THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town house in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the 11th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget, and raise money for the same; if not to see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town charges for the ensuing year as follows:
 - (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
 - (b) Town Officers' Expense.
 - (c) Election and Registration.
 - (d) Municipal Court.
 - (e) Town hall, lands and other buildings.
 - (f) Damage and Legal Expense.
 - (g) Health Department.
 - (h) Vital Statistics.
 - (i) General Expense Highway Department.
 - (j) Interest on Temporary Loans.
 - (k) Interest on Bonds.
 - (l) County Tax.
 - (m) Payment on Bonds.
 - (n) Payment on Temporary Loans.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of the Poor.

- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of Libraries.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise one thousand seventy-eight dollars (\$1,078.00) for street lighting.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the following departments.
 - (a) Police Department.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any the Town will vote to raise in addition to that required by law for the Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Winter Roads.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint one Road Agent to supervise all town roads. Said order to take effect after the Town Meeting of the year 1948.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue subject to gates and bars the following roads:
 Road leading from Orman J. Poore residence to the residence of Benjamin F. Gould.
 Road leading from the Bear Rock Road near the Cedar Brook School to where it joins the highway on South Hill.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to trade the Tractor Snow Plow for a modern bulldozer, or if not to purchase a bulldozer attachment for the snow plow tractor and the Selectmen to issue a note for the amount required to execute either transaction said note to become due and payable on April 1st, 1948.

- 13. To see if the Town will vote to rescind a vote taken to retain the Hotel Lot so-called for a park and playground, if so to authorize the Selectmen to sell said lot at private sale or aution.
- 14. To nominate and elect a Budget Committee of six members
 Two members to serve one year.
 Two members to serve two years.
 Two members to serve three years.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts, for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay out of the Tax money when it is received.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate to the White Mountain Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the region, a sum not exceeding 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation of the town for 1946.
- 17. To choose by Non-Partisan Ballot the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Three Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Auditors.
 - (f) Collector of Diamond Pond Rent.
 - (g) Overseer of Poor.
 - (h) One or more Sextons.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Fund.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for three years ensuing.
- 18. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other town officers as required by law.

19. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Stewartstown School District:

FOREWORD

Do you ever turn back the clock to days which sometimes look in retrospect much more attractive than they really were? Our children still need the three R's. But they also need an up-to-date acquaintance with the world in which they live.

The jet motor and the atom bomb, because of their dramatic character, are known to all who can read or hear. They typify a new and fast moving age.

American children have an assignment that is not optional. They are introduced to an incredibly complex world, a world of quickly achieved knowledge and skills, or racial and class tension, of international frictions, of battered traditions, of huge debts and of inevitable change. They must have an education which will help them find their way in the world.

The best educational programs to be found in the nation today can still be improved. We can and must provide a good educational opportunity for every individual. As the school program improves and be-

comes more closely geared with life, an increasingly heavy responsibility is placed on the teachers. Schools are not operated to provide jobs for teachers. The only excuse they have for existing in the community is for the good they can do for the boys and girls.

Somehow may the horizon be brighter because of a thoughtful well guided program of education and training for youth, started in the home and continually strengthened by their experiences in the home, the church and the school. We can build a greater and nobler America only as we develop human resources.

TEACHERS

There have been but few changes in the teaching personnel since the last report. Velma Gray, Mae Drew, June Aldrich and Cleora Richardson all returned at West Stewartstown. Carrie Riley was transferred from Bear Rock to Cedar Brook, Dorothy Blodgett from Cedar Brook to the Hollow, and Lillian Hart from the Hollow to South Hill.

Dorothy Blodgett resigned during the Christmas Vacation and was replaced at the Hollow by Harriet Gray.

NOTES ON THE BUDGET

The School Board's budget for 1947-48 totals \$24,255.00 as compared with \$23,319.00 for last year. The budget is reduced by an estimated income of \$6,575.00 so that the requested appropriation is \$17,680.00. The March appropriation 1946 was \$16,644.00. The budget this year reflects anticipated higher costs for salaries and supplies. Although the requested appropriation is but \$1,036.00 more than a year ago.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT

During the summer months the South Hill building was shingled, new shutters installed at North Hill, a new roof put on the toilets at the Hollow and considerable work done in the basement at West Stewartstown. Numerous other minor repairs and improvements were made.

The Bear Rock School was closed. The buildings are for the most part in good condition and the equipment adequate.

The toilet rooms at the South Hill School are in very poor condition, the rooms at West Stewartstown continue to heat unevenly and the old plumbing in the same building should be replaced.

ENROLLMENT AND ATTENDANCE

There art at this time 146 enrolled in the district. Of these, 70 are at West Stewartstown, 46 in the three rural schools and 30 tuition pupils. We had a total enrollment of 174 two years ago and 163 last year.

The percentages of attendance were on the whole rather low, the best record was made by grades 5-6 at West Stewartstown with 96.97 per cent. Bear Rock, Cedar Brook and the Hollow all fell below 90. There were 483 cases of tardiness for the year, the Hollow had the best record of 9, Cedar Brook the poorest with 308. We urge the close cooperation of the home in our effort to improve the attendance figures and to decrease the number of tardinesses.

TUITION

We have at present 30 attending school outside the district. There are 24 at Canaan and 6 at Colebrook. Last year we had 29 and the previous year 40 tuition pupils.

There are five from Pittsburg attending West Stewartstown school.

LEGISLATURE

Undoubtedly a record number of educational bills will come before the legislature this session. It is

expected that a minimum salary law will be introduced. A bill providing for increased state aid has already been dropped in the hopper. This bill if passed would increase the present \$400,000.00 to approximately \$2,080,000 annually for equalization.

You will, I am sure, wish to keep informed on the various bills as they are presented and upon the possible effect they may have upon the educational future of the State.

CONCLUSION

The destiny of our country remains within our people. We must make education for peace realistic. The best education for peace will be that which provides our young people with a realistic understanding of the world and its peoples, teaches tolerance and goodwill toward the peoples of all lands, but at the same time maintains a firm determination that our nation shall join, in a worldwide effort to banish war from the earth.

I take this opportunity to again express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers, and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
