

TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deering in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Deering Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- Article 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for highways and bridges for the ensuing year, and if the same shall be divided for winter and summer roads.
- Article 4. To see what action will be taken concerning the old caterpillar tractor and appropriate money for the same.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum of money for Blister Rust control.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$650.00 (six hundred fifty dollars) to defray interest charges on long and short term notes.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Board of Selectmen to deliver the inventory blanks to residents when assessing.

- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise for Town road aid the sum of \$618.00, the state contributing \$2,733.94; or the Town to raise for state aid construction \$618.00 and the state to contribute \$1,236.00. (Only one of these available per year.)
- Article 9. To see if the town will take any action in regards to wages and hours per day for the ensuing year.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money on short term notes in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,250 to cover long term notes. (One of these notes is for \$2,000 on the tractor, the other is for P.W.A. bond of \$250.00)
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sign a contract under which the Town could purchase electric lights not to exceed \$600.00 per year over a five year period. The mileage of proposed extension is 4.1 miles. The route proposed extends from Deering Center via Sherwood's corner to Community Center out the center road to East Deering road, and extending to James C. Wilson's home in one direction and southwardly in direction to Charles Savage's home, or take any action relating thereto.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will raise a certain amount of money to repair the water system to the Town Hall.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will authorize the trustees of the trust funds to install toilets in the Town Hall and make other alterations as they may deem necessary.
- Article 15. To see what action the Town will take concerning janitor service for Town Hall and equipment shed.
- Article 16. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) for Old Home Day.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to pay for Tax Collector's expenses for previous lears.

Article 18. To see what action the town will take regarding Tax Collector's compensation.

Article 19. To see if the Town will authorize its Selectmen to reduce real estate valuations a certain percent.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to rescind its vote taken at the annual meeting in March, 1932, relative to the adoption of Chapter 26 of the Public Laws of the State of New Hampshire; or take any action in relation thereto.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the same.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of the Deering School District:

The superintendent of schools submits this his second annual school report for your consideration.

The following pupils maintained perfect attendance without being tardy, during the school year 1935-1936, for the number of periods indicated. Each period consists of nine weeks. There are four periods in the year.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

This year the general policy of the conduct of the schools has been a continuation of the educational prin-

ciples and practices set forth in our last report.

Howard Kiblin, Florence Baggs and Edward Tacy were graduated and promoted to high school last June. The graduation exercises were held in the Deering town hall. The musical numbers, the essays delivered by the graduates, the address and presentation of diplomas by the superintendent of schools, and the refreshments furnished by the school board at the close of the exercises, affording the audience one of the most delightful events of the year in the town of Deering.

A nation-wide movement is on foot to furnish transportation to high school children who live beyond a reasonable distance from a high school. There is a bill before the New Hampshire legislature to pass such a law in our own state. The passage of this bill would be a great step toward equalizing educational advantages for a start in life, especially for those children whose parents cannot afford the expense in question.

Four Deering children attend e'ementary school at Henniker, two attend the Weare high school, thirteen attend elementary school at Hillsboro, and nine attend Hillsboro high school. These figures fluctuate owing to the fact that now and then some drop out, and new arrivals in town must be provided for.

During the past two years Hillsboro has furnished instruction in Domestic Arts, Manual Training, and richer courses in mathematics, vocational guidance, and more modern text books in the grammar school as well as in

the high school. The Deering children have thus benefited from improvements which a larger school system is in a better position to furnish. The fact that Deering is in the same supervisory union as Hillsboro gives the superintendent an opportunity to fully understand the needs of the Deering children, and to cater to their individual needs.

Two changes have occured on the teaching staff since last June. Miss Evelyn Lovejoy, a graduate of the Keene normal school class of 1936 replaced Miss Jeannette Saigh at East Deering, and Miss Emma Yeaton, a graduate of the Plymouth normal school replaced Miss Frances Shaughnessy the music supervisor. It is fortunate that we can still continue our work in music.

The work of our teachers is commendable. The schools are running smoothly and efficiently. The school board have left no stone unturned to maintain the schools economically and at the same time on progressive principles.

The routine inspection of each pupil began with the opening of the school year, for the detection of skin diseases, defective vision, defective tonsils and teeth, diseased tonsils, posture and general hygiene.

To date 13 school visits were made. Treatments in school 2. 25 home and official visits were made. Home visits to explain to parents about the defects found at the inspection, also to tell them about the dental clinic we had planned. They were all interested and willing to cooperate.

Cod liver oil was started in all three schools for those whose parents wished them to have it. Children who have had cod liver oil and milk during the past three years are noticeably benefited by the use of it. The correction of defects left the children free to gain; only in this way could the best results be obtained.

I thank the school officials, teachers, parents, pupils and all others who have so kindly cooperated in making the dental clinic a success.
