

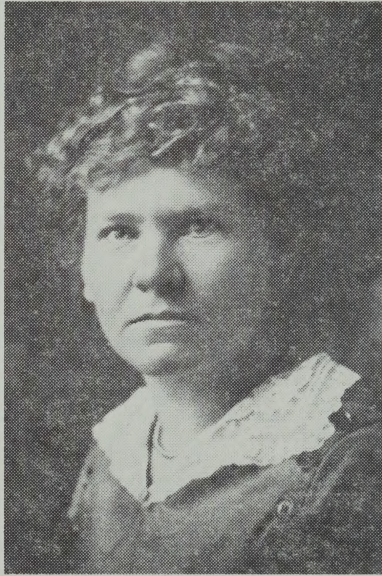

MIDDLETON TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Middleton in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Middleton on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next at 10 of the clock in the forenoon; Primary Polls open from 10.00 A.M. to 6.00 P.M. Town Meeting starts at 7:30 P.M.; to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for pine blister rust control.

4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum for Town Road Aid, \$195.17.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum of money for county taxes.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27.90 which is $\frac{1}{100}$ of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$257 for printing the Town Report.

8. Article (1) "To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof."

Article (2) "To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election."

Article (3) "To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis."

Article (4) "If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate *Beatrice Young as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan."

9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay town bills in anticipation of taxes.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and accept in the name of the school district for educational purposes such funds or grants-in-aid as many be obtainable from state, federal, or other sources.

ton's per pupil cost, for both elementary and high school is considerably below the state average.

The receipt of state aid of \$9,251.51 for 1955-56 is a much needed help and made possible a reduction of taxes for school purposes of over \$39.00 per thousand on the 1954 assessed valuation.

In view of the educational opportunities provided by the Farmington Elementary Schools the citizens of Middleton may feel well pleased with the present arrangements. The cost per pupil is considerably less than would be possible if Middleton operated its own schools to provide comparable educational advantages.
