Town Warrant

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Acworth, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Acworth on Tuesday the eleventh (11th) day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Art. 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for highways and bridges.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for breaking roads.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for general expenses of the Highway Department.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of town poor and old age assistance.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for class V roads and raise money for the same.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for lights.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for interest.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on notes on credit of the town, such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses to anticipation of taxes.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for observance of Old Home Day.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for support of Silsby Free Public Library.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) for control of white pine blister rust.

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to raise five hundred dollars

to be added to the trust fund for betterment of the Acworth educational system, according to chapter 160, laws of 1943.

Art. 16. To determine and appoint the salaries of town officers.

Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to appoint or elect a road agent at forty-five dollars a week.

Art. 18. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.

Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200. as partial or complete payment for fire-fighting equipment and instruct the Selectmen to borrow the balance if more money is needed.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to accept, from Lina B. Knight, the sum of \$100.00 for the care of the Fred Batchelder lot in the Acworth Cemetery.

Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to continue to use balance of appropriations to pay for town equipment or authorize the Selectmen to borrow same.

Art. 22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

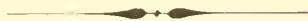

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Acworth School Board :

I herewith submit my first annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

I have enjoyed the helpfulness and patience of the School Board, the cooperation of the parents and townspeople, the seriousness of purpose of the teachers and the steadfastness of purpose and friendliness of the pupils. In such an atmosphere education should continue to progress.

Acworth is very fortunate in having competent and able experienced teachers and under their guidance progress is steady.

The transportation situation has been very unsatisfactory this year. One whole section of town has been denied the privilege of attending school regularly and another section has felt that a hardship has been imposed upon them. There should be some solution to these conditions if everyone concerned is willing to give his wholehearted cooperation. One of the difficulties seems to lie in the fact that the Alstead schools are in a different Supervisory Union from the Acworth schools and, hence, coordination of policy is more difficult.

It is very commendable that Acworth should be among the few towns that pay for the transportation of its high school pupils. In towns where no transportation is provided, the rate of drop-outs in high school is appallingly high. It seems a pity that this bus problem should exist when its solution means so much to the future of the youngsters of the town.

The decision to keep the Center School open has proved to be a wise one. I feel, however, that better educational opportunity would be provided if an arrangement could be made whereby one teacher were to teach the primary grades and a second teach the intermediate grades. There would be less of a burden on the teachers and the competition and extra attention that could be given the pupils should prove to be very beneficial.

There is before the legislature a State Aid bill that, if passed, would mean an increase to the town of Acworth of about two thousand dollars. This would provide much needed assistance to the taxpayers of the town. The educational needs of the pupils throughout the whole state should be able to be met more fully if the plan as proposed by our new commissioner is accepted.

Realizing that the costs of all departments of the town are increasing and that the taxpayers are interested in keeping the tax rate as low as possible, every effort to curtail unnecessary expenses in the schools is being made. However, we should realize that the education of our children is an investment in the future and necessary expenses are justifiable.
