

### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and vote their compensations.
- Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- Art. 3. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 2% discount on all property taxes paid inside of thirty days from the receipt of tax bills.
- Art. 4. To see what action the town will take upon the budget as submitted by the budget committee.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to close the Robins Hill Road from the State Road on the northerly end to land of Lindsey H. Parker, subject to gates and bars.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to donate \$150 of the fire department appropriations to the Saco Valley Firemen's Association.
- Art. 7 To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
