appropriate the sum of \$150 to cover the expense of said audit.

11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the amount of \$100 to continue the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual State Aid.

13. To see what action the voters will take in regards to the Town deeding a tract of land on part of which the American Legion building now stands, including twenty-five (25) feet on all sides of said building, to Ingerson Smith Post 41.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$387.40 to complete payment for the sanitary facilities at Whitefield Airport, this sum being the amount still due after the net proceeds of last summer's Air Meet have been applied to this expense by the Whitefield Board of Trade.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 to plow, clean and flood the skating rink.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$985 for the repairing and electrification of the town clock.

17. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of the lands and buildings within the town, to equalize

valuations in accordance with the law, and to appropriate the sum of \$2500 for this purpose.

18. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Road Agent beginning in the year 1955 and annually thereafter so long as this vote remains in effect.

19. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal of the town this nineteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and seventy-eighth.

We received gifts from the following which were greatly appreciated: a slate sink for the laboratory by Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Astle, a commode chair by Mrs. Frank Simmons, equipment for the hospital and laboratory given by Mrs. Ethel Lay, three foot stools for the maternity department by the Alumnae, jelly by Mrs. Everett Courcy, and apple sauce by Mrs. Everett Raether, as well as many books and magazines by interested persons. Gifts of money were given by Mrs. Etta Thompson and others.

With the yearly donation by Mrs. Charles, a new bed, mattress, and crib sides were purchased for the Children's Ward.

Mrs. Edward Breed, of the Mountain View Colony, established a Special Nursing Fund for needy people.

The room, so beautifully furnished by the American Legion, adds one more room and is very popular with the patients.

The Hospital Auxiliary generously gave of their time and efforts for mending once a month, also bought linen and other supplies. The tile floors which are such an improvement, are greatly appreciated by the staff.

When the Mount Washington Hotel closed, we received a large amount of fresh and frozen fruit and vegetables. With the aid of the deep freeze, we were able to make use of all of this donation.

The Trustees have asked me to express their sincere appreciation of the strong and very successful appeal made to their guests at the Mountain View House by the Dodge family.

Though our financial position appears to be in good shape at present, we are now faced with the heavy expense of installing sprinklers, strongly recommended by the State Department of Hospital Services, and we cannot expect any substantial donation before next summer.

Our greatest trouble is in collections of money due from patients. We hope that all will cooperate to improve this condition as much as possible in the coming year.

The public is cordially invited to visit their hospital.
