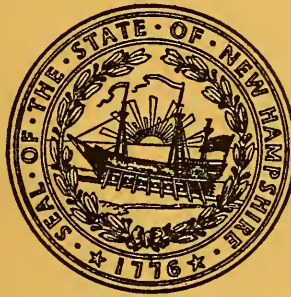

# TOWN WARRANT

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Conway, County of Carroll  
qualified to vote in Town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Kennett High School Auditorium at Conway, New Hampshire, March 8, 1955, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers.

Art. 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes:

- Section a. Town officers' salaries
- b. Town officers' expenses
  - c. Election and registration expenses
  - d. Municipal Court expenses
  - e. Expenses of Town Hall and other town buildings
  - f. Police department
  - g. Fire department
  - h. Insurance
  - i. Civil Defense
  - j. Health department
  - k. Vital statistics
  - l. Town office expense
  - m. Town dump

- n. Town maintenance of highway, summer and winter, new equipment
- o. Libraries
- p. Town poor
- q. Old age assistance
- r. Memorial Day
- s. Soldiers aid
- t. Parks and playgrounds
- u. Damage and legal expense
- v. F.I.A.C.
- w. Interest on temporary loans and bonds
- x. Payment on bond issue
- y. County tax

Art. 3. To see if the Town Meeting will set all town officers' salaries.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time that they take their inventory of Head and Poll taxes.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire upon the credit of the town such sums of money as may be needed. Such sums not to exceed the combined School, Town and County tax budget in anticipation of taxes raised for Town, County and School purposes.

Art. 6. To see if the town will vote to re-appropriate the unexpended balance of \$1,100 as raised and appropriated under Article 7 in last year's warrant for the completion of the new Skimobile road in North Conway.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,030.20 for Town Road Aid with the State contributing \$6,868.03 and to see if the town will raise and appropriate \$4,540 for Class IV Urban with the State contributing \$4,540 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for State Aid Construction with the State contributing \$4,000.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50 for the purpose of mailing inventory blanks to all taxpayers on the property warrant records.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000, \$500 to be paid to the North Conway Chamber of Commerce for the North Conway Information Booth, and \$500 to be paid to the Conway Chamber of Commerce for the Conway Information Booth. Agreeable to a petition signed by Edgar P. Oaks and others.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to the White Mountains Region Association for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and advertising and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in co-operation with the other 45 towns in the region. Agreeable to a petition signed by Ralph L. Grindle and others.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town of Conway will vote to raise and appropriate to assist in maintaining the Memorial Hospital at North Conway. Agreeable to a petition signed by Harold W. Thorne and others.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550 to defray the cost of perambulation of town lines.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper drainage of Mechanic street, North Conway Village.



Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the purchase of a flexible sewer rod, couplings and accessories.

Art. 15. To act upon any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# Report of Police Department

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The Conway Municipal Court handled a total of 179 criminal cases exclusive of juvenile matters in 1954. Seven cases of serious nature were bound over to Superior Court. The remaining 172 included 81 motor vehicle violations, the balance of 91 being the usual misdemeanors such as brawls, larceny, non-support, etc.

The Conway Police Department answered 412 calls for assistance, four persons were taken to the State Hospital in Concord, one person was taken to the State Institution for Alcoholics, one person was taken to the Laconia Clinic and one person involved in the theft of a motor vehicle was returned from Belknap County to Ossipee Jail to await the Grand Jury. Eight persons were taken to the county jail in Ossipee for offenses such as A.W.O.L. from the services, assault, disorderly conduct, etc.

This department investigated a total of 63 accidents. Forty-six of them were over \$50 damage, two of them fatal accidents, the rest were of a minor nature under \$50. Numerous warnings were given for improper operation of motor vehicles and in some cases a summons was issued when a warning failed to be heeded. Sixty-eight transients were lodged in the Police Station overnight and a few were given meals if they had no money.

The Conway police settled many disputes and disturbances and many calls were received after 2 A.M. in the morning. Finger prints were taken for persons joining the C.A.P. and different branches of the service. Many character checks were also made.

The Police Department helped many motorists in distress and changed a number of tires for women drivers. Providing gasoline at night was frequently requested and in many cases gasoline was taken to autos stranded on the highway. Urgent messages were delivered by the Police Department when they could not be delivered by phone. Bicycles that were found on

the street after midnight were put in the police station until the owners could be found. Courtesy tickets were issued for many minor infractions of parking. Defective equipment tags were given to many motorists for improper functioning of tail lights, head lights, muffler, etc. These tags are actually courtesy tags, returnable to the Motor Vehicle Department, and allows a person seven days to get the equipment properly repaired. People should not take offense when an officer issues these because they are for the safe operation of a motor vehicle.

Other than regular duties of patrolling, checking and working of motor vehicle violations is the duty of policing at Town Meeting, graduations, parades, funerals, traffic duty in resurfacing of roads and traffic duty during the ski season. Many visitors to the Conways have commented on our uniforms. Their comments have been most appreciated.

This year will be the end of our local telephone exchange and its local operators. May I take this opportunity to pay special thanks to the telephone operators for their co-operation and faithful assistance to the Police Department.

This department also takes this opportunity to acknowledge with appreciation all assistance received from all other enforcement agencies.

I hereby submit to you my first report as librarian of the Conway Public Library. It was with much humbleness that I took over the librarianship, following the resignation of Miss Alice Pollard, who served you so faithfully and efficiently for more than 40 years. In appreciation of her worthiness, citizens of Conway and summer friends presented her with a bouquet of flowers with 40 one dollar bills attached to streamers and centered with an envelope of money.

I have endeavored to follow along in the pattern set by your former librarian. We have tried for a close relationship between the school and the library. This fall, shelves were set aside for the teachers to assemble books for their current book reports. This has proved most satisfactory to the pupil, the teacher and the librarian. In lieu of a children's room the children's table, formerly in the alcove, has been moved to space in the stack room. That, too, seems to be a favorable move.

# REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDENS

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Howdy folks. This is your friend, Smokey, the fire-prevention bear talking for L. T. Savard, Sr., your local forest fire warden. You know how he is always asking you people to take it easy with fire in the woods? Well, he wants you to know that forest fires decreased last year. He knows it did rain some but it was the help of all you people who are giving your time and money and carefulness to prevent this shameful waste of our woodlands. But please remember this, folks, forest fires still do a lot of damage each year. And we've got to work and work to whittle them down to our size. So when you're around forest areas, crush out your cigarette, hold your match till it's cold, drown your campfire and drown it again. If you have to burn grass or brush or rubbish, ask about the law first, also get your permit from your warden and last, have plenty of help handy. Please remember a permit is required for all open fires whether in an incinerator or on a piece of plowed ground. Your local forest fire warden will help you in your burning problem and he is as close as your telephone. Please call him.

Each year forest fires destroy enough sawtimber to build all the homes in a city of one-half million people.

Each year forest fires eat up enough sawtimber to make ties for 50,000 miles of railroad tracks.

Each year forest fires destroy enough pulp-size trees to provide a 12 months supply of newsprint for every newspaper in the United States.

Agreeably to the foregoing Warrant the Annual Meeting of the School District was called to order at the hour named, at the Kennett High School by Burnham B. Davis, Moderator, who read the Warrant, Certificate and Oath of Posting.

Under Art. 1. Burnham B. Davis was unanimously elected Moderator for the ensuing year.

Under Art. 2. Neil C. Cates was unanimously elected Clerk for the ensuing year.

Under Art. 3. Ralph L. Grindle was unanimously elected Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Under Art. 4. Chester Lucy and David Schurman were unanimously elected as auditors for the ensuing year.

Under Art. 5. Ellis W. McKeen was unanimously elected a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Under Art. 6. Ernest Gerry, Jr., was unanimously elected a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Under Art. 7. It was voted that the sum of two hundred seventy-one thousand one hundred four and 40/100 dollars (\$271,104.40) be appropriated for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and that this sum less the money received from the state equalization and other estimated revenue of the District be certified to the selectmen to be raised by taxes by the town.

Under Art. 8. It was voted that a sum not exceeding eighteen hundred (\$1,800) dollars be raised and appropriated for the installation of an incinerator at Kennett High School.

Under Art. 9. It was voted that the sum of twelve hundred (\$1,200) dollars be raised and appropriated for repointing, waterproofing and re-caulking the East Wing of Kennett High School building.

Under Art. 10. It was voted to elect the officers of the School District by an official ballot and that the non-partisan

system of elections as provided by Sections 112-120 of Chapter 34 of the Revised Laws be adopted by the District.

Under Art. 11. Voted to pass over the Article.

Voted to adjourn.

# Report of Superintendent

*To the Citizens of Conway:*

It is essential to review the important events leading to our present position regarding school buildings.

For the last seven years the Conway School Board has provided the leadership in an effort to secure new elementary school buildings. The Conway School Board, working with three different building committees, presented several plans, the original of which was to build a consolidated school that would serve both the villages of North Conway and Conway. This and all subsequent plans were rejected by the voters until October 24, 1953. At this special school district meeting it was voted to appropriate the sum of \$260,000 to build and equip six-room buildings in North Conway and Conway to be located on the same sites and adjacent to the old buildings. We were assured by the architectural firm of Anderson-Nichols and Company that this sum of money was sufficient to build and equip these two schools.

After many meetings it was evident that what had originally been promised could never become a reality. We were completely misinformed about what could be done for this amount of money. The Conway School Board and building committees reluctantly accepted cut after cut in the building specifications of essential and desirable features. Still, on May 21, 1954, the lowest bid was \$49,500 more than had been allocated for construction purposes. Two months later, after many more revisions and adaptations in the building specifications, the buildings were rebid and this time the lowest bid exceeded our appropriation by \$28,400. Since we were unwilling to accept any further cuts and drastic modifications of the already much-revised building specifications, we were forced to sever all relationships with this architectural firm.

In July of 1954 we entered into negotiations with the Manufacturers Trust Co. of New York for the acquisition of the Birchmont Club (Payson-Tucker) property as a gift to the school district to be used as a site for a school building. A record of the



correspondence between the bank and the Conway School Board shows that such a possibility was not only desirable but highly probable. For eight months we waited for an answer from the bank. However, just three weeks ago we were informed that a bid had been received for this property and it therefore was unavailable to us as a gift.

As the Conway School Board could not submit a bid for this property without previous authorization by the voters of the school district, Mr. Robert Kennett and I went to New York hoping that we could personally convey to the officials of the bank the importance and desirability of school district ownership. We did request, (1) that consideration as an outright gift not be abandoned, (2) that the bank sell it to the school district at a nominal price, and (3) that acceptance of the bid they had received be delayed until the matter could be brought before the annual school district meeting. As of today we are still waiting for a final decision from the bank.

When it became apparent that we were not going to have new buildings during this current school year, we converted the second floor of the Conway Precinct building into two classrooms and rented the Community Center building at North Conway as a classroom.

This year has seen the development and adoption of new report cards which have been enthusiastically accepted. This was a necessary step forward in our effort to provide a better means of reporting pupil progress as well as providing the source for teachers to advise with pupils. It offers a basis for evaluating pupil progress in a conclusive manner in the areas of academic progress and in the most significant aspects of social attitudes and behavior.

We have also adopted a new cumulative record system which now brings together and collates all the information which the school has about each individual pupil. It establishes a basic organizational device for the whole guidance program. It is developed for use throughout the 12 years of school and does the following:

1. It is now possible for teachers to record the pertinent

facts and impressions which they consider to be most significant in revealing and shaping the development of pupils.

2. It indicates trends of growth and shows strengths and weaknesses of pupils.

3. It accumulates information on each area of a pupil's experience and development over a period of years.

4. It presents information so clearly that a new principal or teacher can read and understand the record without difficulty.

5. It is used by all staff members as an aid in their daily work with pupils.

The most important accomplishment of the year, as it relates to the continued success of our whole educational program, was the adoption of a salary guide for teachers. It establishes policy governing annual increments, employment practices, sick leave benefits, and professional growth requirements. It has been most favorably accepted by our teaching staff and has already induced several beginning teachers to come to Conway.

I want to take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation to the Conway School Board for their untiring efforts toward the improvement of our educational program, and to the members of the building committee for their efforts and services to obtain new school buildings.

## REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

I hereby submit by report as school nurse for the year 1953-1954:

Health services offered the children of the Conway schools included vision testing, hearing testing, patch testing for tuberculosis, chest X-ray, inoculations for whooping cough, tetanus and diphtheria in the first and second grades; physical exami-

nations by the doctors and inspections by the school nurse.

The nurse made weekly visits to the schools and at this time the teachers were given an opportunity to talk with her concerning the health of their pupils. Communicable disease control is exercised, as far as possible, by the exclusion of children showing signs of illness, and also by requesting the cooperation of parents in carrying out the morning check-up before allowing children to attend daily sessions.

In the fall of 1953, 289 pupils from the first, fourth and seventh grades were transported by the school bus to the Memorial Hospital in North Conway for physical examinations which included both blood and urine tests. In addition, 241 pupils received a physical examination or heart check-up at Kennett High School by Dr. George V. Spring before they participated in sports or the physical education program. A report of all physical defects discovered was sent to the parents by mail, and a follow-up visit was made by the nurse regarding defects that needed immediate attention.

The dental program extends over the whole year and there is need of considerable improvement in this area. Notices were sent to the parents of all children who needed dental attention. In May and June, 1954, Dr. Daniel Sullivan devoted one morning a week, at a greatly reduced rate, to the correction of tooth decay. A selected group of pupils from the first and second grades were taken to the dentist's office every Wednesday morning until the work was completed. The percentage of dental corrections in the past few years has ranged from 35 to 40 per cent. With the addition of two new dentists in the district, the dental work should be greatly improved.

May I express my sincere appreciation for the assistance rendered by members of the School Board, Superintendent of Schools, Teachers, Red Cross Motor Corps, Salvation Army, State Sight Conservation Program, Women's Clubs, Parent-Teacher Association, Doctors, Nurses, Hospital, lay people, and everyone interested in the School Health Program.
