HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES - IT PAYS!

Prevention is one of the most important phases of all fire effort. This is particularly true of forest fire control work. Preventing forest fires preserves valuable forest growth and other property, conserves man power and permits their use in productive channels, saves taxpayers' money and conserves fire fighting equipment.

The prevention of forest fires is the most important and difficult part of the work of your forest fire warden who heads a local organization set up primarily for the security of your community's forest property. Appointed by the State Forester, upon recommendation of the Selectmen, he is charged by law with the responsibility of local administration of forest fire laws, fire prevention and suppression. In his work he is aided by deputy forest fire wardens who, in emergency, may assume his power and authority. The warden is guided in his work by instructions received from the State Forester and by the District Fire Chief who represents the State Forester.

The importance and value of the work of the forest fire warden and his deputies is, perhaps, best appreciated during hazardous periods when fire danger is greatest. The public, however, looks to him at all times for speedy and economical suppression of going fires.

To properly fulfill his mission, the warden needs the generous and understanding cooperation of the public at large. He attempts to secure this cooperation by the posting of caution notices, news items and by word of mouth, always carefully explaining the necessity of restrictions imposed. In the matter of giving cooperation, however, the public often fails. The record shows that an average of 7,300 acres of woodland are burned over by forest fires in New Hampshire each year. Analysis of fire causes reveal the fact that more than 98 percent of all forest fires are, consistently, the result of human carelessness and are preventable.


The careless smoker fails to properly extinguish his cigar, cigarette or pipe ashes or thoughtlessly throws them from the car window; the debris burner fails or refuses to consult the warden, as the law requires when the ground is not covered with snow, before attempting to burn; campers fail to properly extinguish their fires or frequently build fires when conditions are unfavorable.

The elimination of human causes from the forest fire problem is the answer. This is not as difficult of accomplishment as it might appear at first glance. Let each one who reads this -

1. Use ordinary common sense with fire in and near woodland.
2. Comply with requirements on the use of fire in and near woodland and when the ground is not covered with snow, secure written permission to burn from the forest fire warden.
3. Be careful when smoking in or near woodlands. Don't throw lighted material from moving vehicles.
4. Cooperate with and assist the warden and urge others to do so.
5. HELP YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN PREVENT FIRES - his efforts are only as effective as is the cooperation you give him!

Warrant

To the inhabitants of the Town of Columbia, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for one year ensuing.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for three years ensuing.
4. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Auditors for the year ensuing.
5. To choose by ballot and major vote, Library Trustees for the year next ensuing.
6. To choose by ballot and major vote a Tax Collector for the year ensuing.
7. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor for the year ensuing.
9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges.
10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct its Selectmen to take such action regard-

ing rolling, plowing or otherwise, in keeping winter roads open in said Town for the year ensuing, as in their judgment seems most conducive to the best interests of the Town, and appropriate money for the same.

11. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purposes the sum of \$397.07; and the State will contribute the sum of \$1,588.29.
12. To see if the Town will vote to elect one or more road agents to serve the Town for the year ensuing, and if one or more is elected, to define the limits of said district or districts that is to be covered by such road agents as elected.
13. To see if the Town will vote to instruct and authorize its Selectmen to enter into a contract for a term of years with the Public Service Company of New Hampshire for the purpose of street lighting at the Valley, so-called, in said Town of Columbia, and to do any and all matters and things necessary to execute a proper contract touching the premises, and make appropriations for the same.
14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to contribute to the White Mountain Region Association.
15. To raise sums of money as may be necessary for the upkeep of cemeteries.
16. To see what action the Town will take with reference to hiring the Colebrook Fire Department for the purpose of extinguishing of fires, in said Town, and in event of favorable action, to make the necessary appropriation for the same.
17. To see if the Town will vote to fix the price per day for the hiring manual labor, teams and trucks for work on town roads.

18. To see if the Town will vote to Authorize the Selectmen to incur the debts for temporary loans in anticipation of the taxes of the ensuing municipal year and to pay such debts out of the tax money when it is received.
19. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.
20. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of the town charges for the ensuing year.
21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct its Selectmen to purchase a snow plow or other equipment for the construction and maintenance of highways in said Town, and make appropriation for the same.
22. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a certain highway in said Town of Columbia, and thus described:

"Commencing on the Town Line between the Town of Colebrook, N. H., and said Town of Columbia at a point southerly of what is known as the Fry Holden place; thence south easterly on the now traveled road until it ends at the old Barbor Building, so-called."
23. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value, and to raise money to pay for the same.
24. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

- 25. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, Selectmen, and all other officers and ratify and confirm the same.
- 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to apply on Town Indebtedness.
- 27. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.
