

- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the health department.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Akers Pond Road.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the water department and appropriate money for same.
- 13. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before the meeting.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS 1954-55

To the School Board and Citizens of Errol:

I have the pleasure of submitting my fourth annual report as Superintendent of Schools in Errol. Financial reports included herein, except budget material, are for the school year 1953–54. Statistical data is for the current year and is corrected up to the time of publication.

Shortly after the district meeting last year the community was shocked and saddened by the sudden death of the newly elected school board member, Mrs. Arline Gray. In the short time she was a member she had already shown an active interest in the schools, particularly the high school. She, with the other Poard Members, your Superintendent and other interested citizens went to Concord to appear before the State Foard of Education. Thanks to evidence presented at that meeting the State Poard reversed its earlier decision and approved the high school for the year 1954–55. We have been assured that this approval will continue through the school year 1955–56. Mrs. Gray will be remembered in a kindly spirit for her interest in the schools and her activities in other community projects.

The grade placement chart given below shows that we have thirteen children enrolled in the 8th grade. When they graduate in June there will be available for high school seventeen young people counting the four already enrolled in the 9th grade. Some of these students will be eligible for the Area School Program, so-called, at no cost to the district for tuition but there seems no doubt that the high school enrollment will be larger than it has been for some time. There will be a slightly increased cost for books and supplies for the larger group, but the expenditure per child will be greatly lessened and the opportunities to compete in larger classes will make for a better educational situation. The Hot Lunch Program has been continued for those who care to take advantage of its benefits. In an area such as this where most of our children would have to carry lunches it is a distinct convenience to have the hot meal offered. Mrs. Harriette Grover was unable to continue as cook because of sickness, but an excellent replacement was found in Mrs. Marion Nile, assisted by Mrs. Gloria Porter. The paper work and reports are taken care of by our Board Chairman, Mrs. Rose Travers.

Early in the school year it was discovered that the boiler at the high school was in a serious, if not dangerous, condition. Bids were placed and a new boiler with much more satisfactory controls was installed during the Christmas recess. Already the new installation is showing a greater efficiency in the use of fuel and the distribution of heat. Cost of the project has been taken care of in the present (1954–1955) budget because the income from tuition has been more than was anticipated in the published district report.

Again I say in all sincerity that it is a pleasure and a privilege to work in your school system. We have good teachers and there is a friendly spirit of cooperation and goodwill between the parents, teachers and board members. Such conditions make for a progressive and efficient school system. I am sure we have good schools in Errol.

Thank you for this opportunity to report.
