THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, N. H., in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Old Home Day and make appropriation for the same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges and make appropriation for the same.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for State Aid Construction and make appropriation for the same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to deed and convey by a good and sufficient deed to N. W. Sanborn the gravel bank described in deed of John W. Sanborn to said Town recorded in Grafton County Registry of Deeds, liber 425, folio 246, reserving to said Town the right to remove all gravel above road level on the westerly side of said property.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$54.00 to the Lake Region Associations of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town in cooperation with other Towns in the Lake Region.

8. To see if the Town will raise \$10.00 annually for the Wade Hill cemetery and make appropriation for the same.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The library has had another successful year. There were approximately 100 borrowers, a circulation of 4,219 books and magazines and 83 new books added.

A joint program of Education and Book Week was again held by the schools with an exhibit and a dramatization of scenes from Hebron's libraries of the past 91 years.

The librarian attended library summer school.

Book collections borrowed from the state supplement our own. The library wishes to cooperate in obtaining any books or information desired, and when necessary will borrow from other sources if possible. It is your library and you are invited to use it.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Hebron:

Our schools opened on September 8, 1936, with a total of thirty-four pupils; five of whom were attending for the first time. Four children have removed during the present year from the Village School. Our total membership on February 1, 1937, is 30, with 15 in each school. Two pupils are in the eighth grade in the Village School and one at East Hebron.

The teachers are the same as last year. Both attended the summer session at Plymouth Normal School and brought back to their schools a broadened outlook and quickened interest. They are carrying on their work efficiently. The interest of the children is keen and their progress is evident. Both school rooms have many illustrations of vital activity. Unfortunately, the attendance is considerably broken this year by the prevalence of children's diseases.

The refinishing and redecorating in both school houses was very worthwhile. We are gratefully indebted to Mrs. Dorothy McLane for the gift of twenty-nine adjustable seats, and five slate blackboards. I recommend that further repairs be planned for the summer vacation. Especially is there immediate need of a new floor at East Hebron.

For the school year ending June 30, 1936, our total registration was 36, 19 boys and 17 girls. The average membership was 32. The per cent of attendance, 96. The success of the instruction was shown by the promotion of all pupils in both schools. The two eighth grade graduates entered Plymouth High School, where one is still continuing with a grade of satisfactory accomplishment.

It is a pleasure to note the Sixth Annual McLane prize-speaking contest held last spring. Mrs. McLane is rendering a high type of service in sponsoring these contests. They are of real value to the pupils and serve also as centers of community interest.

Graduation exercises were again of high grade. The success of our school in stimulating interest in education is shown by the considerable number of pupils who are continuing their work. Both Plymouth and Bristol High School have been enriched by the presence of our young people.

I wish to commend the work of Mrs. Lovett as school nurse. Through her efforts, several children have been able to attend the dental clinic at Plymouth. Several have had their eyes tested. She has secured the cooperation of various agencies in the caring for the health of the children. By means of home visits, she is able to reach individual cases.

Again it is a pleasure to commend the liberal policy of the school board in providing text books and equipment. Our working conditions are in general, favorable. Parents are cooperative and there is a wholesome interest in the welfare of the school. In submitting this, my fourth annual report, I wish to express my grateful appreciation to the school board for their unfailing and understanding kindness.
