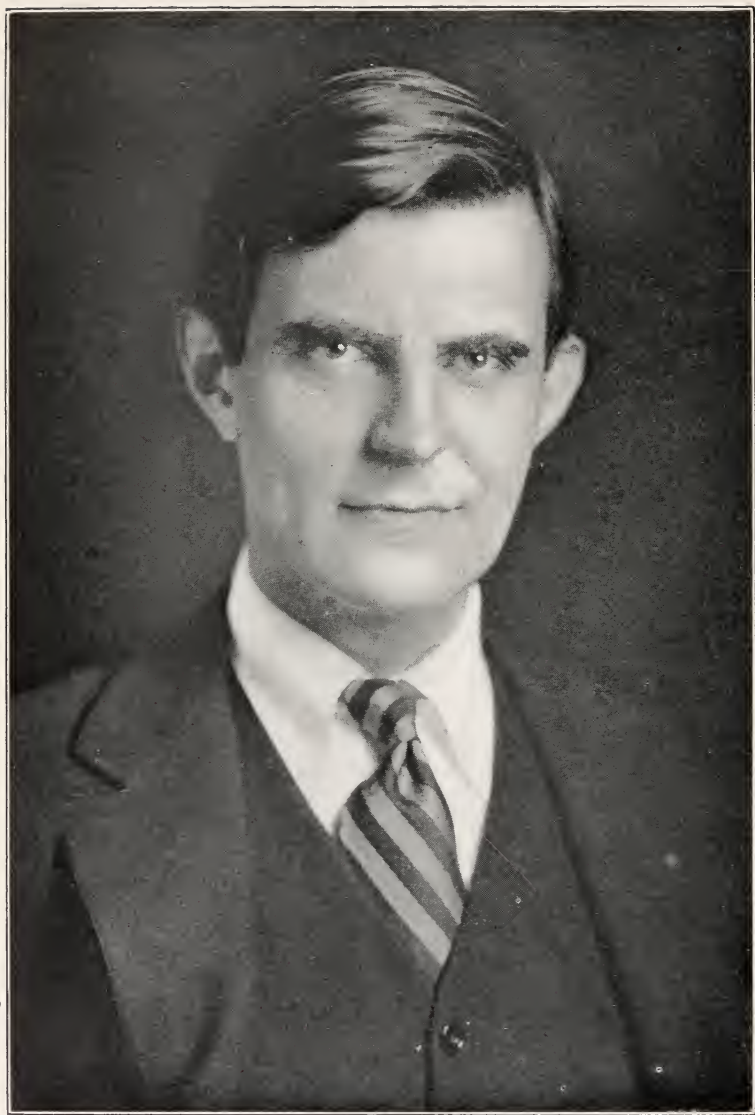

CONSTITUTION

of the

State of New Hampshire

ESTABLISHED OCTOBER 31, 1783, TO TAKE EFFECT JUNE 2, 1784, AS SUBSEQUENTLY AMENDED AND IN FORCE JANUARY 1, 1933.*

All amendments are shown by notes at the bottom of the page indicating the year in which they took effect. The amendments of 1792, "so far as relates to the choice of the members of the legislature and the executive officers of the state, county treasurer and recorder of deeds," took effect on February 1, 1793, and all others on the first Wednesday of June, 1793.

The amendments of 1850 took effect September 16, 1852; those of 1876, August 1, 1877, October 1, 1878, and the first Wednesday of June, 1879, as indicated in the foot notes; those of 1889, April 2, 1889; those of 1902 on March 26, 1903; and those of 1912 on November 20, 1912.

The numbering of the sections of Part II first appeared in the Revised Statutes of 1842. In 1889, when the tenth section of Part II was stricken out, all subsequent sections were renumbered, with the result of making much confusion in citations. In this copy the original numbering has been placed in parenthesis at the side of the revised number.

PART FIRST

BILL OF RIGHTS.

ARTICLE 1st. All men are born equally free and independent: Therefore, all government, of right, originates from the people, is founded in consent, and instituted for the general good.

[ART.] *2^d. All men have certain natural, essential, and inherent rights—among which are, the enjoying and defending life and liberty; acquiring, possessing, and protecting, property; and, in a word, of seeking and obtaining happiness.

[ART.] 3^d. When men enter into a state of society, they surrender up some of their natural rights to that society, in order to ensure the protection of others; and, without such an equivalent, the surrender is void.

[ART.] 4th. Among the natural rights, some are, in their very nature unalienable, because no equivalent can be given or received for them. Of this kind are the Rights of Conscience.

[ART.] 5th. Every individual has a natural and unalienable right to worship God according to the dictates of his own conscience, and reason; and no subject shall be hurt, molested, or restrained, in his person, liberty, or estate, for worshipping God in the manner and season most agreeable to the dictates of his own conscience; or for his religious profession, sentiments, or persuasion: provided he doth not disturb the public peace or disturb others in their religious worship.

[ART.] 6th. As morality and piety, rightly grounded on evangelical principles, will give the best and greatest security to government, and will lay, in the hearts of men, the strongest obligations to due subjection; and as the knowledge of these is

most likely to be propagated through a society, by the institution of the public worship of the Deity, and of public instruction in morality and religion; therefore, to promote those important purposes, the people of this state have a right to empower, and do hereby fully empower, the legislature, to authorize, from time to time, the several towns, parishes, bodies corporate, or religious societies, within this state, to make adequate provision, at their own expense, for the support and maintenance of public Protestant teachers of piety, religion, and morality:

Provided notwithstanding, that the several towns, parishes, bodies corporate, or religious societies, shall, at all times, have the exclusive right of electing their own public teachers, and of contracting with them for their support and maintenance. And no person, of any one particular religious sect or denomination, shall ever be compelled to pay towards the support of the teacher or teachers of another persuasion, sect, or denomination.

And every denomination of Christians, demeaning themselves quietly, and as good subjects of the state, shall be equally under the protection of the law: And no subordination of any one sect or denomination to another, shall ever be established by law.

And nothing herein shall be understood to affect any former contracts made for the support of the ministry; but all such contracts shall remain, and be in the same state as if this constitution had not been made.

[ART.] 7th. The people of this state have the sole and exclusive right of governing themselves as a free, sovereign, and independent state; and do, and forever hereafter shall, exercise and enjoy every power, jurisdiction, and right, pertaining thereto, which is not, or may not hereafter be, by them expressly delegated to the United States of America in congress assembled.

[ART.] 8th. All power residing originally in, and being derived from, the people, all the magistrates and officers of government are their substitutes and agents, and at all times accountable to them.

[ART.] 9th. No office or place whatsoever, in government, shall be hereditary—the abilities and integrity requisite in all, not being transmissible to posterity or relations.

[ART.] 10th. Government being instituted for the common benefit, protection, and security, of the whole community, and not for the private interest or emolument of any one man, family, or class of men; therefore, whenever the ends of government are perverted, and public liberty manifestly endangered, and all other means of redress are ineffectual, the people may, and of right ought, to reform the old, or establish a new government. The doctrine of nonresistance against arbitrary power, and oppression, is absurd, slavish, and destructive of the good and happiness of mankind.

[ART.] 11th. All elections ought to be free, and every inhabitant of the state, having the proper qualifications, has equal right to elect, and be elected, into office; [but no person shall have the right to vote or be eligible to office under the constitution of this state who shall not be able to read the constitution in the English language and to write; *provided, however*, that this provision shall not apply to any person prevented by a physical disability from complying with its requisitions, nor to any person who now has the right to vote, nor to any person who shall be sixty years of age or upwards on the first day of January, A. D. 1904;]* [and *provided further*, that no person shall have the right to vote, or be eligible to office under the constitution of this state who shall have been convicted of treason, bribery, or any wilful violation of the election laws

of this state or of the United States; but the supreme court may, on notice to the attorney-general restore the privileges of an elector to any person who may have forfeited them by conviction of such offences.]†

[ART.] 12th. Every member of the community has a right to be protected by it, in the enjoyment of his life, liberty, and property; he is therefore bound to contribute his share in the expense of such protection, and to yield his personal service when necessary, or an equivalent. But no part of a man's property shall be taken from him, or applied to public uses, without his own consent, or that of the representative body of the people. Nor are the inhabitants of this state controllable by any other laws than those to which they, or their representative body, have given their consent.

[ART.] 13th. No person, who is conscientiously scrupulous about the lawfulness of bearing arms, shall be compelled thereto, provided he will pay an equivalent.

[ART.] 14th. Every subject of this state is entitled to a certain remedy, by having recourse to the laws, for all injuries he may receive in his person, property, or character; to obtain right and justice freely, without being obliged to purchase it; completely, and without any denial; promptly, and without delay; conformably to the laws.

[ART.] 15th. No subject shall be held to answer for any crime, or offense, until the same is fully and plainly, substantially and formally, described to him; or be compelled to accuse or furnish evidence against himself. And every subject shall have a right to produce all proofs that may be favorable to himself; to meet the witnesses against him face to face, and to be fully heard in his defense, by himself,

and counsel. And no subject shall be arrested, imprisoned, despoiled, or deprived of his property, immunities, or privileges, put out of the protection of the law, exiled or deprived of his life, liberty, or estate, but by the judgment of his peers, or the law of the land.

[ART.] 16th. No subject shall be liable to be tried, after an acquittal, for the same crime or offense. Nor shall the legislature make any law that shall subject any person to a capital punishment, (excepting for the government of the army and navy, and the militia in actual service) without trial by jury.

[ART.] 17th. In criminal prosecutions, the trial of facts, in the vicinity where they happened, is so essential to the security of the life, liberty, and estate, of the citizen, that no crime or offense ought to be tried in any other county than that in which it is committed;—except in cases of general insurrection in any particular county, when it shall appear to the judges of the superior court, that an impartial trial cannot be had in the county where the offense may be committed, and upon their report, the [legislature]* shall think proper to direct the trial in the nearest county in which an impartial trial can be obtained.

[ART.] 18th. All penalties ought to be proportioned to the nature of the offense. No wise legislature will affix the same punishment to the crimes of theft, forgery, and the like, which they do to those of murder and treason. Where the same undistinguishing severity is exerted against all offenses, the people are led to forget the real distinction in the crimes themselves, and to commit the most flagrant with as little compunction as they do† the lightest [offenses]:‡ For the same reason a

multitude of sanguinary laws is both impolitic and unjust. The true design of all punishments being to reform, not to exterminate mankind.

[ART.] 19th. [Every subject hath a right to be secure from all unreasonable searches and seizures of his person, his houses, his papers, and all his possessions. Therefore, all warrants to search suspected places, or arrest a person for examination or trial, in prosecutions for criminal matters, are contrary to this right, if the cause or foundation of them be not previously supported by oath or affirmation; and if the order, in a warrant to a civil officer, to make search in suspected places, or to arrest one or more suspected persons or to seize their property, be not accompanied with a special designation of the persons or objects of search, arrest, or seizure; and no warrant ought to be issued, but in cases, and with the formalities, prescribed by law.]*

[ART.] 20th. In all controversies concerning property—and in all suits between two or more persons, except in cases in which it has been heretofore otherwise used and practiced, [and except in cases in which the value in controversy does not exceed one hundred dollars, and title of real estate is not concerned]† the parties have a right to a trial by jury and this method of procedure shall be held sacred, unless, in cases arising on the high seas and such as relates to mariners' wages the legislature shall think it necessary hereafter to alter it.

[ART.] 21st. In order to reap the fullest advantage of the inestimable privilege of the trial by jury, great care ought to be taken, that none but qualified persons should be appointed to serve; and such ought to [be]‡ fully compensated for their travel, time, and attendance.

[ART.] 22^d. The *liberty of the press* is essential to the security of freedom in a state: It ought, therefore, to be inviolably preserved.

[ART.] 23^d. Retrospective laws are highly injurious, oppressive, and unjust. No such laws therefore, should be made, either for the decision of civil causes, or the punishment of offenses.

[ART.] 24th. A well regulated militia is the proper, natural, and sure defense, of a state.

Militia.

[ART.] 25th. Standing armies are dangerous to liberty, and ought not to be raised, or kept up, without the consent of the legislature.

[ART.] 26th. In all cases, and at all times, the military ought to be under strict subordination to, and governed by, the civil power.

[ART.] 27th. No soldier in time of peace, shall be quartered in any house, without the consent of the owner; and in time of war, such quarters ought not to be made but by the civil magistrate, in a manner ordained by the legislature.

[ART.] 28th. No subsidy, charge, tax, impost, or duty, shall be established, fixed, laid, or levied, under any pretext whatsoever, without the consent of the people, or their representatives in the legislature, or authority derived from that body.

[ART.] 29th. The power of suspending the laws, or the execution of them, ought never to be exercised but by the legislature, or by authority derived therefrom, to be exercised in such particular cases only as the legislature shall expressly provide for.

[ART.] 30th. The freedom of deliberation, speech, and debate, in either house of the legislature, is so essential to the rights of the people, that it cannot be the foundation of any action, complaint, or prosecution, in any other court or place whatsoever.

[ART.] 31st. [The legislature shall assemble for the redress of public grievances, and for making such laws as the public good may require.]*

[ART.] 32^d. The people have a right, in an orderly and peaceable manner, to assemble and consult upon the common good, give instructions to their representatives, and to request of the legislative body, by way of petition or remonstrance, redress of the wrongs done them, and of the grievances they suffer.

[ART.] 33^d. No magistrate, or court of law, shall demand excessive bail or sureties, impose excessive fines, or inflict cruel or unusual punishments.

[ART.] 34th. No person can, in any case, be subjected to law martial, or to any pains or penalties by virtue of that law, except those employed in the army or navy, and except the militia in actual service, but by authority of the legislature.

[ART.] 35th. [It is essential to the preservation of the rights of every individual, his life, liberty, property, and character, that there be an impartial interpretation of the laws, and administration of justice. It is the right of every citizen to be tried by judges as impartial as the lot of humanity will admit. It is therefore not only the best policy, but for the security of the rights of the people, that the judges of the supreme judicial court should hold their offices so long as they behave well; subject, however, to such limitations, on account of age, as may be provided by the constitution of the state; and that they should have honorable salaries, ascertained and established by standing laws.]†

[ART.] 36th. Economy being a most essential virtue in all states, especially in a young one; no pension shall be granted, but in consideration of actual services; and such pensions ought to be granted with great caution, by the legislature, and never for more than one year at a time.

[ART.] 38th. A frequent recurrence to the fundamental principles of the constitution, and a constant adherence to justice, moderation, temperance, industry, frugality, and all the social virtues, are indispensably necessary to preserve the blessings of liberty and good government; the people ought, therefore, to have a particular regard to all those principles in the choice of their officers and representatives, and they have a right to require of their lawgivers and magistrates, an exact and constant observance of them, in the formation and execution of the laws necessary for the good administration of government.

FORM OF GOVERNMENT.

[ART. 1.]* The people inhabiting the territory formerly called the province of New Hampshire, do hereby solemnly and mutually agree with each other, to form themselves into a free, sovereign and independent body-politic, or state, by the name of THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[ART. 4.] The general court shall forever have full power and authority to erect and constitute judicatories and courts of record, or other courts, to be holden, in the name of the state, for the hearing, trying, and determining, all manner of crimes, offenses, pleas, processes, complaints, actions, causes, matters and things whatsoever, arising or happening within this state, or between or concerning persons inhabiting or residing, or brought, within the same, whether the same be criminal or civil, or whether the crimes be capital, or not capital, and whether the said pleas be real, personal, or mixed; and for the awarding and issuing execution thereon. To which courts and judicatories, are hereby given and granted, full power and authority, from time to time, to administer oaths or affirmations, for the better discovery of truth in any matter in controversy, or depending before them.

[ART. 5.] And further, full power and authority are hereby given and granted to the said general court, from time to time, to make, ordain, and establish, all manner of wholesome and reasonable orders, laws, statutes, ordinances, directions, and instructions, either with penalties, or without, so as the same be not repugnant or contrary to this constitution, as they may judge for the benefit and welfare of this state, and for the governing and ordering thereof, and of the subjects of the same, for the necessary support and defense of the government thereof; and to name and settle [biennially],‡ or

provide by fixed laws for the naming and settling, all civil officers within this state; such officers excepted, the election and appointment of whom are hereafter in this form of government otherwise provided for; and to set forth the several duties, powers, and limits, of the several civil and military officers of this state, and the forms of such oaths or affirmations as shall be respectively administered unto them, for the execution of their several offices and places, so as the same be not repugnant or contrary to this constitution; and also to impose fines, mulcts, imprisonments, and other punishments; and to impose and levy proportional and reasonable assessments, rates, and taxes, upon all the inhabitants of, and residents within, the said state; and upon all estates within the same; to be issued and disposed of by warrant, under the hand of the [governor]* of this state for the time being, with the advice and consent of the council, for the public service, in the necessary defense and support of the government of this state, and the protection and preservation of the subjects thereof, according to such acts as are, or shall be, in force within the same; [provided that the general court shall not authorize any town to loan or give its money or credit directly or indirectly for the benefit of any corporation having for its object a dividend of profits or in any way aid the same by taking its stock or bonds.]†

[ART. 6.] [The public charges of government, or any part thereof, may be raised by taxation upon polls, estates, and other classes of property, including franchises and property when passing by will or inheritance; and there shall be a valuation of the estates within the state taken anew once in every five years, at least, and as much oftener as the general court shall order.]‡

And every officer, impeached for bribery, corruption, malpractice or maladministration in office, shall be served with an attested copy of the impeachment, and order of senate thereon with such citation as the senate may direct, setting forth the time and place of their sitting to try the impeachment; which service shall be made by the sheriff, or such other sworn officer as the senate may appoint, at least fourteen days previous to the time of trial; and

such citation being duly served and returned, the senate may proceed in the hearing of the impeachment, giving the person impeached, if he shall appear, full liberty of producing witnesses and proofs, and of making his defense, by himself and counsel, and may also, upon his refusing or neglecting to appear hear the proofs in support of the impeachment, and render judgment thereon, his non-appearance notwithstanding; and such judgment shall have the same force and effect as if the person impeached had appeared and pleaded in the trial.

And no person shall be eligible to this office, unless, at the time of his election, he shall have been an inhabitant of this state for seven years next preceding, and unless he shall be of the age of thirty years.‡

[ART. 42 (43).] In cases of disagreement between the two houses, with regard to the time or place of adjournment or prorogation, the governor, with advice of council, shall have a right to adjourn or prorogue the general court, not exceeding ninety days at any one time, as he may determine the public good may require, and he shall dissolve the same seven days before the said first Wednesday of [January].* And, in case of any infectious distemper prevailing in the place where the said court at any time is to convene, or any other cause, whereby dangers may arise to the health or lives of the members from their attendance, the governor may direct the session to be holden at some other the most convenient place within the state.

[ART. 43 (44).] Every bill which shall have passed both houses of the general court, shall, before it become a law, be presented to the governor, if he

approve, he shall sign it, but if not, he shall return it, with his objections, to that house in which it shall have originated, who shall enter the objections at large on their journal, and proceed to reconsider it; if after such reconsideration, two thirds of that house shall agree to pass the bill, it shall be sent, together with such objections, to the other house, by which it shall likewise be reconsidered, and, if approved by two thirds of that house, it shall become a law. But in all such cases the votes of both houses shall be determined by yeas and nays, and the names of the persons, voting for or against the bill, shall be entered on the journal of each house respectively. If any bill shall not be returned by the governor, within five days (Sundays excepted) after it shall have been presented to him, the same shall be a law in like manner as if he had signed it unless the legislature, by their adjournment, prevent its return, in which case it shall not be a law.

[ART. 44 (45).] Every resolve shall be presented to the governor, and before the same shall take effect, shall be approved by him, or being disapproved by him, shall be repassed by the senate and house of representatives, according to the rules and limitations prescribed in the case of a bill.

[ART. 45 (46).] All judicial officers, the attorney-general,* coroners,† and all officers of the navy, and general and field officers of the militia, shall be nominated and appointed by the governor and council; and every such nomination shall be made at least three days prior to such appointment; and no appointment shall take place, unless a majority of the council agree thereto.

[ART. 47 (48).] The captains and subalterns, in the respective regiments, shall be nominated and recommended by the field officers to the governor who is to issue their commissions immediately on receipt of such recommendation; [*provided*, that no person shall be so nominated and recommended until he shall have been examined and found duly qualified by an examining board appointed by the governor.]*

[ART. 48 (49).] Whenever the chair of the governor shall become vacant, by reason of his death, absence from the state, or otherwise, the president of the senate shall during such vacancy, have and exercise all the powers and authorities which by this constitution the governor is vested with, when personally present; but when the president of the senate shall exercise the office of governor, he shall not hold his office in the senate. [Whenever the chair both of the governor and of the president of the senate shall become vacant by reason of their death, absence from the state, or otherwise, the speaker of the house shall, during such vacancies, have and exercise all the powers and authorities which, by this constitution the governor is vested with when personally present. But when the speaker of the house shall exercise the office of governor, he shall not hold his office in the house.]†

[ART. 50 (51).] The governor of this state for the time being, shall be commander-in-chief of the army and navy, and all the military forces of the state, by sea and land; and shall have full power by himself, or by any chief commander, or other officer, or officers, from time to time, to train, instruct, exercise and govern the militia and navy; and for the special defense and safety of this state, to assemble in martial array, and put in warlike posture, the inhabitants thereof, and to lead and conduct them, and with them to encounter, repulse, repel, resist and pursue by force of arms, as well by sea as by land, within and without the limits of this state; and also to kill, slay, destroy, if necessary, and conquer by all fitting ways, enterprise and means, all and every such person and persons as shall, at any time hereafter, in a hostile manner, attempt or enterprise the destruction, invasion, detriment or annoyance of this state; and to use and exercise over the army and navy, and over the militia in actual service, the law martial in time of war, invasion, and also in rebellion, declared by the legislature to exist, as occasion shall necessarily require: And surprise, by all ways and means whatsoever, all and every such person or persons, with their ships, arms, ammunition, and other goods, as shall in a hostile manner invade, or attempt the invading, conquering or annoying this state; and in fine, the governor hereby is entrusted with all other powers incident to the office of captain-general and commander-in-chief, and admiral, to be exercised agreeably to the rules and regulations of the constitution, and the laws of the land; *provided*, that the governor shall not, at any time hereafter, by virtue of any power by this constitution granted, or hereafter to be granted to him by the legislature, transport any

of the inhabitants of this state, or oblige them to march out of the limits of the same, without their free and voluntary consent, or the consent of the general court, nor grant commissions for exercising the law martial in any case, without the advice and consent of the council.

[ART. 51 (52).] The power of pardoning offenses, except such as persons may be convicted of before the senate, by impeachment of the house, shall be in the governor, by and with the advice of council: But no charter of pardon, granted by the governor, with advice of council, before conviction, shall avail the party pleading the same, notwithstanding any general or particular expressions contained therein, descriptive of the offense or offenses intended to be pardoned.

[ART. 52 (53).] No officer duly commissioned to command in the militia shall be removed from his office, but by the address of both houses to the governor, or by fair trial in courtmartial, pursuant to the laws of the state for the time being.

being, by and with the advice and consent of the council, for the necessary support and defense of this state, and for the necessary protection and preservation of the inhabitants thereof, agreeably to the acts and resolves of the general court.

[ART. 56 (57).] All public boards, the commissary-general, all superintending officers of public magazines and stores belonging to this state, and all commanding officers of forts and garrisons within the same, shall, once, in every three months, officially, and without requisition, and at other times when required by the governor, deliver to him an account of all goods, stores, provisions, ammunition, cannon, with their appendages and all small arms, with their accoutrements, and of all other public property under their care respectively; distinguishing the quantity and kind of each, as particularly as may be; together with the condition of such forts and garrisons: And the commanding officer shall exhibit to the governor, when required by him true and exact plans of such forts, and of the land and sea, or harbor or harbors adjacent.

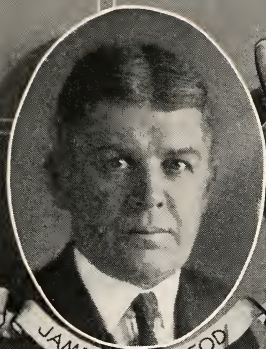
[ART. 61 (62).] If any person thus chosen a councilor, shall be elected governor or member of either branch of the legislature, and shall accept the trust: or if any person elected a councilor, shall refuse to accept the office, or in case of the death, resignation, or removal of any councilor out of the state, the governor may issue a precept for the election of a new councilor in that county where such vacancy shall happen and the choice shall be in the same manner as before directed: And the governor shall have full power and authority to convene the council, from time to time, at his discretion; and, with them, or the majority of them, may, and shall, from time to time hold a council, for ordering and directing the affairs of the state, according to the laws of the land.

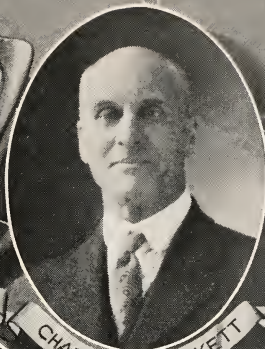

EXECUTIVE

COUNCIL

[ART. 62 (63).] The members of the council may be impeached by the house, and tried by the senate, for bribery, corruption, malpractice, or maladministration.

Impeachment of councilors.

[ART. 63 (64).] The resolutions and advice of the council shall be recorded by the secretary, in a register, and signed by all the members present agreeing thereto; and this record may be called for at any time, by either house of the legislature; and any member of the council may enter his opinion contrary to the resolutions of the majority, with the reasons for such opinion.

[ART. 64 (65).] The legislature may, if the public good shall hereafter require it, divide the state into five districts, as nearly equal as may be, governing themselves by the number of [population],* each district to elect a councilor: And, in case of such division, the manner of the choice shall be conformable to the present mode of election in counties.

[ART. 65 (66).] And, whereas the elections, appointed to be made by this constitution, on the first Wednesday of [January]† [biennially],‡ by the two houses of the legislature, may not be completed on that day, the said elections may be adjourned from day to day, until the same be completed: and the order of the elections shall be as follows—the vacancies in the senate, if any shall be first filled up: The governor shall then be elected, provided there shall be no choice of him by the people: And afterwards, the two houses shall proceed to fill up the vacancy, if any, in the council.

JUDICIARY POWER.

[ART. 72 (73).] The tenure that all commissioned officers shall have by law in their offices shall be expressed in their respective commissions, all judicial officers duly appointed commissioned and sworn, shall hold their offices during good behavior excepting those concerning whom there is a different provision made in this constitution. *Provided nevertheless* the [governor]** with consent of council, may remove them upon the address of both houses of the legislature.

ENCOURAGEMENT OF LITERATURE, TRADES, ETC.

[ART. 82 (83).] Knowledge and learning, generally diffused through a community, being essential to the preservation of a free government; and spreading the opportunities and advantages of education through the various parts of the country, being highly conducive to promote this end; it shall be the duty of the legislators and magistrates, in all future periods of this government, to cherish the interest of literature and the sciences, and all seminaries and public schools, to encourage private and public institutions, rewards, and immunities for the promotion of agriculture, arts, sciences, commerce, trades, manufactures, and natural history of the country; to countenance and inculcate the principles of humanity and general benevolence, public and private charity, industry and economy, honesty and punctu-

ality, sincerity, sobriety, and all social affections, and generous sentiments, among the people: [*Provided, nevertheless*, that no money raised by taxation shall ever be granted or applied for the use of the schools or institutions of any religious sect or denomination]*. [Free and fair competition in the trades and industries is an inherent and essential right of the people and should be protected against all monopolies and conspiracies which tend to hinder or destroy it. The size and functions of all corporations should be so limited and regulated as to prohibit fictitious capitalization and provision should be made for the supervision and government thereof. Therefore, all just power possessed by the state is hereby granted to the general court to enact laws to prevent the operations within the state of all persons and associations, and all trusts and corporations, foreign or domestic, and the officers thereof, who endeavor to raise the price of any article of commerce or to destroy free and fair competition in the trades and industries through combination, conspiracy, monopoly, or any other unfair means; to control and regulate the acts of all such persons, associations, corporations, trusts, and officials doing business within the state; to prevent fictitious capitalization; and to authorize civil and criminal proceedings in respect to all the wrongs herein declared against.]**

[ART. 90 (91).] The privilege and benefit of the habeas corpus, shall be enjoyed in this state, in the most free, easy, cheap, expeditious, and ample manner, and shall not be suspended by the legislature, except upon the most urgent and pressing occasions, and for a time not exceeding three months.

Habeas Corpus.

[ART. 91 (92).] The enacting style in making and passing acts, statutes, and laws, shall be, *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened.*

Enacting style of statutes.

[ART. 92 (93).] No [governor],* or judge of the [supreme judicial]† court, shall hold any office or place under the authority of this state, except such as by this constitution they are admitted to hold, saving that the judges of the said court may hold the offices of justice of the peace throughout the state; nor shall they hold any place or office, or receive any pension or salary, from any other state, government, or power, whatever.

Governor and judges prohibited from holding other offices.

[ART. 93 (94).] No person shall be capable of exercising, at the same time more than one of the following offices within this state, viz judge of probate, sheriff, register of deeds; and never more than two offices of profit, which may be held by appointment of the [governor],* or [governor]* and council, or senate and house of representatives, or superior or inferior courts; military offices, and offices of justices of the peace excepted.

tary, treasurer of the state, attorney-general, commissary-general, military officers receiving pay from the continent, or this state (excepting offices of the militia, occasionally called forth on an emergency) register of deeds, sheriff, or officers of the customs, including naval officers, collectors of excise, and state and continental taxes, hereafter appointed, and not having settled their accounts with the respective officers with whom it is their duty to settle such accounts, members of congress, or any person holding any office under the United States, shall at the same time hold the office of governor, or have a seat in the senate, or house of representatives, or council; but his being chosen and appointed to, and accepting the same, shall operate as a resignation of their seat in the chair, senate, or house of representatives, or council; and the place so vacated shall be filled up. No member of the council shall have a seat in the senate or house of representatives.]†

Bribery and corruption disqualify for office.

[ART. 95 (96).] No person shall ever be admitted to hold a seat in the legislature or any office of trust or importance under this government, who, in the due course of law, has been convicted of bribery or corruption, in obtaining an election or appointment.

Value of money, how computed. lxi, 518.

[ART. 96 (97).] In all cases where sums of money are mentioned in this constitution the value thereof shall be computed in silver at six shillings and eight pence per ounce.

Constitution, when to take effect.

[ART. 97 (98).] [To the end that there may be no failure of justice, or danger to the state, by the alterations and amendments made in the constitution, the general court is hereby fully authorized and directed to fix the time when the alterations and

amendments shall take effect, and make the necessary arrangements accordingly.]*†

[ART. 98 (99).] It shall be the duty of the selectmen, and assessors, of the several towns and places in this state, in warning the first annual meetings for the choice of senators, after the expiration of seven years from the adoption of this constitution, as amended, to insert expressly in the warrant this purpose, among the others for the meeting, to wit, to take the sense of the qualified voters on the subject of a revision of the constitution; and, the meeting being warned accordingly, and not otherwise, the moderator shall take the sense of the qualified voters present as to the necessity of a revision; and a return of the number of votes for and against such necessity, shall be made by the clerk sealed up, and directed to the general court at their then next session; and if it shall appear to the general court by such return, that the sense of the people of the state has been taken, and that, in the opinion of the majority of the qualified voters in the state, present and voting at said meetings, there is a necessity for a revision of the constitution, it shall be the duty of the general court to call a convention for that purpose, otherwise the general court shall direct the sense of the people to be taken, and then proceed in the manner before mentioned. The delegates to be chosen in the same manner, and proportioned, as the representatives to the general court; *provided* that no alterations shall be made in this constitution, before the same shall be laid before the towns and unincorporated places, and approved by two thirds of the qualified voters present and voting on the subject.

[ART. 99 (100).] [And the same method of taking the sense of the people, as to a revision of the constitution, and calling a convention for that purpose, shall be observed afterwards, at the expiration of every seven years.]**

[ART. 100 (101).] This form of government shall be enrolled on parchment, and deposited in the secretary's office, and be a part of the laws of the land and printed copies thereof shall be prefixed to the books containing the laws of this state, in all future editions thereof.

Population of New Hampshire

NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—New Hampshire was one of the original thirteen States. Its population on April 1, 1930, according to the Fifteenth Census, was 465,293, which represents an increase of 22,210, or 5.0 per cent, as compared with the population on January 1, 1920. The total land area of the State, as shown in Table 3, is 9,031 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1930 was 51.5, as compared with 49.1 in 1920.

Table 1 shows the population of New Hampshire from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1930, together with the increase in each decade.

Counties, cities, and minor civil divisions.—In the tables which follow (Tables 2 to 6) the population of New Hampshire is shown by counties, cities, and other minor civil divisions, with some comparative figures from previous censuses.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are nine cities in the state which had a population of 10,000 or more in 1930. Table 2 shows for these cities the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase during each decade. The figures shown for the earlier censuses represent, in many cases, the population of the town prior to its incorporation as a city. Manchester, the largest city, first attained a population of 10,000 between 1840 and 1850. Rochester is the only city added to this group following the census of 1920.

Minor civil divisions.—Table 4 shows the population of each county by towns, cities, and other minor civil divisions. The more thickly settled counties are divided into towns and cities, but in Carroll County there are 2 “locations” and in Coos County there are 8 “grants,” 6 “purchases,” 6 “townships,” and 3 “locations.” Of the civil divisions known as “grants” and “purchases,” 7 have had no population returned at any of the last three censuses and so are omitted from the list of minor civil divisions in Table 4.

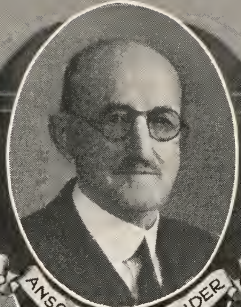

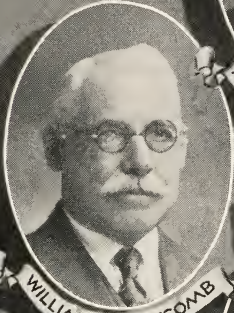

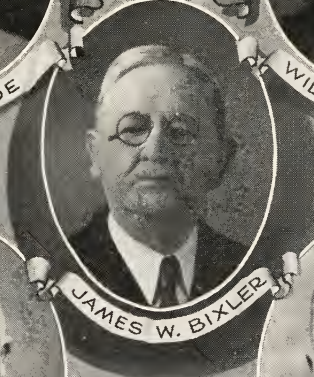

STATE EMBLEMS

Sections 1 and 4 of Chapter 8 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire were amended by Chapter 133 of the Laws of 1931, so that said Chapter 8 now reads as follows:

STATE EMBLEMS

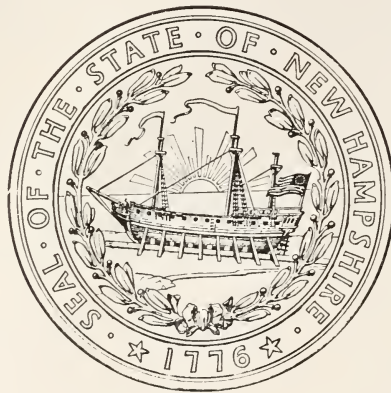
1. **Flag.** The state flag shall be of the following color and design: The body or field shall be blue and shall bear upon its center in suitable proportion and colors a representation of the state seal; the seal shall be surrounded by a wreath of laurel leaves with nine stars interspersed. When used for military purposes the flag shall conform to the regulations of the United States.

2. **When Displayed.** It shall be displayed above the state house whenever the legislature is in session and during meetings of the governor and council when expedient, and upon such other occasions as the governor may designate.

3. **Flower.** The purple lilac, *Syringa vulgaris*, is the state flower of New Hampshire.

4. **Seal.** The seal of the state shall be two inches in diameter, circular, with the following detail and no other: A field crossed by a straight horizon line of the sea, above the center of the field; concentric with the field the rising sun, exposed above the horizon about one third of its diameter, the field encompassed with laurel; across the field for the full width within the laurel a broadside view of the frigate *Raleigh*, on the stocks; the ship's bow dexter and higher than the stern; the three lower masts shown in place, together with the fore, main and mizzen tops, shrouds and mainstays; an ensign staff at the stern flies the United States flag authorized by act of Congress June 14, 1777; a jury staff on the mainmast and another on the foremast each flies a pennant; flags and pennants are streaming to the dexter side; the hull is shown without a rudder; below the ship the field is divided into land and water by a double diagonal line whose highest point is sinister; no detail is shown anywhere on the water, nor any on the land between the water

and the stocks except a granite boulder on the dexter side; encircling the field is the inscription, SEAL . OF . THE STATE . OF . NEW HAMPSHIRE, the words separated by round periods, except between the parts of New Hampshire; at the lowest point of the inscription is the date 1776, flanked on either side of a five-pointed star, which group separates the beginning and end of the inscription; the whole form and design to be as follows:

SPECIAL ELECTION

January 5, 1932

On October 28, 1931, a precept was issued by the governor and council, announcing a vacancy in the Seventy-second Congress, caused by the death of the representative from the First Congressional District of New Hampshire, Fletcher Hale, late of Laconia, and ordering a special election to be held on January 5, 1932, to fill said vacancy. Presidential Conventions

Four sets of Presidential electors appeared on the New Hampshire ballots used in the general election of November, 1932. The Republican and Democratic electors were nominated at State conventions held September 27 and September 28 at Concord and the electors of Communist and Socialist parties were named in petitions filed with the Secretary of State.

REPUBLICAN NATIONAL CONVENTION

A National Convention of Delegates representing the Republican Party of the United States was held at Chicago, Illinois, June 14, 1932. This Convention nominated Herbert C. Hoover of Leland Stanford University, California, for President and Charles R. Curtis of Topeka, Kansas, for Vice President. At the Republican State Convention the Hoover and Curtis electors named were Van H. Dodge, Whitefield, Arthur E. Moreau, Manchester, Huntley N. Spaulding, Rochester, and Abby L. Wilder, of Rindge.

DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL CONVENTION

The Democratic National Convention was held also at Chicago, Illinois, from June 27 to July 2, 1932. Franklin D. Roosevelt of Hyde Park, New York, was nominated for President, and John N. Garner of Uvalde, Texas, was nominated for Vice President of the United States. The Roosevelt and Garner electors nominated at the Democratic State Convention were Iva H. Drew, Colebrook, George D. Lord, Hanover, George W. Nutter, Rollinsford, and John T. O'Dowd, Manchester.

COMMUNIST PARTY

The Communist Party of which William Z. Foster of New York and James W. Ford of Ensley, Alabama, were the standard bearers, by petition named for electors to be placed on the November ballot: Henry C. Iram, Washington, John Mackinnon, Milford, Daniel McBain, Concord, and Thure Petersen, Con-

cord. This party also placed upon the ballot for the office of Governor of the State, William J. Wilgus, Jr., of Claremont; Fred B. Chase of Washington, for United States Senator; John Zebrowski of Manchester, for representative in Congress, first district; Waino H. Wirkkala, for representative in Congress, second district.

The National Nominating Convention of this party was held at Chicago, Illinois, May 28 and 29, 1932.

SOCIALIST PARTY

The Socialist Party of New Hampshire was likewise given a space on the November ballot through the petitions submitted to the Secretary of State. The national candidates were Norman Thomas of New York City, for President, and James H. Maurer of Reading, Pennsylvania, for Vice President. The electors were George C. Brooks, Franklin, Emil Hansas, New Ipswich, John Palm, Milford, and Earl B. Young, Laconia. This party also placed upon the ballot for the office of Governor, Frank T. Butler, Franklin; for United States Senator, Charles W. Greene, Portsmouth; and for Representative in Congress, Second District, Eli Bourdon of Claremont.

The National Nominating Convention of the Socialist Party was held at Milwaukee, Wisconsin, May 22, 1932.

RECOUNTS AFTER THE PRIMARY

After the primary election twenty-three recounts of ballots were conducted by the secretary of state, eight of these being in Republican contests and fifteen in Democratic contests. By only two of these recounts were the nominations of candidates affected. The two changes are explained as follows:

In Senatorial District No. 20, Republican returns gave Harry T. Hayes of Rochester and John M. Hubbard of Rochester 1584 votes each. The recount gave Mr. Hayes 1574 votes and Mr. Hubbard 1589 votes, thereby establishing the nomination of Mr. Hubbard.

In Manchester, Ward 13, of the five persons seemingly the Democratic nominees for representatives, Napoleon Proulx lost at the recount sixty-five votes, leaving his total only 155. Thus the nomination was transferred to Almon A. Boisvert who had at the recount 216 votes and the fifth place among the nominees.

REPUBLICAN ORGANIZATION, 1932

The Republican state convention met at Concord, Tuesday, September 27, 1932, with William J. Britton of Wolfeboro, president, and adopted the following platform:

REPUBLICAN PLATFORM

We believe that under the leadership of Herbert Hoover and with the authority vested in him under the veto power that the Federal Congress adopted the most far-reaching reconstruction program ever evolved by any nation to meet an economic emergency.

While we have experienced hardships at home, three quarters of the population of the globe have suffered from revolutions and dictatorships. 3. Through successful co-operation with local Communities on a tax reduction program.

We uphold the State administration in the aid given the milk producers in meeting the acute milk marketing problem confronting that industry and pledge continued support in their behalf.

We believe that home industries sponsored by the Arts and Crafts Commission have a definite place in New Hampshire and deserve state aid.

We pledge our support to the development of industry, agriculture and recreation through the Development Commission and the Agricultural Extension Service.

We pledge ourselves to further strengthen the laws relating to the regulation of public utilities for the protection of the consumer and the investor.

The normal activities of State Departments and Institutions shall be continued. We advocate economy but not at the expense of useful or necessary services.

We subscribe to the National Platform of the Republican Party.

We have faith in those we have nominated and to them we pledge our support.
