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TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, two Selectmen, one to serve for a period of three years, and one to serve for a period of two years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, three Hospital Trustees to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for—

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange and Rotary Club and all church organizations, for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.

6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for child recreation, to be directed by the Recreational Committee of the Chamber of Commerce. This money to be used for a Skating Rink and the maintenance of same and also for the operation of a bus twice a week to Forest Lake so that the children of the Town may receive free swimming instruction at the State Park.

8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the present road from the Tedesco driveway to Bilodeau's when the new road is completed.

9. To see if the Town will vote to deed a parcel of land on athletic field to Ingerson Smith Post 41 American Legion for the purpose of moving present Legion Building to this location.

10. To see what action the Town will take in using the so-called Garland Field for an athletic field, cost of this project to be paid by the State.

11. To see if the Town would favor the Town Manager System at a future date.

12. To see if the Town will vote to purchase new highway equipment not to exceed \$12,000 to be amortized over a period of three years.

13. To see what action the Town will take with regard to accepting the gift of the so-called Red Acre property.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend \$44,050 insurance to repair and reconstruct Town property recently damaged by fire on Sept. 19, 1954.

15. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF STATE TAX COMMISSION**Town Treasurer:**

It is again recommended that in entering receipts in the cash book the Treasurer designate the type of the receipt (i. e., taxes, motor vehicle permits, income from departments, loans, etc.) as well as the official or other party from whom it is received.

Tax Collector:

It is noted that the first remittance during 1954 was made by the Tax Collector to the Treasurer in the month of October. In this connection attention is called to Section 31, Chapter 59 of the Revised Laws of New Hampshire (as amended by Chapter 173 of the Laws of 1951) relative to the duties of a Tax Collector, which provides in part as follows:

"The collector shall, on the last Monday of every month, pay to the town treasurer all money collected by him up to that time."

Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

Carelessness is responsible for 97 percent of all our forest fires. This is a serious indictment of our interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbors. In too many instances this carelessness results in the destruction, not of the careless one's own property, but of someone not even known to him.

Thoughtlessly thrown lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers and fishermen; the careless burning of debris during hazardous periods, high winds or in dangerous locations; improperly extinguished camp or cook fires—all add up to the CARELESSNESS that means serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditures of town and state funds.

It points to the need of eliminating CARELESSNESS so far as it concerns fire from our daily life. The rules are simple—your cooperation is earnestly solicited.

1. Be careful with fire in or near woodlands.
2. Be sure that all lighted material—cigars, cigarettes and matches—is completely out before discarding it. Use ash trays in autos.
3. Secure the required written permission to burn from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not completely covered with snow.
4. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
5. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

Let's remember that FOREST FIRE PREVENTION is EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS and our MOST IMPORTANT undertaking!
