Warrant for Annual Meeting

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookline, County of Hillsborough and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town and State affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Daniels Academy Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday, March 12th, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects and any other business that may legally come before said meeting:

1. To choose all Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and all other Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating to same.

3. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town charges for the ensuing year.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of State Aid Highways or take any action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of the Highways under the law passed at January session of 1905, and to say where such shall be laid out, or take any action in regard to same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to allow any discount on property taxes paid before December 1st, 1929, or take any action in regard to same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400 to help exterminate the White Pine Blister, or take any action in regard to same.

12.. To see if the Town will vote to have a night patrolman, raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following legacies or take any action in regard to same:

\$200 from Clarence R. Russell for the perpetual care of the Samuel Russell and Campbell Russell lots in the Lakeside Cemetery, the income to be used for care of said lots and the improvement of said cemetery.

\$150 from Thomas A. Ross for perpetual care of E.C. Shattuck lot in Pinegrove Cemetery.

\$100 from Walter E. Corey, executor of Jessie M. Corey will, for perpetual care of Shedd, Stiles and Corey lot in Pinegrove Cemetery.

14. To see if the Town will authorize Selectmen to distribute Resident inventory blanks when assessing April 1st, instead of mailing same.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any money to observe Old Home Day, or take any action in regard to same.

16. To see if the Town will vote to change the location of any of the street lights or take any action relative thereto.
