TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hopkinton in the
County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to
vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Hopkinton on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- (1) Town Officers' Salaries
- (2) Town Officers' Expenses
- (3) Election and Registration
- (4) Expense and Care of Town Hall
- (5) Police Department
- (6) Vital Statistics
- (7) Fire Department
- (8) Cemeteries
- (9) Town Poor
- (10) Old Age Assistance
- (11) Interest on Notes
- (12) Insurance

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to build a kitchen in the Town Hall. (Not recommended by the Budget Committee)

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expense of Highway Department and Street Lighting.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the employment of a District Nurse and other health expenses.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Concord Hospital.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Control of White Pine Blister Rust. (No amount recommended by the Budget Committee)

9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Care of Town Dumps.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Hopkinton Free Public Libraries.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Old Home Day.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civilian Defense.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Legal Expenses.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of \$3,000.00 for Town Construction and permanent improvement of roads.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Aid.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Social Security.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Sidewalk Construction.

19. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a Power Grader and Attachments, the same not to exceed the sum of \$15,000.00, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for initial payment on same.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$13,000.00 to pay the balance of the purchase price of \$15,000.00 for the Grader and attachments, also to make arrangements to write this loan off with a series of notes over a period of seven years.

Specifications for said Grader and attachments to be established by the Town Highway Committee and Selectmen, said Grader will remain directly under the supervision of the Selectmen, the operator of the Grader will be appointed by the Selectmen and approved by the Highway Committee. All income from rentals of said Grader and attachments over and above operation and maintenance cost will be used to retire the above indebtedness. Upon retirement of the notes, said balance of income will be deposited with the Trustees of Trust Funds to be held in the Capital Reserve Fund, the income and principal of this Fund to be expended only upon approval of the Budget Committee and by vote at Town Meeting for the replacement of said Grader and Attachments.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint one Road Agent for the Whole

Town, effective forthwith and superseding any Road Agents elected at this meeting and to authorize the Selectmen to fix his compensation.

22. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Collector of Taxes additional Compensation for his services in collecting the State Head Tax and to fix the amount thereof.

23. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Tax Collector a salary of one Percent of all the taxes collected, except the State Head Taxes.

24. To see if the Town will vote to take over the Street Lighting in Hopkinton Precinct and Contoocook Precinct, this article to take effect upon adoption.

25. To see if the Town will vote to pay the Contoocook Fire Precinct rental for use of the street floor of Columbia Hall, so-called, located in Contoocook Fire Precinct for use as a Fire Station, said rental to be a sum agreed upon by the Selectmen and the Contoocook Fire Precinct Commissioners.

26. To see if the Town will vote to designate all woodlands now in its possession and that which may hereinafter come into its possession as Town Forests and instruct the Selectmen and the Town Forestry Board to establish a management plan for said Forests, said plan to be approved by the State Forester.

On approval of the Management plan, the Selectmen are authorized, upon recommendation of the Town Forestry Board, to sell from time to time marketable wood and stumpage located in the Town Forests, and to deposit such money as may be recovered therefrom with the Trustees of Trust Funds to be held in a Capital Reserve Fund, the income and principal of this Fund to be expended only upon approval of the Budget Committee, and by vote at Town Meeting for Capital Equipment for the Town.

27. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following Cemetery Trust Funds, the income to be used as directed subject to the provisions adopted at the Town Meeting of March 10th, 1925.

- (a) The sum of \$150.00 from Deane Shurtleff Locke for the perpetual care of the Maurice H. and Esther Shurtleff Emery lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.
- (b) The sum of \$150.00 from Bertha L. Dearborn for the perpetual care of the Dearborn Burial lot in the Hopkinton New Cemetery.
- (c) The sum of \$150.00 from C. R. Hemp for the care of the Straw-Browne lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.
- (d) The sum of \$150.00 from the Lillon Sawyer Estate for the care of the Mudgett-Sawyer lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.
- (e) The sum of \$200.00 from Mrs. William C. Russ for the care of the William C. Russ lot in the Hopkinton Old Cemetery.
- (f) The sum of \$200.00 from Mrs. William C. Russ for the care of the Col. William Colby lot in the Hopkinton Old Cemetery.
- (g) The sum of \$150.00 from the Estate of Frank H. Mills for the care of the Mills' family lot in the Hopkinton New Cemetery.
- (h) One share of American Telephone and Telegraph Co. from Arthur C. Huntoon for perpetual care of the Ora M. Huntoon lot and Arthur C. Huntoon lot, both lots situated in the Contoocook Cemetery.
- (i) One share of American Telephone and Telegraph Co. from Catherine Clough for perpetual care of the Clough-Hayward lot in Contoocook Cemetery.

28. To see for what purpose the Town shall vote to expend during the current year the income of the G. Everett Kelley Fund.

29. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of the 1953 Tax Levy.

30. To act on reports of Town Officers, Library Trustees and Committees for 1952.

31. To hear and transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

RECORD OF ANNUAL MEETING

Hopkinton, N. H., March 10, 1953

Meeting was called to order at 9 o'clock in the forenoon by the Moderator, Lewis A. Nelson.

The Warrant for the call of meeting was read by the Moderator, who then called upon Rev. William T. Keech to offer prayer.

The following resolution was offered by Joseph H. Young:

Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that all articles pertaining to the raising of money and Article 21, be acted upon after one o'clock in the afternoon. Adopted in the affirmative.

The Moderator proceeded to act upon the following Articles:

Article 1: Election of Officers:

Fence Viewers: Motion made by Joseph H. Young and carried, that the Clerk cast one ballot for Bernard M. Reen, John K. Graves and John A. Brock, who were declared elected as Fence Viewers for the ensuing year.

Tree Warden: Motion made by John K. Graves and carried, that the Clerk cast one ballot for Ernest S. Archibald, who was declared elected as Tree Warden for the ensuing year.

Weighers: Motion made by John Brock and carried, that the Clerk cast one ballot for Horace Stanley, who was declared elected as Weigher for the ensuing year.

Sextons: Motion made by Richard A. Brunel and carried, that the Clerk cast one ballot for Daniel H. Dustin, Ira A. Putney, Ernest S. Archibald, and Leon Holmes, who were declared elected as Sextons for the ensuing year.

Fire Wards: Motion made by John K. Graves and carried, that the clerk cast one ballot for Ernest S. Archibald (Contoocook), Harold M. Martin (West Hopkinton), and Tracy Chellis (Hopkinton), who were declared elected as Fire Wards for the ensuing year.

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber: Motion made by Richard A. Brunel and carried, that the Clerk cast one ballot for Thomas B. Card, Stewart Astles and Arthur S. Duston, who were declared elected as Surveyors of Wood and Lumber for the ensuing year.

Town Forestry Board: Motion made by John A. Brock and carried, that the Clerk cast one ballot for Raymond Barnard — 1954, Bernard M. Reen — 1955, Walter Dwyer — 1956, William Messeck — 1957, Joseph H. Young — 1958, who were declared elected for their respective term.

Budget Committee: Motion was made by Harold M. Martin that the Clerk cast one ballot for Joseph H. Young and Earl J. Rice as members of the Budget Committee for a period of 3 years. The motion carried.

Motion was made by Harold M. Martin that the Clerk cast one ballot for Richard A. Brunel and Chapin Hoskins as members for a term of one year.

Dr. J. H. Lightfoot nominated Allen Lewis and Reginald Terrill for a term of one year.

A ballot vote was taken with the following result:

Town Road Committee: Motion made by Edward C. Leadbeater and carried, that the Clerk cast one ballot for Richard A. Brunel for a term of five years, who was declared elected as a member of the Town Road Committee, for a term of five years.

The following motion was made by Ernest A. Shepherd:

It is moved that the Board of Selectmen be instructed to inquire into the feasibility of holding the Hopkinton Town Meeting in the auditorium of the new Hopkinton High School and that the selectmen report at the next Town Meeting. The motion was lost.

The following motion was made by Ernest A. Shepherd:

Moved, that the names of the candidates for the elected memberships of the Budget Committee be placed henceforth annually, on the non-partisan ballot of the town. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 22: Joseph H. Young moved this Article be passed over. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 23: James A. Weast moved we pass over this Article. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 24: John A. Brock moved we pass over this Article. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 26: The following resolution offered by Harold M. Martin:

Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the town designate all woodlands

now in its possession and that which may hereinafter come into its possession as Town Forests and instruct the Selectmen and the Town Forestry Board to establish a management plan for said Forests, said plan to be approved by the State Forester.

On approval of the Management plan, the Selectmen are authorized upon recommendation of the Town Forestry Board, to sell from time to time marketable wood and stumpage located in the Town Forests, and to deposit such money as may be recovered therefrom with the Trustees of Trust Funds to be held in a Capital Reserve Fund, the income and principal of this Fund to be expended only upon approval of the Budget Committee, and by vote at Town Meeting for Capital Equipment for the Town. Article 5: The following resolution offered by N. F. Davis: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton, in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$3700, be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for general expense of highway department and street lighting. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 24: The following motion was offered by J. A. Brock: I move that we pass over this article.

The following amendment was offered by A. M. Burnham: I move that we amend said Article 24, by striking out the words "pass over" and inserting in place thereof the words "take up," so that the same as amended shall read: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that we take up Article 24.

Article 9: The following resolution offered by Scott Calahan: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$1500. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for the care of Town Dumps. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 10: The following resolution offered by Olive M. Cooley: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$1050. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for the support of the Hopkinton Free Public Libraries. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 11: The following resolution offered by Harold C. Kimball: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$300. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for the observance of Memorial Day. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 12: The following resolution offered by Russell Drew: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$150. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for the observance of Old Home Day. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 13: The following resolution offered by Carl Clark: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$100. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for Civilian Defense. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 14: The following resolution offered by Thomas Johnson: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$250. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for Legal Expenses. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 15: The following resolution offered by John A. Brock: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$3,000. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for Town Construction and Permanent Improvement of Roads. The following amendment was offered by James A. Weast: Amend said resolution by striking out the word "permanent" and inserting in place thereof the words "semi-permanent" so that the same as amended shall read as follows: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$3,000. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for Town Construction and Semi-permanent Improvement of Roads.

The amended resolution was declared lost, and the original resolution adopted in the affirmative.

Article 16: The following resolution offered by John Ball: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$1216.80 be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$8111.97. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 17: The following resolution offered by J. Clifford Gallant: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$225. be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for Social Security. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 18: The following resolution offered by Delbert E. Reade: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$2000.

be, and is hereby raised and appropriated for Sidewalk Construction.

The following amendment was offered by Harold C. Kimball: Amend said resolution by adding "sidewalk construction from the old gate at the Fair Ground to the Grade School to the village square," so that the same as amended shall read as follows:

Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the sum of \$2000. be and is hereby raised and appropriated for sidewalk construction from the old gate at the Fair Ground to the new High School and in Hopkinton Village from the Grade School to the village square.

The resolution as amended was adopted in the affirmative.

Article 19: The following resolution offered by James A. Weast: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the Selectmen be authorized to purchase a power grader and attachments not to exceed the sum of \$15,000. and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. for initial payment of the same. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 20: The following resolution offered by James A. Weast: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow a sum of money not to exceed \$13,000. on serial notes to pay the balance of the purchase price for a grader and attachments; payable \$2,000. in 1954, \$2,000. in 1955, \$2,000. in 1956, \$2,000. in 1957, \$2,000 in 1958, \$2,000. in 1959 and \$1,000. in 1960. Specifications for said Grader and attachments to be established by the Town Highway Committee and Selectmen, said Grader will remain directly under the supervision of the Selectmen, the operator of the grader will be appointed by the Selectmen and approved by the Highway Committee.

All income from rentals of said Grader and attachments over and above operation and maintenance cost will be used to retire the above indebtedness. Upon retirement of the notes, said balance of income will be deposited with the Trustees of Trust Funds to be held in the Capital Reserve Fund, the income and principal of this Fund to be expended only upon approval of the Budget Committee and by vote at Town Meeting for the replacement of said Grader and Attachments.

Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 21: The following resolution was offered by John S. Ball: Resolved, that the selectmen be authorized to appoint one road agent for the whole Town, effective forthwith, and to fix his compensation. Further resolved that action taken under this Article supersedes any action taken by the Town Meeting under Article with reference to the choice of road agents. Motion made by Bert L. Geer and carried, that Article 21 be voted on by ballot. A ballot vote was taken with the following result:

Yes — 132

No — 109

The Moderator declared the resolution adopted in the affirmative.

Article 25: The following resolution offered by John A. Brock: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the town pay the Contoocook Fire Precinct rental for use of the street floor of Columbia Hall, so called located in Contoocook Fire Precinct for use as a Fire Station, said rental to be a sum agreed upon by the Selectmen and the Contoocook Fire Precinct Commissioners. Adopted in the affirmative.

Article 31: The following resolution offered by John K. Graves: Resolved, by the town of Hopkinton in town meeting convened, that the following vote of the Trustees of Trust Funds be approved: In order to save the Town the expense of Taxes on the Treasurer's salary and the expense of supplies and postage for administration of the funds, the Trustees have voted to accept from the Town the sum of \$100. annually, from which the expenses of the Trust Funds are to be paid and the balance of which is to be turned over to the Treasurer of the Trust Funds as reimbursement for his services.

Adopted in the affirmative.

The following motion was offered by Stewart E. Astles: I move that the Selectmen be instructed to hold the annual town meeting only, in the new Hopkinton High School.

The Moderator ruled that no valid action could be taken without an article in the Warrant.

Ernest Shepherd moved that the ruling of the Moderator to the effect that no valid action could be taken without an article in the Warrant be overruled.

A ballot vote was taken. It was voted 84 to 61 that no action could be taken without an article in the Warrant.

The following resolution offered by Robert D. Parmenter: Resolved, that the citizens of Hopkinton in town meeting assembled, express their sincere appreciation to Joseph H. Young for his eighteen years of devoted and unstinted service as Selectman. May his integrity and high devotion to duty serve as an inspiration and guide to all. The town clerk is hereby instructed to record this motion in the Town records and to forward a copy of this resolu-

tion to Mr. Young. Adopted in the affirmative.

Recessed at 4:15 o'clock.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Concord Hospital.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the control of White Pine Blister Rust and the spraying of trees in the Hopkinton and Contoocook Precincts.

9. To see if the Town will vote to relocate the Contoocook Dump, also to consider having one Dump to serve the whole Town.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of Town Dumps.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Hopkinton Free Public Libraries.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to augment the Richard E. Bates Memorial Fund. (Not recommended by the Budget Committee)

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Civilian Defense.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Legal Expenses.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for Town Construction and permanent improvement of roads.

- (2) The sum of \$150.00 from Kathleen M. Adams, plus interest to date, for the perpetual care of the Kathleen M. Adams lot in the New Hopkinton Cemetery.
- (3) The sum of \$150.00 from Mrs. Charles C. Fuller, plus interest to date, for the perpetual care of the Charles C. Fuller lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.
- (4) The sum of \$150.00 from Frank M. Bugaw, plus interest to date, for the perpetual care of the Frank M. Bugaw lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.
- (5) The sum of \$150.00 from Walter A. Walling for the perpetual care of the Walter A. Walling lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.
- (6) The sum of \$150.00 from Elsie Patch for the perpetual care of the George E. Patch lot in the New Hopkinton Cemetery.

- (7) The sum of \$150.00 from Elsie Patch for the perpetual care of the Samuel Johnson lot in the New Hopkinton Cemetery.
- (8) The sum of \$150.00 from Bert L. Geer for the perpetual care of the Ruth J. Geer and Bert L. Geer lot in the Contoocook Cemetery.

PEOPLE PLAY A VITAL PART IN OUR FOREST FIRE PROBLEMS

A review of the 1953 fire season proves the vital part people play in the never ending battle to prevent forest fires.

In this fire district there were 133 fires in 26 of the district's 30 towns; 409 acres were burned over and it cost \$9,499.97 to extinguish them. This figure was reduced somewhat through payment of fire costs by persons responsible for illegal fires, fires which escaped from control and fires caused by their carelessness. Costs were abnormally high this year due to protracted periods of dry weather which increased the difficulty of extinguishing fires.

Eighty-eight percent of the 133 fires were man-caused and could have been prevented. They tell a story which needs to be carefully studied. Some people were careless in disposing of smoking material and camp fires; others burned without the required warden permit — disregarding weather, forest conditions and the normal safeguards recognized and considered by the warden in issuing permits. Other fires resulted from children playing with matches, carelessly handled fireworks, faulty railroad and truck equipment, etc.

These fires cost a lot to extinguish, most of which could have been avoided — this affects taxes; local business was interrupted by men leaving their jobs to extinguish the fires; trees that might otherwise have built houses, repaired bridges and supplied raw materials for local industries were destroyed; seedling growth — the future timber crop was wiped out.

This picture can, however, be reversed if people who offend could be impressed with the importance of

observing the simple but essential common sense safeguards that will prevent forest fires. They are:

1. Care in disposing of lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches in and near woodlands.
2. Care in selecting camp fire sites and completely extinguishing them.
3. Consultation with the local forest fire warden before burning to secure the required permit.

Elizabeth M. Nystrom was elected Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Motion made by James A. Weast and carried that the Town Auditors perform the duties of the School District.

Article II

Bert L. Geer offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, That the reports of the Clerk of the School District, School Board, Treasurer, Auditors,

School Nurse, Superintendent of Schools, and High School Principal be accepted as printed in the Town Report.

The above resolution was amended by Ernest Shepherd to include the report of the School Building Committee as printed in the Town Report.

The resolution as amended was adopted.

Article III

Earl J. Rice offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, That the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,636.55 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

Richard Brunel recommended that the budget committee's recommendation of \$99,586.55 be accepted.

William Montgomery recommended to raise and appropriate the amount of \$99,586.55 plus \$1,050 the amount recommended by the budget committee with the addition of the extra amount asked for by the School Board.

The recommendation by Dr. A. J. Pimentel was accepted by Mr. Rice, namely; To vote on the budget as recommended by the budget committee first.

William Montgomery withdrew his recommendation.

The vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$99,-586.55 was not passed.

After more discussion the following resolution was passed:

RESOLVED, That the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,636.55 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

Article IV

Richard Brunel offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, That the district approve the expenditure of \$1,416.61 made by the School Board for new equipment for the New School Building.

Resolution was adopted.

Article V

John Ball offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLVED, That the district authorize the School Board to expend the sum of \$1,633.39 for additions and improvements to the New Building.

Resolution was adopted.

Article VI

John Brock moved to have a rising vote of thanks

to the School Board and School Building Committee and anyone else who has done work on the new School.

Appreciation was so expressed.

Moved to adjourn.

The above enrollment figures do not include possible decreases due to families moving out of town. Nor does it include youngsters who drop out to go to work because of economic reasons or lack of interest in school. I might add that our dropout figures for the latter cause are extremely low; running about two percent.

The figures do not include any possible increase in school population due to increased housing construction, and a trend for Hopkinton to become a residential community for people who are employed in Concord. The growth of the machine shop may also possibly affect the rate of population growth.

We probably can conclude that, if the present trend continues, our school population is going to be even larger than these projected figures indicate. Even with our present enrollment and the number of children five years and under we are going to have a sizeable increase. The two right hand columns indicate what the enrollment is going to be in the New School Building for the next ten years.

As this enrollment increases it will eventually mean more teachers and more classrooms. For example, the present first grade with 45 pupils in two schools will combine as a single class in the new building in 1957. This is really too large a group for one teacher and yet the chances are that the class will be bigger rather than smaller by that time. This will certainly be too big for seventh and eighth grades and the compulsory subjects such as English, Civics and United States History.

You will probably recall that there was some question about the need of our New School building and it was explained that this building was needed to relieve congestion in both the high school and the elementary school. It was also stated that the best solution was to

build an elementary school building and a high school building but that we could not afford it. Perhaps the solution to the present problem would be to build an elementary building and move the fifth and sixth grade from their present location to an elementary school where they belong. Fifth and sixth grade children are of an age when they would be better working and playing with younger children.

With the growth of the town and increased school population, we must expect the costs of education to increase in Hopkinton even if the other factors remain the same, which they are not. How these factors will affect the tax is problematical. Increased enrollment does increase the costs. On the other hand, the construction of new residences will tend to reduce the tax rate. It is possible that one may offset the other.

There is no question but what we are operating a more efficient program, both educationally and financially. For the school year 1945-1946, the State Average Cost of Instruction for High School pupils was \$123.79, while the cost for Hopkinton was \$186.18. In 1950 the method of figuring costs was changed. Under the old system, to get the 1945-1946 average costs, the only expenses included were those listed in the budget under Instruction. In 1950, all the current operating expenses of the high school were added. This included Administrative Costs, Operation and Maintenance of School Plants, Auxiliary Activities, and Fixed Charges. Therefore, in 1950, we had a big jump in the figures of high school costs. For that year, the Average Cost in the state for high school pupils, was \$259.87 as compared to \$287.59 for Hopkinton. The State Average Cost for 1952-1953 has not been announced but it has been estimated that it will be about \$310.00 per pupil. The average cost for Hopkinton was about \$255.00 per high school pupil.

I won't go into detail on the change in educational

efficiency. Mr. Milne is going to mention that in his report.

The larger we grow the more varied program we will be able to offer and the better we will be meeting the needs of our children. Certainly a teacher can do better work with twenty-five or thirty pupils in the fourth grade than she could with forty-seven pupils in grades three and four combined; such as we had last year.

Hopkinton will be having growing pains for some time which presents a challenge to the community, the school board, and the teachers. We have made tremendous strides in the past few years due to an alert and well informed community and conscientious hard working school boards. I am sure that Hopkinton will meet these problems and continue to improve our educational program.

If Better Schools mean Better Communities, and I am sure it does, then it also follows that Better Communities mean Better Schools.

In 1954-55 we shall add Typing II and Stenography to the Business Course. There will also be added a course in Review Mathematics designed primarily for those seniors who have had no mathematics during their high school career.

Two new teachers have been added to the faculty this year — Miss Gloria Jackson, a graduate of Keene Teachers College, and Miss Ellen McClintock, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College. Miss Jackson is teaching English and Social Studies and Miss McClintock is teaching the Business Course.

This year the Business Course was added to our Program of Studies. Because of the demand, it was necessary to run four sections of typing so that everyone who so desired might avail himself of the opportunity to learn to type. Each year we shall add to the Business Course so that in two years time we shall have a four-year Business Course.

This year, in order to better meet the individual needs of our students, we have two groups in U. S. History, Human Behavior, and English. At the beginning of the year, Grades 11 & 12 were put together in one group and then this one group was divided into two sections — a college preparatory and a non-college preparatory group. The basis for division, in most cases, was the results of the student's Cooperative Reading Test which is administered each year by the University of New Hampshire Testing Service to the ninth and eleventh grades. In this way, students who are not planning to further their education can be given a more practical type of History, English, and Human Behavior. On the other hand, the college preparatory group can be given work, especially of a research nature, which will prove invaluable in preparing them to further their education. The results have been quite satisfactory.

This division of a group into two or more sections

has not been confined to the above-mentioned subjects but is the practice in most classes. It is one way of meeting the individual differences of pupils.

The increase in our school population has caused a considerable increase in the number of students participating in our Hot Lunch Program. At present, the daily average of meals being served is about 265. This necessitated a change in the time when meals are served. The 5th and 6th grade pupils eat at 11:30, grades 1-4 come in at 11:45, and grades 7-12 arrive at 12 noon. It is expected that in the not too distant future it will be necessary for grades 7-12 to eat in two shifts in order to relieve any possible congestion. A vote of thanks is to be given to Mrs. Dorothy French and her able assistants who have provided such excellent meals.

In closing, I wish to thank all those parents and friends who have helped us to make this past year successful.
