

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall on Tuesday, March 9, 1954, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1 — To elect by Australian Ballot: A Town Clerk; One Selectman, Assessor and Trustee of Trust Funds for a term of Three years; Town Treasurer; Tax Collector; Three Constables; Chief of Police; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2 — To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the protection of persons and property, for health and sanitation, for highways and bridges, for support of the town poor, and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

Article 3 — To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

Article 4 — To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$222.05, the State to contribute \$1,480.35 for the Town Road Aid.

Article 5 — To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for advancement of the Town through publicity and promotional services of the Seacoast Regional Development Assoc., co-operating with other Regional committees, the sum of \$200.

Article 6 — Upon the petition of Alice D. Knowles and

ten other legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44 to install and maintain a streetlight on pole No. 425 on Lower Collins street.

Article 7 — Upon the petition of Walter W. Eaton and ten legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$88, to install and maintain two streetlights on River street, pole No. 676J and No. 701J.

Article 8 — Upon the petition of Melvin W. French and ten legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44 to install and maintain a streetlight on Walton road, pole No. 236J.

Article 9 — Upon the petition of Albert M. Smith and ten legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise and sum of \$44 to install and maintain a streetlight on Collins street, pole No. 137J.

Article 10 — Upon the petition of the Selectmen to see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44 to install and maintain a streetlight on Pickens avenue.

Article 11 — Upon petition of the Selectmen, to see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$44 to install and maintain a streetlight at the corner of Nashua street and Route 1A.

Article 12 — Upon the petition of Edwin T. Hart and ten legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to accept as a Public Way, Fowler's lane so called.

Article 13 — Upon the petition of Reginald Small and 18 legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to accept as a Public Way, Small's avenue, so-called.

Article 14 — Upon the petition of Malcolm Merrill and 20 legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to accept, as a Public Way, Dow's lane, so-called.

Article 15 — Upon the petition of Clyde Littlefield and 62 other legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 to purchase a power lawnmower for the Park Department; and allow the Park Commissioners to sell the old one to the highest bidder at public auction, the proceeds to be turned over to the Town Treasurer for the use of the Park Department, the same to be left in the hands of the Park Commissioners.

Article 16 — Upon the petition of Clyde Littlefield and 66 other legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350, to erect two flagpoles; one at Smithtown, at the Raymond Walton Memorial; the other at the corner of South Main and Collins streets, at Daniel Janvrin Memorial Park, the same to be left in the hands of the Park Commissioners.

Article 17 — Upon the petition of Walter Janvrin and 39 legal voters of the Town, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for a Police and Ambulance combination; balance left over to be used for equipment for the vehicle.

Article 18 — Upon the petition of Henry S. Kendrick and 23 other legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to finish the infield of the ball diamond at Veteran's Memorial Park, the same to be left in the hands of the Park Commissioners.

Article 19 — Upon the petition of Emery N. Eaton and 20 other legal voters to see if the Town of Seabrook will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$119.50 to be paid to Charles S. B. Knowles for his services as Constable for the year 1953.

Article 20 — Upon the petition of Henry S. Kendrick

and 23 other legal voters, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for one permanent man, the same to be left in the hands of the Board of Engineers.

Article 21 — Upon the petition of Henry Yell and 14 others, to see what action the Town will take to abolish the office of Constable.

Article 22 — Upon the petition of 12 legal voters, of the Town; to see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to issue no more than 15 Police appointments for the year 1954.

Article 23 — Upon the petition of the Selectmen: to see if the Town will vote to reimburse the Firemen's Association a sum of money for part of the cost of hottopping in front of building, and appropriate the same.

Article 24 — Upon the petition of the Selectmen: to see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000 for a sidewalk program and appropriate the same.

Article 25 — Upon the petition of the Selectmen: to see if the Town will vote to establish a parking lot at the Beach on Route 1A, corner of Blackwater Bridge Road, and appropriate money for the same.

Article 26 — Upon the petition of the Selectmen: to hear the report of the Selectmen relating to Article 7 of last year's Warrant; that the Selectmen be instructed to find a Polling place other than this building for future elections.

Article 27 — To hear the report of the Planning Board and act thereon.

Article 28 — To hear the report of the Water Committee, and act thereon.

Article 29 — To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual audit and examination of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

#### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court and Trustees of Trust Funds.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets—Dec. 31, 1952-Dec. 31, 1953: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1952 and December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the financial condition change from a Surplus of \$4,397.91 to a Net Debt of \$18,208.19 in 1953.

#### Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

## Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,271.34, plus a revenue surplus of \$2,123.65, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$852.31.

#### Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1953, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

#### Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1953, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

#### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

#### Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased from \$6,897.91 to \$8,291.81, in 1953, as shown by the following statement:

#### Town Treasurer:

The Town Treasurer should make certain that all receipts are recorded in the cash book. It was found in some instances that receipts had been deposited in the bank but had not been entered in the cash book.

It is recommended that the Treasurer adopt the practice of countersigning the Selectmen's orders, thereby converting the orders into negotiable checks, instead of issuing separate checks. The advantages of the recommended procedure are:

- (1) Selectmen's orders and Treasurer's checks are in the same numerical sequence.
- (2) Possibility of a difference in amount between Selectmen's orders and Treasurer's checks is eliminated.

At the close of each month the Treasurer should reconcile the cash book balance with the bank balance and submit a monthly report to the Selectmen on the prescribed form.

It is again recommended that the Treasurer's surety bond be increased from \$3,000.00 to \$10,000.00, in order that the amount of the bond may be more proportionate to the amount of funds handled by this official.

#### Motor Vehicle Permit Transfer Credits:

A fifty cent transfer fee should be collected by the Town Clerk each time a transfer of a motor vehicle takes place in addition to the amount due for the permit.

During the period between December 1st and April 1st the amount of a motor vehicle permit is one third of the regular fee. Likewise a transfer credit during the same period should not exceed one third of the original fee.

#### Uncollected Taxes - Prior Years:

It is noted that there were uncollected poll taxes on the warrants for the levies of 1951 and prior years at the close of the last two fiscal years as follows:

Inasmuch as the collections on these warrants during 1953 were negligable, it is recommended that the Board of Selectmen and Tax Collector carefully go over the uncollected lists and that such taxes as appear to be uncollectable be abated by the Selectmen.

#### Closing Accounts:

It is recommended that the accounts of all town officials be closed as promptly as possible after the close of the fiscal year, December 31st. A week should be sufficient time in which to close and balance the accounts.

#### Conclusion:

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its essential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Seabrook for their assistance during the course of the audit.
