---

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Dunbarton, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

[L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town on Tuesday the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate above the amount required by law for highways.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Maintenance and raise and appropriate money for the same.
5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction and raise and appropriate money for the same.
6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate above the amount required by law for the support of the library.
8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of its cemeteries.

9. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on all property taxes paid on or before July 1, 1925, and if so, what per cent.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see what action the Town will take relative to securing a Fire Truck and housing accommodations for it and raise and appropriate money for the same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to continue improvement of road running east from Dunbarton Center to the Montalona District.

13. To see what action the Town will take relative to its town buildings and raise and appropriate money for the same.

14. To see if the Town will take any action relative to Electric Lights and raise and appropriate money for the same.

15. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors and other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

---

*To the Constituents of the School District of Dunbarton:*

In submitting the annual report for the school year beginning July 1, 1923, and ending June 30, 1924, we are pleased to report a very good financial condition, with quite a surplus as will be noticed from the financial report.

The check from the state helped greatly since it amounted to \$1,527.50.

A check for \$1,249.00 has been received from the state for the year 1924-1925.

We are quite fortunate in not being burdened with the big problem of transportation.

In only two schools, the Center and Burnham Hill, out of the five is transportation necessary.

At our school meeting in April, 1924, the following question was presented and left with the school board to settle: Should the school district or town carry an insurance on the party hired to transport the children to and from school, and upon the children? Investigation showed this needless. The state board recently ruled that the town was not liable should any child while being transported meet with an accident.

Many times the question is asked: Is it fair to our children to hire untrained and inexperienced teachers who obtain their experience at the expense of the children? We feel that in the past too much stress has been placed upon hiring teachers who would come at low salaries. If we want well trained, well read, competent teachers we must expect to pay for them. Such teachers are eagerly sought for. Could our money be spent to any better advantage than for the education of our children?

The parents should expect and demand the best for their children. They should visit the schools, become acquainted with the teacher and take more interest in our present system of education.

It seemed best to have a change of teachers at the Burnham Hill School at the beginning of the spring term. We were fortunate in securing Miss Margaret Tyler to continue the work. We appreciated her earnest efforts and success and wished she could have remained the following year.

It is encouraging to note that fifteen of our pupils who graduated attended high school. Reports of the work of these pupils were very good. Parents and children are realizing that a high school education is as necessary today and perhaps more essential than a grammar school education was fifteen or twenty years ago.

In the spring the Center School-house was painted outside and the shed was shingled. This repair work was very necessary and made a great improvement in the appearance of the building.

It has not been customary to report the condition of the schools from July 1 to the date of report but we feel it would be of interest to make a few statements.

During the summer the walls of all the school houses were repaired and painted and all the ceilings were whitened. The walls and ceilings were in a very bad condition. Several of the teachers have reported that the children seem to work better since this work was done. It is quite essential that the schools be kept clean and in good condition.

Our superintendent was successful in securing teachers for our schools in the fall. They have all proven capable and successful and the work has gone on in a satisfactory manner.

The board made the ruling recently that children under six years of age should not be allowed to enter school,

with this exception, that children coming six before December 1 may enter school the preceding September.

The amount of money expended to the present date is \$3,648.50. It is estimated that the amount needed for the remainder of the year amounts to \$2,970.00.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

*To the School Board of Dunbarton:*

I herewith submit my third annual report.

The school year closing June 30, 1924, was not up to the high standard of the preceding year. The attendance and achievement records, in general, were from four to ten points lower. For the same period the record of the Dunbarton pupils in High Schools was well above the general average. The ability to do High School work is a fair test of the efficiency of the elementary and grammar schools.

The attendance and work of the current year thus far, are equal to that of two years ago. This should encourage us all to complete the year's work on the same high plane.

Three of last year's teachers remained in their respective schools and we were able to secure two experienced well trained teachers to fill the places of those who declined to serve for the current year. This arrangement has made a considerable increase in the teachers' salary budget, but the results gained are well worth the extra outlay.

There are six candidates for graduation this year. If they enter High School according to present plans provision will have to be made for a larger High School enrollment next fall.

The Wait and Montalona buildings need a new coat of paint, and the latter may need new shingles before next September. Repairs of a minor nature will put the other buildings in good condition for the ensuing year.

In closing I desire to express appreciation for the whole-hearted support of all who have interested themselves in the work of the schools.
