

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jefferson in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Jefferson on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$136.07 and receive the sum of \$544.27 from the State for town road improvement.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200 for the control of white pine blister rust.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$100 for the purpose of finishing the inside of the tomb in Starrking Cemetery for general use of Jefferson people.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$90.00 for advertising in cooperation with the other towns in the White Mountain region.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$200 for the control of ragweed.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through tax collector's deeds.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to allow the Selectmen to dispose of the Starrking School house.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Herewith is submitted my tenth annual report with statistics for the school year.

The schools opened the present year in September with a considerable change from the old arrangement. The school building at the Hill was renovated during the summer and made into a four-room building for the Grades. All elementary pupils in town are now being assembled in this building with two grades to a room and under the direction of four teachers.

Fortunately, the pupils were so classified in the different grades that each teacher has a fair number of pupils and with only two grades to a teacher more and better work should be accomplished.

High School pupils are now being transported to Lancaster.

Both elementary and high school transportation are now being done with two school buses.

However, it would seem to be advisable at some time to have the High School transportation to Lancaster done as a separate and distinct item and not a combination with the elementary. Such an arrangement would eliminate the present necessity of an early start in the morning for the smaller children who live at a distance.

The teaching force for this year has been reduced from six teachers to four. Miss Carolyn Pratt, a graduate of Farmington, Maine Normal School, and with several years of teaching experience, has charge of Grades one and two; Miss Dorothy Berry, a graduate of the four-year elementary course at Keene Teacher's College, is the instructor for Grades three and four. Miss Marvel Proctor, who previously taught the lower grades at Meadows School, now has the fifth and sixth grades and Mrs. Nellie Muzzy, who last year taught in the upper grades at Meadows, now has the seventh and eighth grades.

From an educational viewpoint, the general arrangement and classification at this Consolidated School is an excellent one and good results may be expected.

As a large majority of the children are now at school through the noon hour, it is hoped that in the not too distant future, a plan may be worked out for serving a hot school lunch.

The attendance for the last school year was 90.9 percent, a slight decrease from the preceding year. At the present time attendance is running well above 90 per cent.

Your Superintendent has throughout the school year, made weekly visits of supervision and inspection and endeavored to check up on the accomplishments in the various schools.

The anunal health examinations have again been conducted by Dr. L. C. Aldrich with the follow-up work carried on by a new school nurse, Mrs. Gladys Fancy of Gorham.

The School Board and Superintendent have prepared a budget for 1944-45 and this budget may be found in another part of the report.


