## REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES.

The Marlow public library has been patronized to a more liberal extent than last year.

The condition of books and records is very good, there being but few volumes which need rebinding. As a whole, the affairs and condition of the library are very satisfactory.

The amount allowed by law last year has not been expended by the trustees, who deemed it wise and prudent to allow the money to remain in the town treasury until called for. We recommend that the townspeople make a more liberal use of the facilities offered by the library than heretofore. Good books are a help, a source of education and recreation, which will benefit anyone who takes advantage of the opportunities they afford.

There are at present in possession of the town 1,654 volumes, of which 64 volumes were donated.

# REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD,

For the Year ending February 15, 1911.

Your school board once more submit their annual report for your consideration.

We have maintained the usual thirty weeks of school in each of the three schools, with the exception of No. 7 where only 29 weeks of actual school was held owing to scarlet fever in the neighborhood, which closed the school for two weeks of the fall term.

The success of the schools has varied from good to indifferent, according to the circumstances, the teachers and the parents.

Miss O'Donnell resigned at the close of the fall term, much to our regret and loss to the school. Her place for the winter term was poorly filled.

The grammar school for the spring term was taught by Miss Adkin, whose methods were in some ways good, but who did not succeed in making her school do its best work.

The fall and winter terms were taught by John M. Safford, who was qualified, competent and labored hard for his school. Many of his pupils made very good improvements, while others who were indifferent to the opportunity and whose parents were also indifferent, and kept the child at home for various reasons, could not expect to have the same interest, and make as good improvement as others.

The same criticisms will apply now as in former years and there is no use to repeat.
