
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TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE



To the inhabitants of the Town of Claremont, in the County of Sullivan in said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the lower assembly room and the room above said assembly room, both in the Town Hall in said Town of Claremont on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To elect one Selectman who shall serve for three years.
- 3. To elect one Assessor who shall serve for three years.
- 4. To elect one Water & Sewer Commissioner who shall serve for three years.
- 5. To choose one member of the board of three trustees who shall have the custody of all trust funds of the Town, who shall serve for three years.
- 6. To choose three members of the Board of Trustees of Fiske Free Library who shall serve for three years.
- 7. To choose three members of the Community Center Commission to serve for three years.
- 8. To choose one member of the Board of Trustees of the Elks' Educational Fund who shall serve for one year.
- 9. To see if the Town will choose or appoint a committee of citizens to act as a Committee of Finance for the ensuing year, whose duty it shall be to investigate all proposed appropriations, previous to any town meeting held during the ensuing year and to report their recommendations to the town meeting which is to act upon the proposed appropriations.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,300.00 to pay Town Officers for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for Incidental Expenses for the Town for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the salary and expenses of the Health Department for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$21,600.00 for the salaries and expenses of the Police Department for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.

- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26,500.00 for the Construction and Repair of Highways and Bridges for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for Oiling and Cleaning Streets and Highways of the Town for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for Snow Removal for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of building new Sidewalks and repairing those now in use.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$643.98 provided the State will contribute \$2,575.91 for the purpose of carrying out a Town Road Aid Program.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,889.50 to be set aside for future State Aid Construction on the Jarvis Hill Road, so called, at the suggestion of the State Highway Department.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,711.32 for the support of the Fire Department for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,740.00 for the use of Hydrants for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$219.52 for the purpose of Liability Insurance on the Fire Trucks.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,315.67 for Street Lighting for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes of the present municipal year, said debt to be paid within one year after the date of incurrence out of the taxes of said year.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$527.00 for Milk Inspection for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,700.00 for the Collection of Garbage and Refuse for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,485.00 for the care of the Town Dump for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 for the Support of the Town Poor for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for Old Age Assistance for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$65,000.00 to pay the Debts of the Town including bonds of the School District maturing during the fiscal year and interest on the same.

- 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the maintenance and development of Moody Park for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to make burials, help take care of, and beautify the Cemeteries of the Town.
- 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 for the Support of Fiske Free Library agreeably to the contract with Andrew Carnegie and Samuel P. Fiske.
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 in aid of the Claremont General Hospital.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,650.00 for general operating expenses of the Town Hall and Court House for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500.00 for the maintenance and development of Monadnock and Barnes Parks and Playgrounds.
- 37. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the purpose of maintaining a public swimming pool at the George H. Boynton Memorial Dam.
- 38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for Memorial Day.
- 39. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for Band Concerts by the American Band for the ensuing year.
- 40. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the salary of the Building Inspector.
- 41. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to help carry on the work of the Red Cross Public Health Nurse.
- 42. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four thousand six hundred seventy two dollars and eleven cents (\$4,672.11) for the supervision and maintenance of the E. Charles Goodwin Community Center for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944 in accordance with the contract between the town and Mary A. Goodwin.
- 43. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for assistance for the Assessors in enumerating the taxable poll and preparation of the poll tax warrant.
- 44. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Trimming and Spraying Trees.
- 45. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control.
- 46. (Inserted by request) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to carry out a municipal Victory Garden Project.
- 47. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred eighty dollars (\$480.00) for the salary of a Clerk for the Trustees of Trust Funds for the ensuing year.

- 48. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1943 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.
- 49. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote, under authority of Chapter 160, Laws of 1943, to set aside from the balance now in the Town Treasury, a sum of money not to exceed \$35,000.00 to be expended when practical for the following purposes: \$16,000.00 to be allocated to the Fire Department for the purchase of a new Aerial Ladder Truck, \$16,000.00 to be allocated to the Highway Department for the purchase of a new grader and necessary trucks and \$3,000.00 to be allocated to the Police Department for the purchase of a new Police Ambulance.
- 50. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of Compensation Insurance to protect all Town Employees for the ensuing year.
- 51. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the use of the Highway Department for the upkeep of the several parks and plots on the town streets and grounds.
- 52. To determine the rate of discount the Town will allow persons paying their Property Taxes within such periods as the Town may designate.
- 53. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to adopt the non-partisan Ballot system for the election of Town Officials as provided in the Revised Laws of New Hampshire.
- 54. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to instruct the Governor of the State of N.H. to send a request to the Congress of the United States, a plea that they pass an adequate bill for soldier voting that will enable every person in the armed forces to vote for Federal officers at the next Federal election.
- 55. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote under authority of Chapter 160, Laws of 1943, to allow the Claremont Playground Commission to set aside a sum of money not to exceed \$1,400.00 now in their treasury for the purpose of constructing a field house at Barnes Park when construction of same is feasible.
- 56. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will authorize the Claremont Playground commission to retire annually three members and elect three members in a manner similar to the election of Trustees of Fiske Free Library.
- 57. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to establish the salary of the Board of Auditors at \$200.00 per annum for each member.
- 58. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Water & Sewer Department to expend from its funds the sum of \$10,000.00 necessary to complete the White Water Brook Dam.
- 59. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or borrow on the credit of the Town the sum of \$36,100.37 for the use of the Water & Sewer Commission for the construction of the following additions to the sewer system; Chestnut St., Chase St., Benton Ave., Belmont Ave., Edgewood St., Hartford St., Osgood Ave., and the east end of South Street at an estimated cost of \$22,712.25; Breck Ave. and Green Street and the south end of Broad Street at an estimated cost of \$7,777.07;

Tutherly Ave. at an estimated cost of \$1,035.32 and Winter and Anderson Streets at an estimated cost of \$4,575.73.

- 60. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to establish a Post War Planning and Industrial Commission of five members: one member to be a representative of industry, one of labor, one of agriculture, one of the Chamber of Commerce and one a citizen at large all to serve without pay; the Moderator to appoint said commission which shall have the power to employ an agent and other necessary employees. And to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy five hundred dollars for said purpose.
- 61. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,250.00 for Meat Inspection for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1944.
- 62. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will allow the use of the Lower Town Hall by the Council of Social Agencies to promote additional recreational facilities which shall not however include athletic events.
- 63. (Inserted by request) Will the Town vote to have our Public Library opened Sunday afternoon from 2 to 5 o'clock for the accommodation of adults many of whom, I am sure, appreciate the privilege of spending an hour or two reading, writing or studying where one has access to the various reference books all furnished by our library.
- 64. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars for the purpose of copying and reindexing town records.
- 65. (Inserted by request) To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the following ordinance: Authority is hereby granted to the Police Commissioners of the Town of Claremont to restrict the sale of small flags, flowers and other such articles on the streets of Claremont by so-called veterans, irrespective of State License held by said vendors. That any such sales, if necessary, be restricted to the several Veteran or ex-service men organizations of the town.
- 66. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.



REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE FISKE LIBRARY

The year 1943 has brought no increase in circulation and doubtless this will be true for the duration of the war. Many of the people who used the library are in the armed forces or in war jobs and those at home are still so busy with activities related to the war that they have little time for recreational reading.

A good deal of the drop is in fiction which is not so important, since there is a noticeable increase in the number of serious books read. Books on the war: biography, travel, especially on the countries where our soldiers are fighting; books dealing with present day and post-war problems: aviation, mathematics and other technical books are read more than ever. We have tried to buy a good supply of such books.

Books on the war, aviation and different branches of the armed forces have been very popular with the boys.

The circulation for the year was 54,328. 418 new borrowers were added. To date 1,328 books have been added of which 137 were given. More are on order.

Among the books added are several reference books:-

Atlas of American History Larned's New History of Ready Reference Webster's Dictionary of Biography World Book Encyclopedia

Harper's Bazaar, Health, Illustrated London News, Infantry Journal, Mademoiselle and Vogue have been added to the magazines in the reading room.

The usual activities have gone on. Books have been loaned to the Public schools, Parochial school, bookmobile, Frances Tolles Home, Rural Women's Reading Club, and to several groups of people living outside. Our discarded books and magazines have been given to the County Home.

Books were collected again for the Victory Book Campaign. 538 suitable books were sent to Boston to be distributed to the men in service. Over a thousand were donated and sorted. These included books from Cornish, Newport and Sunapee.

Book Week was observed this year only with displays of attractive books. Many of them illustrated this year's slogan, "Build the Future With Books." Some of the teachers brought their classes to the library during the week.

In June the Junior Citizen Club of North Street school visited the Historical Room. Mr. Walter Pierce gave them a short talk on the mineral collection.

We have used newspaper publicity, bulletin board display, and table exhibits to bring books to the attention of the public. Posters and other material to aid the war effort have been displayed.

Two members of the library staff attended the N. H. L. A. meeting in Manchester.

Miss Ina Townsend, one of the assistant librarians, has joined the WACs. An exhibit of paintings by Miss Elizabeth Sherinyan of Worcester, a former art teacher in Claremont, attracted a great deal of attention.

Items of historical interest were given by Mr. C. B. Spafford of Indiana, Pennsylvania.

The pictures belonging to John L. Farwell, long a loan, now belong to the library.

Another interesting addition to the Historical collection is a rare point lace handkerchief which belonged to Maria Marshall Rossiter. This was given by Mrs. Harriet Rossiter Lewis.

"More Stories of the Operas", by Newman, was given by a friend in memory of Mary Coburn Colby.

The building has been insulated upstairs which helps greatly to conserve heat. The ell has been reshingled and the floors revarnished.

We wish to express our thanks to the many people who have given books and magazines or who have in any way helped us in service to the Community.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

February 1, 1944

To the Board of Selectmen:

Many problems due directly to the war conditions have occurred this year and have been met with cooperation from our citizens of this community, which have been a hardship to them. Claremont residents and Claremont physicians have had to cope with trying conditions with a minimum of complaints. One new physician was placed here through the efforts of the Assignment and Procurement Service. One physician who was taken from here was given a leave of absence from the Navy department to help out here but has now again returned to his duties with the Navy. Another physician whom we had also lost to the Navy department has recently been given a discharge and again is actively in practice here. At present our condition here in this respect is again approaching a danger zone and we are only hoping that no disease in epidemic form occurs here. If it should Claremont does not have adequate medical service.

Diptheria immunization for the prevention of this disease has been continued as in former years by the Health Department. This is given to school children not previously having been treated. This work is done on a voluntary basis and free to Claremont children. This treatment may be done either as a single or double innoculation treatment as parents may choose.

Acting in accordance with requirements of Chapter 123, Public Laws of New Hampshire, school children not already having been vaccinated against Smallpox were done during the summer recess or at the beginning of the school year under the direction of the Board of Health and the cooperation of School department.

As provided for in the 1943 Town Meeting, a meat inspection department has been set up as a department of the Board of Health. The State Board of Health cooperated fully in helping us do this work. The ordinance was set up according to law and took effect on September 1, 1943, to inspect all meat except poultry, both before slaughter and on the slaughter floor and to make routine and frequent inspections of all meat retailing markets to insure the public against uninspected meat being offered for sale and its proper handling in these markets.

Regular inspections have been made of all food handling stores, restaurants, ice cream and soda fountains, fruit stores, drink dispensing establishments and barber shops. This was done with full cooperation in all cases as to compliances with state and federal laws pertaining to the same.

The Board of Health received this year as ususal many so-called "nuisance complaints", totaling approximately 110. These complaints vary in nature, the majority, however, were unsanitary conditions such as rubbish collections in unlawful places and generally offensive animal refuse and manure

collections. We have this year, however, allowed more residents, in the compact parts of town, to raise more swine and poultry, provided the premises do not create a general nuisance, due to the food shortage existing.

The communicable diseases reported to the Claremont Board of Health during this past year are as follows: Meningitis, 1; Scarlet Fever, 26; Pneumonia, 5; Measles, 51; Chicken Pox, 39; Whooping Cough, 44; Mumps, 6; Tuberculosis, 10; Impetigo, 2; Venereal diseases, 18.

Many samples of the Claremont municipal water supply have been submitted to Concord to the State Board of Health laboratories for analysis. The results of these samples have been highly satisfactory. Also several residents having private water supplies have submitted water samples mostly at their own request for analysis and none of these have proved to be unsatisfactory for drinking purposes.

The department of Milk Inspection has carried on again this year in its protection methods for the milk supply of this town. Routine barn and milk room inspections have been made and analysis of samples with the State Board of Health have been made. The findings of all local supplies have been good.

The Board of Health wishes to thank the public, the physicians, the school nurse, the nurses connected with public health work here, the Claremont General Hospital and Staff, and others who have given their cooperation and assistance in carrying out public health work in the past year.

REPORT OF MILK INSPECTOR

This past year has been a more or less hectic year for milk inspection.

Barns have been inspected; milk samples sent to Concord; milk examined here, and thirty-one commercial licenses granted, besides the producers' licenses.

Farm help has been very hard to get, grain high, and the price of dairy cows almost twice the price of last year. Wholesale price of milk down country is higher than here, and the price of milk in other towns in New Hampshire about the size of Claremont considerably higher.

All these things leading up to a shortage in Claremont of milk and cream, converted into the equivalent of milk, of about 1,100 quarts daily. And to top this a great danger of losing 2,000 quarts more.

This has been taken care of with permission of the State Board of Health and the Governor of inspection of milk and cream not inspected by the local milk inspector.

Frequent samples of this milk have been taken. At first some of it was very bad and immediate steps, with the assistance of the State Board of Health, were taken to correct this at the bulk plant delivering the milk. At present the product is properly pasteurized and passes State requirements.

Our local pasteurizing plants are running as usual and they, as well as other dealers, are having plenty of labor and feed trouble. But all are trying and I believe Claremont is very fortunate in having the type of men in the milk business who carry through in spite of big obstacles.

REPORT OF MEAT INSPECTOR

As adopted at the 1943 Town Meeting the rules and regulations were set up to provide proper public protection in meat handling and its sale for Claremont. These rules were accepted by the Board of Health and set up in ordinance form after proper legal advice in their formation.

There had to be built, as none existed, proper places for the slaughter of livestock. This did not get under way until August, at which time the regulations were officially put into effect. This work has met with approval from the slaughterers and store retailers as well as the consuming public which in the end is really receiving the protection therefrom.

Results of slaughter house inspection under direction of the meat inspection department of the Claremont Board of Health, beginning the last week of August 1943 and ending January 31, 1944:

Also a total of 16 livers and 1 heart were condemned.

As shown by the above figures either very few hogs were sold in Claremont or someone has been buying uninspected pork.

We try to keep watch of all meat sold in Claremont but it is very difficult to watch every home. There is no expense to the slaughterer if he uses Claremont slaughter houses, and no expense to the buyer, and if the public wishes their meat inspected before using, it will be a big help if they will notify the meat inspector of anyone offering uninspected meat for sale.

- A cement curbing to be placed in the Tremont Square Parking area, replacing posts and chains in use there at the present time.
- To discontinue for the duration of the war, the traffic lights at the intersections of Pleasant and Myrtle Streets, Pleasant and Summer Streets, and Myrtle and Mulberry Streets.

Consideraion be given to the remodeling of the cell block in any post war plans.

REMARKS

I wish to thank members of the Claremont Chamber of Commerce for the valuable assistance and cooperation that they have given to me and to this department this past year, and to the N. H. State Police, Claremont Auxiliary Police, Claremont Fire Department, local telephone operators, and to the many other persons who have contributed their assistance in helping to make this Department a better one.

Since May, this Department has been without the services of Officer Charles J. Blake as a result of an accident. His place in the Department has been left vacant.

During June, Officer Francis L. Desmarais left this Department to go into the U. S. Navy. Special Officer Armand M. Normandin has been substituting for him.

During this past year this Department has checked the records of several thousand persons, not only for persons entering the Armed Services, Government Agencies, but for concerns throughout New England that are on defense work.

This last year a modern two-way F M Radio was added to our equipment for the use of both the Police and Fire Departments. The main station is located in police headquarters and each department has two mobile units. The station call letters are W K T X. All officers are required to hold at least a Restricted Radio Telephone Operator Permit. Lieut. Basil Cutting of the N. H. State Police supervised the installation, conducted the Officer's license examinations and has agreed to supervise and make any needed

repairs, all without expense to the town of Claremont for his time or travel. The radio has been in use for six months, and its use has been so valuable that we wonder how we managed for so long without radio.

For a period from July 26, 1943 to December 31, 1943, there were 3,559 transmissions made.

A great deal is being said about Juvenile Delinquency. The public has been led to believe that the present generation has "gone wild." This is not true in Claremont.

We had over a 100 per cent increase over 1942 in the number of Juveniles in court. A very large percentage of these children were charged with being brought up without proper parental supervision. Surely, the children are in no way to blame for this existing condition.

I have found in my experience in investigating juvenile delinquents that the problem originates with Adult Delinquency, and there can be no immediate changes made in Juvenile Delinquency until Adult Delinquency is taken care of.

This year we had a 600 per cent increase of adults over 1942 of arrests for felonies.

I wish at this time to thank publicly Rev. Thomas S. Hansberry, formerly of St. Mary's Parish, for the most wonderful work that he did for the young people in Claremont during the short time that he was in our town.

CHIEF ENGINEER'S REPORT

To the Board of Selectmen:

I hereby submit my report for the year ending January 31, 1944.

There were 15 Bell Alarms and 302 Still Alarms, making a total of 317 Alarms. There were no disastrous fires during the past year, although the Department answered more Bell Alarms in 1943 than 1942, the fire loss for this year is only \$2,752.59 more than last year.

With exceptions the Apparatus is in good condition, but when the war is over I would recommend that the Town purchase a new Ladder Truck and a combination Booster and Pumper to replace the present Truck, which is 14 years old and has had a lot of service, and requires repairs after almost every trip that it makes.

Being unable to purchase any fire alarm boxes, no additional Boxes have been installed during the past year. The fire alarm system is in fair condition, but several of the old boxes should be replaced with new boxes. This should be done as soon as new boxes can be purchased.

Three hundred feet of $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch, double jacket hose was purchased during the year. The Department has on hand 7,800 feet of good double jacket $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose and 1,500 feet old $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose. No new hydrants have been added during the past year.

Two Way Radio has been installed in two of the trucks during the year. In many cases this has proved to be of great value to the Department when additional help is needed at the fire, and notifying the Station of the condition at the fire, and also directing the truck to the location of the fire.

REMARKS

To the Board of Selectmen, Police Department, Telephone Operators, American Legion, Auxiliary Firemen, Officers and Members of the Department and the Public in general, I wish to express my appreciation for the cooperation and assistance given me the past year.

REPORT OF THE VICTORY GARDEN SUPERVISOR

To the Board of Selectmen:

Town Victory Garden enrollments were received in April 1943 and land obtained and prepared on Breck Avenue, Cossitt Avenue, South Street, the Bluff, and the Howe Farm on Elm Street. Fifty-six lots were provided and this took care of the 47 adult applicants as well as 22 smaller youth gardens. During the garden season more than 448 visits were made to these Town Victory Garden plots and over 279 interviews held with the gardeners at their gardens. Bulletin boards were put up at each of the five plots and arrangements made for a water supply for spraying. A constant check was made for insect and disease troubles, and warnings posted on the individual gardens. A spray rig was provided and demonstrations given to gardeners who had no equipment of their own. Very little stealing or trespass trouble was encountered and the production averaged very high according to a survey made by experts from the State University.

Besides the Town Gardens, over 200 interviews were held with local home gardeners and youth gardeners about garden problems, chiefly insect and disease control. Seasonable newspaper publicity was provided as well as State and Federal bulletins on the latest Victory Garden information.

The Garden Supervisor wishes to thank J. Laban Ainsworth, Ernest Forbes, and S. W. Colby who as members of the Town Committee did so much to make the garden program a success. Also appreciation is expressed to the Extension Service for their practical assistance.

THE DARTMOUTH-LAKE SUNAPEE REGION

The Legislature of 1937 authorized the establishment of six Regions, each comprising a group of towns suggested by the State Planning and Development Commission. The Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region comprises this town and 37 others in this section of the state. The Region is incorporated as a non-profit corporation and its affairs are supervised by a group of officers chosen annually. The Region employs a full time secretary who is paid by the state (not by the towns). Thus your Region is a set-up established by law and the matter of whether or not it has sufficient financial support to render real service to your community rests with the voters of the towns. During its existence the Darmouth-Lake Sunapee Region can point to the following accomplishments. Through the publicity it has issued

it has brought visitors to every town, some have established summer homes and others have become permanent residents. It has been instrumental in bringing industries to several towns. It has inaugurated plans that have saved historic landmarks. It has sponsored paying summer attractions. It has been active in bringing about a survey of our mineral resources that has resulted in revenue to many towns and has conducted studies of new agricultural products.

By an appropriation not exceeding 1-100 of 1% of the assessed valuation the Region now asks the support of your town in continuing the program that has brought about the aforementioned results and to institute the following three projects which if carried through must result in added income to each of the 38 towns of the Region. (1) A research of the possibilities of establishing industries that will use as raw material, minerals within our area and make a study of the feasibility of the production, processing and sale of several agricultural products that in the past have received but little attention. (2) To cooperate with each of the towns in preparing descriptive pamphlets showing the attractions, natural advantages and resources of the community with the idea of evenutally incorporating such material into a book descriptive of the whole Region. (3) To establish a system of Recreation Trails following back highways and little used roads leading to scenic areas and desirable locations in each of the 38 towns in the Region. As it is not deemed proper to devote more space in your Town Report to this subject, details have been omitted; however, letters of inquiry regarding any matter here mentioned will be welcome and given careful reply. Address, Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region, New London, N. H.




