TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gilsum in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Gilsum on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To receive the report of the Budget Committee and take any action thereon.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To appoint a committee to take charge of the observance of Memorial Day.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to have the Chief Fire Ward appointed for an indefinite period in accordance with Chapter 110 of the 1945 Laws of the State of New Hampshire.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$300.00 from Mr. Herbert Moore as a Trust Fund for the perpetual care of the Wright Lot in the Centennial Cemetery.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell either by auction or private sale any or all pieces of real estate now acquired by tax deed.
- 9. To vote by ballot on the following question: "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town?"

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the Gilsum-Alstead Road.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow the sum of \$1,083.00, if required, to cover the Town's share of State Aid Construction for the year 1950.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a Town Hall Committee to take charge of the Town Hall, define their powers and duties, and act in any manner relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to make any alterations in the Town Officers' salaries.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to appoint a Building Inspector and adopt Building Regulations in accordance with Chapter 176, Section 17-21 inclusive, Laws of New Hampshire 1942, and act in any manner relating thereto.
- 15. To transact any other business which may regularly come before it.

To the inhabitants of the school district in the Town of Gilsum qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said district on the 14th day of March, 1950, at 7:30 in the afternoon, to vote upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent in the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees. or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, and committee, in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the school district will vote to have flush toilets installed in the school house.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$2,000.00 and for this purpose to authorize the school board to borrow money on the credit, of and in the name of the school district.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Gilsum:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as superintendent of your schools:

We were sorry to lose Mrs. Putnam last spring. During her year and half she had done much to improve the morale and bring up the averages of the upper grades. Her place is being very adequately filled by Mr. Hanagan.

The P.T.A. deserves much credit, not only for its material gifts to the school, but for its bringing together of the townspeople for a common cause—the improvement of education in Gilsum. A good community project would be to paint the outside of the schoolhouse. The district would supply the paint, and the people could put on a painting-bee and soon have a good-looking building. This has been done in a number of communities, recently, and the people have had fun, accomplished something worthwhile, and saved the town some money.

The toilets in the school are a disgrace. The State Board of Health has withheld condemning them until some action is taken at this annual meeting. Unless the district votes to replace them, the State may declare them condemned and require their replacement. In that case the district would be liable for repairs. It seems better to plan on doing this necessary job as soon as possible than to be forced into it.

We were able to obtain the services of Dr. Laidlaw for a physical examination of every pupil in the fall. We are still trying to obtain the services of a school nurse, but as yet have been unsuccessful.

The only changes in the budget for next year are in teachers' salaries and high school tuition. We expect to have twenty-six pupils in high school next year. It is too bad that more of your young people do not take advantage of the opportunities offered for high school training. Only about three-fourths of your elementary school graduates enter high school, and many of these do not finish. The tuition rate for next year is \$200.00. It is impossible to determine what the state aid figure will be another year. We can only use last year's figure and hope for some added assistance from this source.

During the past few months we have completed work on the new front door, repaired many broken window lights in the classrooms, and storm windows, redone the blackboards, and completed installation of the furnace.

FOREST FIRES—OUR MOST SHAMEFUL WASTE

Everyone apparently fears fires but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than 98 percent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste".

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forests, the protection forests provide for game and the supply of ground water. They upset local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the cooperation of the public—YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PREVENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU cooperate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

- (1) Being careful with fire in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.
- Securing the required written permit from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (3) Insisting that others be careful and comply with burning requirements,
- (4) Calling the warden promptly when fire is detected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most shameful waste.
