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

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of Dalton, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Dalton on Tuesday, the 11th of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The Polls will open at 11:00 o'clock.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To see if the Town will accept the Budget for 1952 as prepared by the Selectmen and make appropriation of the amounts therein or to make any changes.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 57.00 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 1|100th of one percent of the Town Valuation.

4. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to issue temporary loans on the anticipation of Taxes.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$200.-00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old-Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 to defray the Town's share of the cost thereof.

7. If the foregoing article is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the Town will designate the Town Treasurer as the Officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Dalton:

It is with pleasure that I submit my annual report relative to your schools.

This past year brought two changes in the teaching staff. Mrs. Minnie Blodgett, Wentworth, N. H., a graduate of Plymouth Normal School, and with 13 years' experience was elected to teach Grades 3 and 4 to replace Mrs. Hazel Tillotson who resigned to accept a position in Whitefield. Mrs. Gladys P. Fearon, a graduate of Keene Normal School, and with 10 years' experience was elected to replace Mrs. Elizabeth Tyburcy who resigned.

The enrollment to date this year in the six grades is 68 as compared with a total enrollment of 85 last year. On February 1, 1952 there were 26 Dalton pupils registered in Whitefield High School. There were 23 pupils registered in Grades 7 and 8, and 3 pupils registered in the lower six grades.

The report of the school nurse shows that all pupils were examined and defects were reported to parents. A total of 79 pupils were examined for height, weight, vision and hearing. Dental clinics were held at Dr. Clark's office in Littleton throughout the year. Two orthopedic clinics were held during the year. Five pupils were taken to Lancaster and one to St. Johnsbury, Vt. for eye examinations.

A sufficient quantity of school supplies have been made available for all classes. Books that have become obsolete and worn out have been replaced by modern texts. I would recommend that some thought be given to improving the toilet facilities for both boys and girls in the near future.

Teachers and parents should be commended for undertaking a lunch program whereby pupils are provided with a hot dish each noon for a very nominal fee. If such a program is to be continued some provisions might be necessary for keeping food warm and for washing some dishes.

School costs are increasing each year due to increased costs in supplies, higher teachers' salaries and increased costs for heating and transportation. As a result of these, tuition costs for pupils attending school outside the district have gone up accordingly. This year Dalton is paying \$125.00 per year, per pupil, for elementary tuition, and \$175.00 per pupil for high school tuition. This next year tuition will be \$125.00 for elementary pupils and \$200.00 for high school pupils. A list of tuition pupils in Whitefield this year can be found on another page of this report.

The small increase in state funds for educational aid brought about an increase of only about \$1,200.00 for Dalton this past year. It does not appear now that Dalton will qualify for any more than this during the next year. Should more districts in the state qualify for aid than qualified this year it is possible that Dalton's share could be less than the \$5,779.34 received this year.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the citizens of Dalton, the school board, teaching staff and other district officers and employees for their cooperation this past year.
