Warrant for Town Meeting.

1. s. THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Grafton, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grafton, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

3 To see if the town will vote to elect one or more Road Agents for the ensuing year.

4 To elect a member of the Board of Trustees of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

5 To elect a member of the Library Trustees for the ensuing three years.

6 To see if the town will allow a discount of three per cent. upon all property taxes paid on or before July 30, 1934.

7 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to be expended in proper observance of Old Home Day.

8 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make short term loans in anticipation of taxes.

9 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of maintaining town highways and bridges, including the amount of 1-4 of 1 per cent. as required by law.

10 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting bushes and railing embankments along the highway.

11 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$627.00 for State Aid Construction thereby obtaining State Aid of \$1,254.00.

12 To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds. 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of purchasing metal culverts.

14 To see if the town will vote to accept a legacy as a trust fund of \$700.00, the income thereof to be expended for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Almon H. Barney cemetery lot and the double lot of Lafayette T. and Hial Barney at Grafton Center.

15 To see if the town will vote to rescind the amendment voted at the annual election in 1933, which gave Dr. Frank A. Mitchell the preference of signing a contract with the town as a resident Physician. This article to be voted by secret ballot. Entered by petition.

16 To see if the town will vote to adopt the same system of balloting as used in State and National elections, this article to be voted by secret ballot.

17 To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under this act.

18 To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway leading from the Height of Land road by the Harold B. Wheeler place, so called, to the Ellery Gardner place, so called.

19 To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to make a long term loan of \$7,500.00 for the purpose of paying a short term loan of \$7,500.00 now outstanding.

20 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 and interest to apply on town debt.

21 To take any vote or transact any further business that may legally come before said meeting.

Superintendent's Report.

To the Grafton School Board:

Herewith is transmitted to you my annual report on the schools of your district. It is a brief report for in my last year's report were contained observations which are still applicable to the conditions in the schools for the present year, and explanations of certain kinds of work going on in them. These will not need to be repeated. Our tests given from year to year, and especially at the end of last year, show a great unevenness in the abilities of pupils of the same grade. Ability in the fundamental subject of reading varies so within the limits of a single grade that it is impossible to do the best work with them without regrouping them for teaching purposes. Regrouping does not mean regrading or demoting; it merely means putting pupils of the same ability into the same group for teaching purposes without regard to their ages or grades. This has been done this year in certain schools and certain subjects

with the result of much better learning and more rapid progress. Reading has been selected for a trial in these new methods because it is so necessary to a person's future progress in anything he undertakes to do, whether it be a trade or high school work or recreation by reading. Other subjects will be later brought under the same plan. To describe in detail this plan of work would take more space than is available in this report but the superintendent will be very glad to show you or any interested person just what it means at any time you wish.

The teachers this year are the same as were in service at the time of writing the last report and the salaries being paid them are the same. They are proving themselves to be even more competent than last year.

There is included with this report a comparative table showing our school expenses over the six years ending last June. This table will be interesting to our townspeople as showing the ups and downs of our school finance. Certain items may profitably be commented on here. Under some items an average for the last six years is given to enable one to make comparison with the expense of last year; columns showing increase or decrease of last year's expenses over the same items in the year ending in June, 1928. Some items can best be compared with the averages, especially those which are irregular from year to year; others which remain more constant or which are determined for us by state law or other conditions beyond our control. For example, there has been an increase in high school tuition expense of \$959.43 over the year of 1928 due to the increase in the number of pupils attending high school. The amount of our budget for this current year is \$1,642.20, even taking into account a reduction in tuition rate from \$90.00 to \$78.26. This amount will not be quite all expended, however, owing to a decrease since September in the number of our pupils attending high school from Grafton.

The per capita tax, otherwise known as the Tax for state-wide supervision shows a rather steady increase due to the increase in the number of pupils enrolled in the schools each year. For the current year the amount is \$270.00 and for the next year the amount drops to \$246.00. Transportation of pupils shows a remarkably uniform figure; the amount expected this year will be about \$1,275.00, less than at any time since 1929. The superintendent's salary has declined by \$82.92 since 1928; teachers' salaries have advanced, but almost wholly due to the division of the East Grafton school, done at the insistence of the state board.

While these schools have decreased somewhat in number they still enroll enough pupils to make it impossible to recombine them without seriously injuring the work now done with the primary and the Eighth grades. Medical inspection, or as it is with us the salary of the school nurse, has been up and down but as the state pays the entire expense the figures for this item do not affect us much.

The budget as submitted to the district this year amounts to about \$150.00 more than last year in the amounts to be raised by taxation. The State aid has been decreased by over \$300.00 from the amount received last December, which accounts for the entire sum. As an actual fact the total expenditures for the schools, including all items, as proposed to the district are nearly \$300.00 less than were proposed in the March budget of last year.

The high school tuitions will not be much, if any, increased next year. The number expected to enter will about offset the number expected to leave high school next year. There are no elementary tuitions at present.

Milk is being served at recess, also Cod Liver Oil is being given twice a day to the underweight children. Other activities consisted of reweighing the children each month and classroom inspection at frequent intervals for symptons of communicable diseases and pediculosis.

I wish to express my appreciation to the members of the School Board, Mr. Pratt, and the local chapter of the Red Cross.

I also wish to express my appreciation to the parents and the teachers in the work accomplished in the past year.
