Town Meeting Warrant

(As known January 27, 1948)

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Pine Blister Rust Control.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to provide for the disposal of rubbish and garbage and raise and appropriate money for the same, and other expenses of the Health Department.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Littleton Hospital.

Article 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal, maintenance of highways and bridges, and for Town Road Aid.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,600.00 for the lighting of its streets for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department. Article 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library and salary of its Librarian.

Article 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor.

Article 11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be used for Community Christmas activities.

Article 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of its cemeteries.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for legal expenses.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the White Mountains Region advertising.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for the White Mountain Airport.

Article 18. To see of the town will vote to raise and appropriate the following: \$2,500.00 to pay the amount maturing on the Town Building and Water Works bonds; \$1,000.00 on outstanding Water Works

Purchase notes; also the sum of \$915.00 to pay the interest on said indebtedness and on temporary loans.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for sidewalk construction and upkeep.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum for the purchase of a sidewalk plow.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 6,000.00 to purchase a new truck for fire department use to be equipped with a 1000-gallon tank, 1000 feet of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " hose, a portable pump, and other necessary accessories, and to provide a suitable shelter for same; and, further, to instruct the Selectmen to issue bonds to cover this expense, said bonds to be retired \$1,000.00 each year.

Article 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purchase of new equipment.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,923.42 for the payment of the County Tax.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.

Article 25. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUPERINTENDEN'T'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Franconia:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as Superintendent of Schools in the Franconia district:

The enrollment of your school last year was 157, the average membership 136.68, and the percentage of attendance was 94.7. There were 18 tuition pupils in the Academy and 40 in the elementary school. The average attendance in the Academy was 37.88. The school attendance was 94.7%, an increase of 0.8%.

This year the enrollment is 132, with 44 in Grades 9-12 and 88 in Grades 1-8. This is approximately the same as last year's enrollment.

We have been very fortunate in our teaching staff this year. There have been no changes. Franconia has made this a pleasant year for the teachers.

Miss Phyllis Farnsworth, Grades 1-2, and Miss Ellen Pushee, Grades 3-4, are graduates of Plymouth Teachers College in the class of 1947. This is their first year of teaching. Their work has been above average and we have been very pleased with their services.

Mrs. Grace Kerr and Mr. Fred Charron are the new teachers in the high school. Mrs. Kerr is an experienced commercial teacher. Mr. Charron, University of New Hampshire graduate, is an outstanding beginning teacher.

Mrs. Emma Swett and Mr. Robert Ham, Lisbon High School teachers of Home Economics and Shop respectively, come to Franconia Mondays and Tuesdays to work with Grades 7 and 8. Mr. Ham has been sick for the past four weeks. Mrs. Swett finds the travel difficult. We may have to make other plans next year.

Mr. Gilbert Rhoades, Headmaster, Miss Kathleen Callahan, Grades 5-6, and Miss Ellen Simpson, English, continue their good work.

Mrs. Lillian Bailey, who did the work in Grades 3-4 for part of last year, has taught the Math and Science in the Junior High. The pupils have enjoyed her classes.

Your school board is making every effort to maintain its present staff of teachers. The elementary teacher shortage is critical. There are a few more high school teachers available this year.

It appears to me that in spite of the many difficulties in running a school system that this has been the best year in teacher-pupil morale at Franconia that I have observed.

The work in your community has been pleasant. I appreciate your cooperation and interest in the school.
