- You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Middleton on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next at 10 of the clock in the forenoon; Primary Polls open from 10.00 A.M. to 6.00 P.M. Town Meeting starts at 7:30 P.M.; to act upon the following subjects:
- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for pine blister rust control.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum for Town Road Aid, \$195.17.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum of money for county taxes.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27.90 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$257 for printing the Town Report,
- 8. Article (1) "To see if the town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof."

Article (2) "To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election."

Article (3) "To see if the town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis."

Article (4) "If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate "Beatrice Young as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan."

- 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire such sums of money as may be necessary to pay town bills in anticipation of taxes.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
